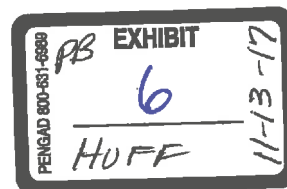


Re: Amendment to Personal Data Questionnaire

Dear Emma,

Pursuant to our previous conversation, I would offer the following amendment and further explanation to my previously filed Personal Data Questionnaire. This amendment would specifically relate to question 36 on page 8.

In previous filings the questions posed were as follows: "Have you ever been sued, either personally or professionally?" My response at that time based upon the posed questions was Yes. It was related to my political service as a state representative in a suit concerning reapportionment of the South Carolina Senate and House of Representatives and the United States Congress. Further in 1994, a matter was brought by the South Carolina State Ethics Commission, SEC C94-005, which was related to a political advertisement during Senator Gregg Ryberg's runoff election in 1992. The matter was subsequently concluded with the filing of a Statement of Organization and Campaign Disclosure Form. I was never a member or an organizer of the named defendant organization. Finally, there was a matter filed initially before the Workers Compensation Commission by Ms. Carolyn Anderson Bazzle, which was pursued by her pro se. This matter and the resolution is set forth in the South Carolina Supreme Court opinion of *Bazzle v. Huff*, 319 S.C. 443, 462 S.E.2d 273 (1995).
