AGENCY'S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

SC First Steps: 2019 in Review

FY19 was a year of growth and progress for the state's comprehensive school readiness initiative, as SC First Steps oversaw the continued success of its 46 local partnerships, continued expanding the state's private four-year-old kindergarten program, and gave new life and energy to the state's Early Childhood Advisory Council.

During FY19, First Steps:

- Delivered more than 21,000 Parents as Teachers home visits to the families of at-risk children. Client children averaged 2.64 significant school readiness risk factors (including poverty, low birth weight, lack of maternal education, abuse/neglect and foster care placements, and more), while their parents demonstrated growth in both parenting skill and interactive literacy behaviors.
- Enrolled and served 2,895 children in 228 private First Steps 4K classrooms in 64 school districts.
- Initiated a major marketing effort to recruit private First Steps 4K students which helped provide a **9.4%** increase in the number of children served.
- Delivered nearly **5,000 hours of on-site technical assistance** to South Carolina child care providers participating in quality-enhancement programming.
- Provided intensive, high-quality professional development to nearly 615 private 4K teachers and administrators.
- Offered for the first time extended-day, extended-year, and summer school service options designed to meet the needs of children and families enrolled in the First Steps 4K program.
- Recreated the Early Childhood Advisory Council, which is the organization charged with coordinating services and collaborating efforts with all the major early childhood serving agencies in the state.

Risk Assessment and Mitigation Strategies:

Should First Steps fail to meet its goals and objectives, South Carolina's young children will be less prepared for success in school and life. But it doesn't end there. The evidence-based strategies delivered by the initiative are documented by research to help *reduce* the occurrence of costly negative outcomes, including child abuse and neglect, poor health, special education placements, academic remediation, unemployment, incarceration and more. In this sense, the work of SC First Steps is not only advancing the long-term success and prosperity of its clients, but reducing substantial taxpayer burdens associated with a host of undesirable outcomes.

In order to promote success and mitigate against these negative outcomes, First Steps requires the ongoing support of its public and private partners, Governor McMaster, and the SC General Assembly.

To mitigate against this failure and better ensure the success of the First Steps initiative, policy makers might:


- 1) Consider expanding the resources made available to local First Steps Partnerships allowing for the expansion of evidence-based early childhood interventions proven to impact the long-term success and prosperity of their participants.
- 2) Make the statutory and funding changes necessary to expand the Child Early Reading Development and Education Program (First Steps 4K) currently limited to 64 school districts available to all of the Palmetto State's at-risk four-year-old children, while maintaining the mixed delivery system that provides choice to parents.

The organization was created as a tax exempt organization under section 501 (c)(3) with Act 99 in 1999. Statute was updated in 2014 and again in 2018 with

several changes. Modifications included a long range plan requirement, changes to the membership of the Board of Trustees, and direction in relation to allocation funding for local

partnerships and others.

12 63-11-1710 thru 1750 State Statute

Statute creates the First Steps to School Readiness Board of Trustees whose purpose is to oversee the South Carolina First Steps to School Readiness initiative, a broad range of innovative early childhood development and education, family support, health services, and prevention efforts to meet critical needs of South Carolina's children through the awarding of grants to partnerships at the county level as provided for in Section 59-152-90. Statute was created in Act 361 in 2008. Act also creates the SC Advisory Council. This council is formed to fullfil the responsibilities under 42 U.S.C. Section 9837b(b)(1)(D)(i) of the Improving Head Start for School Readiness Act of 2007. Act was modified in 2014 and 2018 with a number of modifications. In 2014 the changes include the addition of the Early Childhood Advisory Council responsibilities and additional BabyNet responsibilities. In 2018, additional reporting requirements and a 7 year reauthorization of the agency. BabyNet was moved to DHHS per Executive Order effective June 30, 2017.
