Fiscal Impact Summary

This bill would have no impact on the General Fund, Federal Funds, or Other Funds.

Explanation of Fiscal Impact

State Expenditure

Senate Bill 141 amends Article 4, Chapter 5, Title 7 dealing with voter registration. The bill requires the Department of Health & Environmental Control to provide monthly reports to the Election Commission identifying all persons over the age of 18 who died in the previous month. The bill specifies the identifying information which must be provided. The bill also outlines the procedure for having a deceased voter's name removed from the state and county voter registration databases. The bill requires the State Election Commission to retain separate records regarding certain specified information for four years or permanently.

Department of Health & Environmental Control. The Department reports that this bill would have no expenditure impact on the General fund, Federal Funds, or Other Funds. The Department indicates that the required information is currently provided to the Commission.

State Election Commission. The agency indicates the expenditure impact to the agency would be minimal and can be absorbed in the agency's current appropriations. The agency already maintains much of the required information.
