The Department has responded that 85% of its employees were in favor of 12 hour shifts. The is not the full truth. Waht they favor is the every other weekend off schedule that the twelve hour shofts create. The agency behind the fence's special management unit had a schedule that allowed for all employees to work every other weekend with eight hours shifts and the employees were very satisfied. There was a reduction in call outs, moral issues, stayover, and overtime. Other units on campus refused to implement this same schedule. Administration forced special management unit change their schedule. Under the old schedule used by the other units a person would have to work three months before getting a weekend off. If the options were given staff would prefer eight hours with every other weekend off. This is the agency's way of forcing employees to comply.
