Created by Sec. 7-3-10, the State Election Commission (SEC) is the chief election agency in South Carolina, and is responsible for overseeing the voter registration and election processes in the State. The SEC maintains the State's statewide voter registration and election management system. The database contains voter registration records for every registered voter in South Carolina. Using this system, the SEC is responsible for printing voter registration lists for all elections held in the State, which average approximately 300 each year. In combination with the driver's license file, the system also serves as the source for jury selection lists in the State. The SEC provides election oversight, including training and advisory services to counties and municipalities to ensure elections are conducted according to law. The SEC administers a mandatory training and certification program for voter registration and election officials. State law mandates the SEC support the statewide electronic voting system. In fulfilling this mandate, the SEC creates election specific database definitions, produces electronic ballots, provides a comprehensive security plan, and conducts training for county election officials and poll managers in the proper use of the system. This training includes printed materials, classroom instruction, and interactive online training. The Agency provides all voter registration and election materials to county election officials and reimburses counties for allowable primary and election expenses. The Agency provides information regarding voter registration and elections to the media, candidates, political parties, special interest groups, and citizens. The SEC coordinates the accumulation and reporting of election results through its website scVOTES.org. The Agency conducts a voter education and outreach initiative known as "Every Vote

Matters. Every Vote Counts." This effort is designed to familiarize voters with the State's voter registration and election processes and to promote participation in elections. The members of the SEC serve as the State Board of Canvassers after elections to certify election returns, to declare candidates elected, and to sit in a judicial capacity to hear testimony and rule on protests and appeals.

The S.C. Public Employee Benefit Authority (PEBA), created by Act 278 of 2012, is a state agency charged with administering the state's employee insurance programs as set out in Chapter 11 of Title 1 of the S.C. Code of Laws, the various employee retirement systems and programs pursuant to Title 9 of the code, and the deferred compensation program pursuant to Chapter 23 of Title 8. The 11-member PEBA Board of Directors was established as the governing body for PEBA with each member meeting educational qualifications and standards and having substantial experience in either the insurance, financial, legal, academic, or public service field. PEBA administers the following employee insurance programs: the State Health Plan; the State Health Plan Prescription Drug program; the State Health Plan Medicare Prescription Drug program; the State Dental Plan; the Dental Plus plan; the Vision Care plan; the Optional and Dependent Life Insurance plan; the basic and supplemental long term disability plans; and a flexible benefits program.

PEBA administers four primary defined benefit retirement plans: the South Carolina Retirement System; the Police Officers Retirement System; the General Assembly Retirement System; and the Judges and Solicitors Retirement System. PEBA also administers the S.C. National Guard supplemental pension plan, the State Optional Retirement Program, which is a defined contribution retirement plan available as an alternative to the South Carolina Retirement System for certain eligible employees, and the Deferred Compensation Program, which is a voluntary, supplemental retirement savings program.

Created by the South Carolina Restructuring Act of 2014, the Revenue and Fiscal Affairs Office is governed by the three appointed members of the Board of Economic Advisors, RFA's mission is to provide independent research, analysis, and resources to the executive and legislative branches of state government, local government officials, and the private sector to facilitate informed policy decisions and administration of services. Currently, RFA consists of three major divisions. each with several distinct offices. The Fiscal Analysis Division consists of the Board of Economic Advisors, Budget Development, and Economic Research and provides economic analysis, forecasting, revenue monitoring, research. and technical support for developing the appropriations bill. and estimating the fiscal impact of legislative proposals. The Health & Demographics Division consists of Statistics, Development, Health Resources, and Online Analytics and provides for a cooperative health statistics information system. statistical coordination and standardization among state agencies, and other statistical services and analysis. The Department also establishes standards for and licenses child care providers and residential group homes for children.

The Department administers economic assistance programs including the federal TANF (Temporary Assistance for Needy Families) program, which provides employment and training for persons receiving cash assistance. The Department administers food assistance programs in every county in South Carolina. The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) is a federal benefit to assist low income persons in the purchase of food. Also, a commodities program distributes supplemental food through a network of food

banks. Other food programs provide financial assistance for child and adult care providers, homeless shelters, and summer feeding sites for children. The Department also administers the child support enforcement program under federal Title IV-D and other child support services, including fatherhood initiatives.
