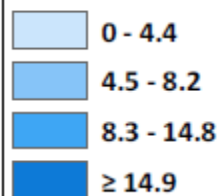

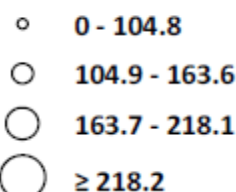
Current burden of opioid use and overdose in SC, 2015-2016

Age-adjusted opioid mortality rate, 2015¹ (per 100,000 population)



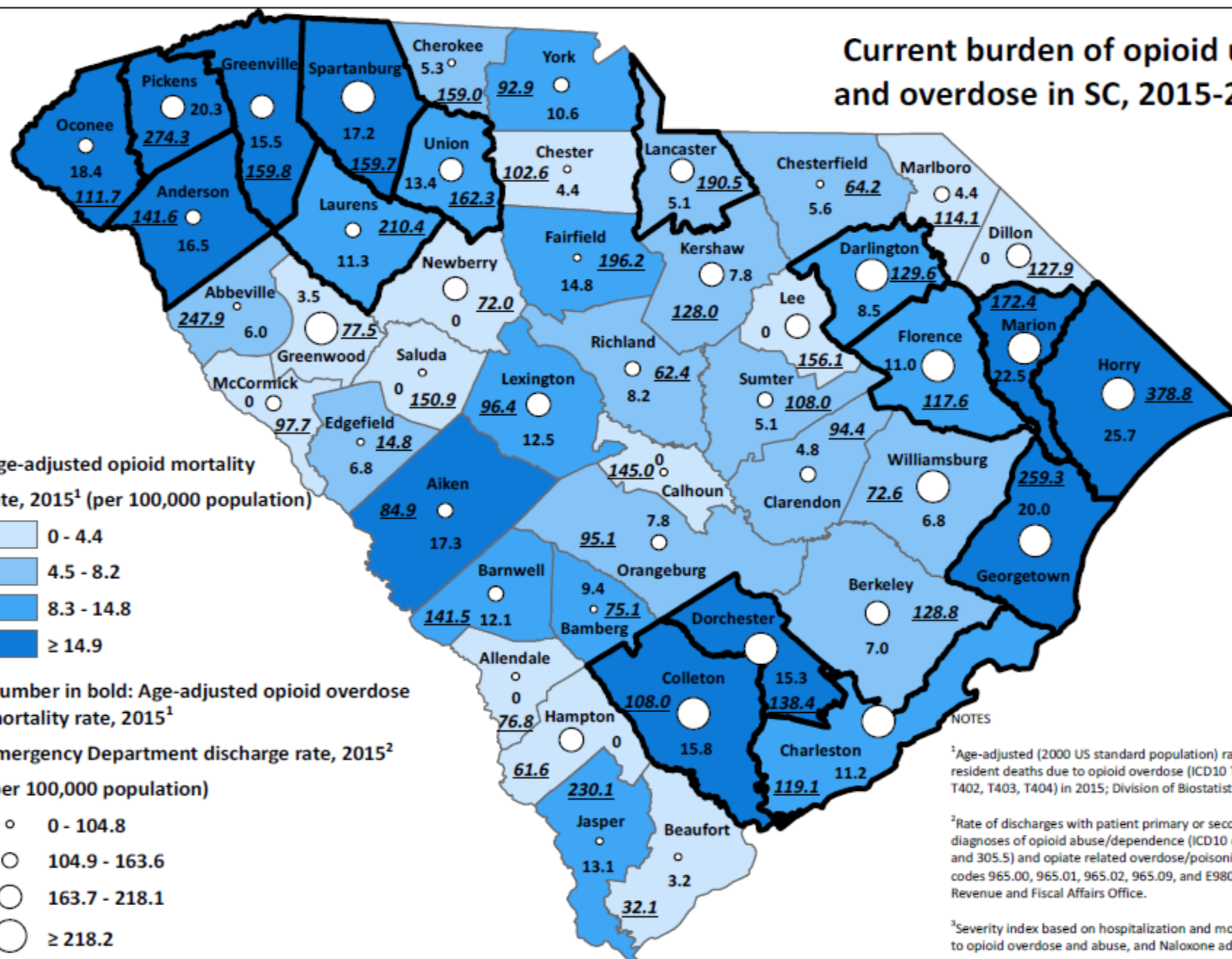
Number in bold: Age-adjusted opioid overdose mortality rate, 2015¹

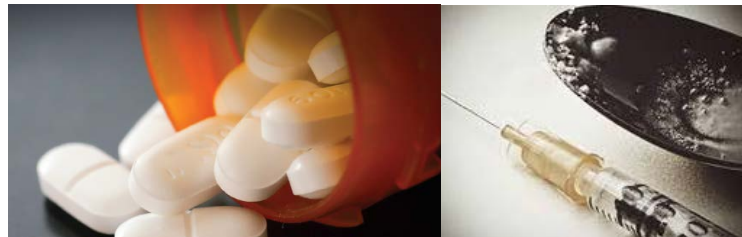
