Fiscal Impact Summary

This bill prohibits changes to insurance coverage or premiums as a result of genetic information for life insurers, accident & health insurers, and long-term care insurers.

The Department of Insurance (DOI) indicates that this bill will have no expenditure impact to the agency, as any additional responsibilities can be managed by existing staff and within existing appropriations. DOI supervises and monitors insurance companies in South Carolina and would be responsible for enforcement of this bill.

The Public Employee Benefit Authority (PEBA) indicates that there will be no expenditure impact for the agency. PEBA administers the State Health Plan for South Carolina state employees, public education employees, and participating other employers. PEBA indicates that the State Health Plan does not use genetic information in any way that would be prohibited by this bill and would not change the operations of any plan that they administer.

Explanation of Fiscal Impact

Introduced on March 29, 2023 State Expenditure
