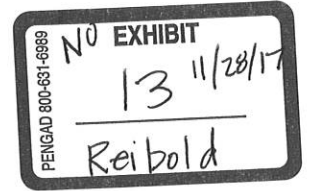

I am a candidate for a Circuit Court position. While my practice has been predominately civil in nature, I do have criminal experience. During my judicial clerkship, I participated in both criminal and civil matters. I assisted Judge Kinard with criminal trials, and other criminal matters, such as guilty pleas, sentencing, and expungements. I have personally handled two criminal cases in the past 5 years and before, that, I assisted in a third. Finally, I have handled a post-conviction relief proceeding within the past 5 years.

However, my experience has been mainly civil. I have primarily represented defendants, but, at times, I have represented Plaintiffs. I have trial experience in Magistrate's Court, Circuit Court, and the United States District Court. I have appellate experience in the Court of Appeals, and the South Carolina Supreme Court. I have argued a patent appeal before the United States Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit. At least 95% of my practice has been devoted to litigation. The types of matters I have handled range from personal injury actions, to include wrongful death

and survival claims, employment discrimination litigation, products liability actions, breach of contract, fraud, and unfair trade practice claims.

I do believe my background has prepared me to handle criminal actions. As mentioned above, I assisted Judge Kinard with criminal matters during my clerkship, and have handled some criminal matters since that time. My civil practice has made me very familiar with the Rules of Evidence, which are applied in criminal matters. I have also made efforts to boost my competence in criminal matters. I have studied criminal legal texts, read Advance Sheets and attended criminal law Continuing Legal Education Seminars.

In the past 5 years, I have handled approximately 23 cases in federal court. In the same time period, I have handled between 160 and 180 cases in South Carolina state courts. I entered court appearances in all of these matters. Not all of these cases required physical appearances before a court.

I served as sole/chief counsel in 65% of these matters. For the remainder, I served as associate counsel.

- (a) *Michael Ritz v. Taylor Toyota*. In this matter, my partner and I represented a Toyota dealership accused of charging documentation or procurement fees in violation of South Carolina law. Plaintiff represented a group or class of thousands of customers attempting to recover allegedly improper fees. The case took almost six years to reach trial, and was tried to a jury in Aiken County. Plaintiff sought a total judgment of approximately \$25,000,000. After a three day trial, the jury returned a verdict in favor of the defense.
 - (b) *Roberts v. LaConey*, 375 S.C. 97, 650 S.E.2d 474 (2007). I sought permission to file an amicus brief in this case which was filed in the South Carolina Supreme Court's original jurisdiction. The case was decided in favor of the parties represented by my firm, and helped define what constitutes the unauthorized practice of law in the State of South Carolina;
 - (c) *Brown v. Stewart*, 348 S.C. 33, 557 S.E.2d 626 (Ct.App. 2001). Among other things, this case involved the question of when a corporate shareholder may maintain a breach of fiduciary action against corporate board members or directors. I assisted in the trial of this case and argued the appeal, which helped to clarify an uncertain area of law in South Carolina.
 - (d) *Fournil v. Turbeville Insurance Agency*. In this matter, I represented a small start-up company. The founder of the company had split off from a larger insurance agency, which became involved in litigation with my client. If the larger company's claims had been successful, the suit would crushed the new business. My clients were facing an adversary with much greater resources. To me this case is significant because its successful resolution was literally a question of the survival of my client.
 - (e) *Butler v. Ford Motor Company, et al.*, 724 F.Supp.2d 575 (D.S.C. 2010). In this case, I represented a small tire company from Georgia who had been improperly sued in South Carolina. The case is significant to me because I was able to have the case relocated to a proper forum, and prevent what appeared to be forum shopping.

I have always performed well academically. I was a member of the Golden Key National Honor Society in college and served as academic chairman for my fraternity. I made the Dean's List on more than one occasion in law school, and I was also employed as a research assistant for one of my law school professors.

For my professional job after law school, I worked a law clerk for the Honorable J. Ernest Kinard, Jr., a Circuit Court judge. There is no better training for service as a Circuit Court judge than to have worked as a law clerk. Law clerks see the actual day in and day out work of a Circuit Court judge. I was fortunate enough to be involved as a law clerk in Judge Kinard's research and decision-making process.

After my clerkship, I have litigated cases for over twenty years. I have drafted pleadings and discovery, deposed witnesses, attended roster meeting, argued motions, selected juries, tried cases, and argued appeals. My work has been court work, and, in my opinion, has prepared me for service as a Circuit Court judge

Apart from ownership in Walker & Reibold, LLC, the law firm at which I practice, I am unaware of any financial arrangements or business relationships that could constitute or result in a possible conflict of interest were I to be elected to the position of Circuit Court Judge. After any such election, I would withdraw from the law firm, and would automatically recuse myself from any matters which involved the firm for a period of one

year. After that initial year, I would disclose any possible conflict of interest, and, if any party so requested, I would give significant deference to that party's request for recusal.

If I were serving in a judicial capacity, it would be inappropriate to maintain a Facebook status with attorneys who regularly appear before me unless I have a pre-existing or other separate social relationship with the attorney.

Yes. I acted as a lobbyist on one occasion in 2007. A friend and client was assaulted at an outdoor automated teller machine, or ATM. I was employed by her family to draft and help secure the passage of a law which strengthened the criminal penalties for robberies and assaults committed at ATMs. As a result of our efforts, S.C. Code Ann. Section 16-11-380 was amended. The penalty for committing a robbery at an ATM is now equal to the penalty for robbing a bank. The lobbyist principal was Saving Time, LLC, a limited liability company owned primarily by the victim’s family.

I am a member for the Practice and Procedure Committee of the South Carolina Bar Association. I have also authored a number of articles and co-authored a legal text published by the South Carolina Bar Association.

Service as a Circuit Court Judge is a natural outgrowth of this commitment service and the legal profession.
