WHAT ARE GREATER CHAPIN COMMUNITY FOUNDATION GRANTS?

Greater Chapin Community Foundation grants address a broad range of charitable needs for the greater Chapin community. The goal of the grants are to uplift and strengthen organizations who are addressing critical needs within the greater Chapin area.

Greater Chapin Community Foundation is looking for organizations that:

- Develop competencies and skills enabling individuals to live fuller, more productive lives in the Greater Chapin community
- Leverage other funding through the use of matching grants
- Provide opportunities for underserved populations
- Demonstrate systems or approaches to build on individual, family, or community strengths

WHAT WE WILL NOT FUND

- Debt reduction
- Endowment or capital campaigns
- Medical research
- Projects that restrict participation on the basis of race, color, religion, age, national origin, disability, status, parental status, military status, sexual orientation, gender, or gender expression.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Organizations must be determined as a charitable organization under Section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code, public entities or other charitable, educational or faith-based organizations.
- Organizations must serve the Greater Chain area: Ballentine, Chain, Little Mountain, Peak, Pros and White Rock.
- If awarded a grant, an organization must agree to recognize the Greater Chapin Community as the source of the award, and share on all forms of social media in which the organization participates press releases or news coverage of events, and listed as a sponsor on promotional information.

GRANT AMOUNT

Greater Chapin Community Endowment plans to award up to \$25,000 in grants per year. There is not a maximum amount, however the average amount of grants awarded in the previous year was \$1,000.
