## **Rural Hospital Outmigration Data**

<u>Rural Hospital Concern</u> – Some have raised concerns that if SC repeals CON it will harm rural hospitals. If ASCs are allowed to come into rural counties, they will siphon off the lucrative outpatient procedures from the hospital and leave them to provide emergency care, which loses money.

Response – According to the outmigration data for rural counties, rural hospitals are currently in that position. A large percentage of in-county residents are receiving emergency care at the rural hospital, and the lucrative procedures are already leaving the local hospital for another hospital – as much as 80-90%. An ASC that comes into the county will not alter the percentage receiving emergency care. The ASC will likely not siphon off the procedures being done at the hospital; it will attempt to capture the patients who are leaving the county. This may actually bring business back to the local hospital and county (not to mention jobs, tax revenue from these for-profit entities, construction, etc) because these patients will still need labs, imaging, physical therapy, etc. It is very common for hospitals to joint venture with physicians or private entities to build ASCs, and if that's the case, the hospital could receive revenue from the returning patients.

<u>Overall Sentiment</u> – Rural healthcare is an issue across the country, but the Mercatus data shows that based on the experience of other states, repealing CON may increase the number of rural providers in the state, both hospitals and ambulatory surgery centers, not decrease them. While repealing CON in South Carolina will not fix the rural healthcare issue, it does not appear that it will make it worse.
