# 2019 Statewide School Districts Capital Needs Report

Provided to the SC General Assembly

Pursuant to § 59-144-130

December 31, 2019

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#### Introduction

This report is submitted to the General Assembly per S.C. Code Ann. § 59-144-130 which reads: Every three years by December first beginning with the year 1998, the State Board of Education shall report to the General Assembly the projected five-year school facilities improvement requirements reported by the school districts, the needs identified since the last report, and those previously identified needs addressed since the last report.

This report contains four essential parts, including:

- A brief summary of the last school capital needs report prepared by the South Carolina Department of Education (SCDE) in 2016 and titled Capital Needs, 2016 Statewide Summary;
- A current (December 2019) summary of the five-year capital needs reported by school districts, including notation of what amount is funded and the funding shortfall, by district and for the entire state;
- A comparative analysis of school districts capital needs from 2016 to 2019; and
- Individual school district's detailed data as submitted to the SCDE Office of School Facilities (OSF) in November 2019.

The SCDE OSF surveyed the 81 school districts and several state agency education programs in November 2019. One school district and John de la Howe did not respond to the survey. Therefore, data is not included in this report for John de la Howe and the following school district:

Bamberg School District Two

Note that this report contains district self-reported data. The SCDE has not audited or independently verified data submitted by school districts.

BabyNet is funded and regulated through the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act, and managed through South Carolina Department of Health and Human Services. We also have a preschool with disabilities full-day program for 3-4-year-olds. 4K programs are offered at all elementary schools
	We have continued to increase our 4K classrooms. We have two separate early childhood centers for 3K and 4K. They are South Fant School of Early Education and West Market School of Early Education. Also, three of our elementary schools are equipped with 3K and 4K. They are New Prospect Elementary, North Pointe Elementary and Whitehall Elementary.
	Currently the need for increasing pre-K services does not exist
	The district has ample room at the elementary school to address the needs of prekindergarten services. The school currently houses Head Start and 1 CRDEP class.

From 2017-2018 we had 983, 2018-2019 we had 959 and for 2019-2020 we currently have 849 students. Head Start is a three and four old federal grant income eligible program to promote school readiness. From 2017 to present we have 617 students. Our students with special needs are served through a continuum of services for special education and related services. We have served 421 students during 2017-2018, 467 students 2018-2019 and currently at 510 students during the current school year. First Steps Parents as Teachers is our program offering birth to five-year old home visitation services to promote transition to formal school and parent practices. During 2017-2018, they served 82 families and 98 children, 2018-2019 served 89 families and 105 children, and currently for 2019-2020 they have 55 families and 64 children. We continue to work with school teams on early intervention and child find clinics are held monthly at each elementary school. All of our programs work together with comprehensive framework.

Lexington County School District 2	We are just finishing up our \$225 million bond referendum. Consequently, in most cases, we built in one additional classroom per grade level for any future growth. We also added some pre-K programs at schools that did not previously have space for such programs. If these programs grow beyond that, we would likely need to use portable learning cottages even though space around our current school sites would be limited due to required fire lane improvements in the current code that did not previously exist when we originally built or bought property. To address this issue, our district board plans to keep some of the property at abandoned school sites that were consolidated into larger facilities given the fact that very few properties exist in our school district that are large enough to build schools.
Lexington County School District 3	Lexington School District Three offers 4-year old kindergarten classes. Lexington Three (Batesburg-Leesville Primary School) offers -4 classes of 4 year old regular kindergarten, -5 Montessori kindergarten classes with 4 year old students in themBoost Program for 2 and 3 year olds and their parents 2 days a week. Our pre-k program is at maximum capacity because of the availability of classroom space. Our Classroom space must meet the requirements for CERDEP as outlined by the South Carolina Department of Education.
Lexington County School District 4	Our district provides an early childhood center with approximately 400 3k and 4k students. The 3k and 4k programs are full-day programs.
Lexington Richland 5	New Elementary School under construction.
Marion County Schools	Four years ago the district started a program that houses all pre-k students in one facility. At the onset of the program 80 students were enrolled, presently there are over 200 students enrolled. There is currently more room to expand as well.

Pickens County	The district has added pre-k classrooms and staff using local funding in some schools. Our plan is to add more classrooms and staff in schools that have suitable space. However, all schools will not have programs due to limited suitable funding and space.
Richland County School District 1	We have been able to absorb most of our needs within our existing buildings.
Richland County School District 2	The district continues to update our facility plan by renovating existing spaces in current schools through adding restrooms, etc. This also lowers our current school capacities that increase the need for new elementary schools sooner but not currently in the next 5 years.
Saluda County School District	Question 60 - Due to limited funding we are only able to serve pre-k students based on our CDEPP funding. If additional funding were available and we had funding for additional classrooms Saluda County Schools would be interested in 4-k classes for all students.

Spartanburg School District 5	Spartanburg District Five currently has 6 elementary schools consisting of grades 4K-4th grade. Two of these schools are designated Title I schools. One Title I school has 3 full day 4K classes and the other Title I school has 2 full-day 4K programs. Each of the four non-Title I schools have 2 half-day programs serving 40 students requiring only 1 classrooms. Our district has increased 1000 students in the last three years. As we are planning future building programs, we are seeking space and funding to increase the number of full-day 4K programs in all of our elementary schools. In addition, each of our elementary also has one pre-school child development classes serving 3 and 4 year-old special education students.
Spartanburg School District 6	The school district has an aging facility used for pre K services. The original building was constructed in 1954. The estimated cost of renovation is \$17 million which is currently not included in the plan for the capital needs report.
