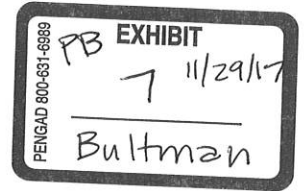

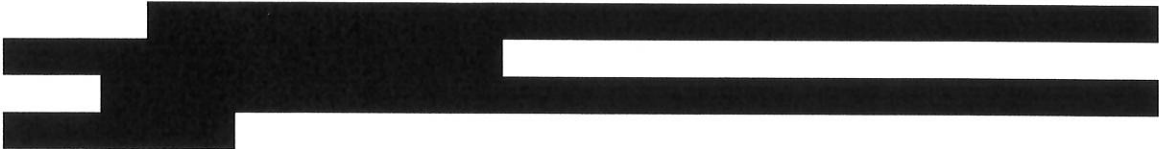

Since 1987 the emphasis of my practice has been in family law matters, as well as handling Social Security and VA disability cases.
