Fiscal Impact Summary

This bill requires license plates to be fastened securely in a horizontal and upright position to the vehicle for which it was issued to prevent the plate from swinging. Additionally, an intrastateonly large commercial motor vehicle that has been issued a forty-five-day temporary license plate pursuant to Section 56-3-212 may display a motorcycle-sized temporary license plate securely in the front, passenger-side windshield of the vehicle. The unique identifying license plate text must face the exterior of the vehicle and should not obstruct the driver's view. The bill will have no expenditure impact on the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) because it does not operationally or fiscally impact the department.

Explanation of Fiscal Impact
