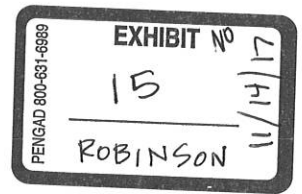

Yes. Currently serving on the Administrative Law Court, Seat 5. I was initially elected by the General Assembly in May 2009, re-elected May 2013 and have served continuously since that date.

The Administrative Law Court and its judges have jurisdiction to hear contested, appellant and injunctive cases involving disputes between state agencies and private parties. Specifically, with respect to contested cases, section 1-23-600(A) states “[a]n administrative

law judge shall preside over all hearings of contested cases ... involving the departments of the executive branch of government ... in which a single hearing officer, or an administrative law judge, is authorized or permitted by law or regulation to hear and decide these cases...” There are some exceptions, the Administrative Law Court does not have jurisdiction to hear and decide contested cases involving the Consolidated Procurement Code, Public Service Commission, Department of Employment and Workforce, and the Workers’ Compensation Commission. In addition, section 1-23-600(D) specifies that “[a]n administrative law judge also shall preside over all appeals from final decisions of contested cases...” Again, there are exceptions to the Court’s appellate jurisdiction. Appeals from final orders of the Public Service Commission, the State Ethics Commission, the Procurement Review Panel, and the Workers’ Compensation Commission are heard by other courts. Another noteworthy limitation of the Administrative Law Court’s jurisdiction is that while its judges can decide if a constitutional right has been violated, they cannot rule on the constitutionality of statutes.

The Administrative Law Court also conducts hearings involving the promulgation of regulations by agencies governed by a single director. Agencies may also apply to the Administrative Law Court for injunctive relief, enforcement of subpoenas, and enforcement of an administrative process.

I've served as a judge on the Administrative Law Court for the past 8 years, and during that time I've presided over hundreds of contested hearings and appeals. I believe the experience garnered from serving on the Court and Bar membership satisfies the professional and academic criteria.

I believe that maintaining the integrity of our judicial system should be given priority when recusal becomes an issue.

Yes. In December 1983, I was charged with driving under the influence, and in April 1984, I was charged with driving with a suspended license. Subsequent to these extremely unfortunate and regrettable incidents I've earned a Bachelor of Science and Law Degree, and enjoyed a moderately successful legal career.

Richland County records show a tax lien was filed by SC DOR on March 1, 2001, and the tax lien satisfaction was filed on March 20, 2001. The lien amount was \$155.18, and

according to DOR personnel, the lien was filed in error. I have never defaulted on a student loan, and never filed for bankruptcy.

Yes, in March 2002, I was sued in magistrate's court by a client I represented during a real estate closing while employed with the Law Offices of Newman & Sabb, PA. The judge determined the case lacked merit and it was dismissed.

September 2007, I was the defendant in a foreclosure filed by Berkshire Homeowners' Association. I leased my condominium with the understanding that the tenant would pay the mortgage and regime until his credit improved at which time he would either assume the existing mortgage or obtain a new mortgage. After living in the unit and complying with the agreement for approximately 5 years, the tenant stopped paying the regime fees, and without notifying me of the default, the Homeowners' Association initiated a foreclosure action. The case was settled and an order dismissing the matter was filed November 18, 2008.

August 1994 and September 1999, I was the defendant in foreclosure actions filed by Berkshire Homeowners' Association. Both of these cases were the result of disputes regarding my objection to the Association board's disregard for the by-laws when voting to increase the regime fees. The 1994 case was resolved and dismissed in July 1996, and the 1999 case was resolved and dismissed in February 2001.

March 1989, GMAC filed an action to recover a vehicle from my ex-husband. The vehicle was financed in my name because of my ex-husband's poor credit history (he also promised to make the payments on time). GMAC recovered the vehicle and the case was dismissed May 24, 1989.
