


The Index of Relative Rurality is a continuous, relative measure of rurality. This type of continuous-scale index allows for the investigation of nuances in the variability of rurality across the state.

Travel time was calculated in driving minutes from the population centroid of the mother's residential ZIP code to the address of the hospital where the birth occurred.


