# SOUTH CAROLINA STATE REGISTER

An official state publication, the *South Carolina State Register* is a temporary update to South Carolina's official compilation of agency regulations--the *South Carolina Code of Regulations*. Changes in regulations, whether by adoption, amendment, repeal or emergency action must be published in the *State Register* pursuant to the provisions of the Administrative Procedures Act. The *State Register* also publishes the Governor's Executive Orders, notices or public hearings and meetings, and other documents issued by state agencies considered to be in the public interest. All documents published in the *State Register* are drafted by state agencies and are published as submitted. Publication of any material in the *State Register* is the official notice of such information.

# STYLE AND FORMAT

Documents are arranged within each issue of the State Register according to the type of document filed:

**Notices** are documents considered by the agency to have general public interest.

**Notices of Drafting Regulations** give interested persons the opportunity to comment during the initial drafting period before regulations are submitted as proposed.

**Proposed Regulations** are those regulations pending permanent adoption by an agency.

**Pending Regulations Submitted to the General Assembly** are regulations adopted by the agency pending approval by the General Assembly.

**Final Regulations** have been permanently adopted by the agency and approved by the General Assembly. **Emergency Regulations** have been adopted on an emergency basis by the agency.

**Executive Orders** are actions issued and taken by the Governor.

#### 2017 Publication Schedule

Documents will be accepted for filing on any normal business day from 8:30 A.M. until 5:00 P.M. All documents must be submitted in the format prescribed in the *Standards Manual for Drafting and Filing Regulations*.

To be included for publication in the next issue of the *State Register*, documents will be accepted no later than 5:00 P.M. on any closing date. The modification or withdrawal of documents filed for publication must be made **by 5:00 P.M.** on the closing date for that issue.

#### REPRODUCING OFFICIAL DOCUMENTS

Documents appearing in the *State Register* are prepared and printed at public expense. Media services are encouraged to give wide publicity to documents printed in the *State Register*.

#### **PUBLIC INSPECTION OF DOCUMENTS**

Documents filed with the Office of the State Register are available for public inspection during normal office hours, 8:30 A.M. to 5:00 P.M., Monday through Friday. The Office of the State Register is in the Legislative Council, Fourth Floor, Rembert C. Dennis Building, 1000 Assembly Street, in Columbia. Telephone inquiries concerning material in the *State Register* or the *South Carolina Code of Regulations* may be made by calling (803) 212-4500.

# ADOPTION, AMENDMENT AND REPEAL OF REGULATIONS

To adopt, amend or repeal a regulation, an agency must publish in the *State Register* a Notice of Drafting; a Notice of the Proposed Regulation that contains an estimate of the proposed action's economic impact; and, a notice that gives the public an opportunity to comment on the proposal. If requested by twenty-five persons, a public hearing must be held at least thirty days after the date of publication of the notice in the *State Register*.

After the date of hearing, the regulation must be submitted to the General Assembly for approval. The General Assembly has one hundred twenty days to consider the regulation. If no legislation is introduced to disapprove or enacted to approve before the expiration of the one-hundred-twenty-day review period, the regulation is approved on the one hundred twentieth day and is effective upon publication in the *State Register*.

#### **EMERGENCY REGULATIONS**

An emergency regulation may be promulgated by an agency if the agency finds imminent peril to public health, safety or welfare. Emergency regulations are effective upon filing for a ninety-day period. If the original filing began and expired during the legislative interim, the regulation can be renewed once.

#### REGULATIONS PROMULGATED TO COMPLY WITH FEDERAL LAW

Regulations promulgated to comply with federal law are exempt from General Assembly review. Following the notice of proposed regulation and hearing, regulations are submitted to the *State Register* and are effective upon publication.

#### **EFFECTIVE DATE OF REGULATIONS**

**Final Regulations** take effect on the date of publication in the *State Register* unless otherwise noted within the text of the regulation.

**Emergency Regulations** take effect upon filing with the Legislative Council and remain effective for ninety days. If the original ninety-day period begins and expires during legislative interim, the regulation may be refiled for one additional ninety-day period.

#### Executive Order No. 2017-04

WHEREAS, on February 16, 2017, Representative John Michael "Mick" Mulvaney resigned his office and seat in the United States House of Representatives representing the fifth congressional district of the State of South Carolina by way of the attached letter, effective immediately, to accept the appointment of the President, by and with the advice and consent of the United States Senate, to serve as Director of the Office of Management and Budget in the Executive Office of the President; and

**WHEREAS,** by virtue of the resignation of Representative Mulvaney, there exists a vacancy in such office and seat in the United States House of Representatives representing the fifth congressional district of the State of South Carolina for the duration of the unexpired term ending in January of 2019; and

WHEREAS, Article I, Section 2 of the United States Constitution provides that "[w]hen vacancies happen in the Representation of any State, the Executive Authority thereof shall issue Writs of Election to fill such Vacancies"; and

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of South Carolina, as the Executive Authority of the State, shall declare such vacancy and issue a Writ of Election ordering a special election to fill the vacancy in the representation of the State of South Carolina in the United States House of Representatives; and

WHEREAS, section 7-13-190 of the South Carolina Code of Laws sets forth the process, procedure, and schedule for conducting a special election to fill the vacancy created and occurring by virtue of the resignation of Representative Mulvaney of the office and seat in the United States House of Representatives representing the fifth congressional district of the State of South Carolina.

**NOW, THEREFORE,** by virtue of the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of South Carolina and pursuant to the Constitution and Laws of this State and the powers conferred upon me by Article I, Section 2 of the United States Constitution, I hereby declare the office and seat in the United States House of Representatives representing the fifth congressional district of the State of South Carolina vacant and Order the State Election Commission to conduct a special election to fill such vacancy as provided by law and in accordance with the process, procedure, and schedule set forth in section 7-13-190 of the South Carolina Code of Laws. This Order and Writ of Election is effective immediately.

Notice of Termination State Register Document No. 4667

March 24, 2017

On September 23, 2016, the Department of Health and Environmental Control published a Notice of Proposed Regulation, identified as Document No. 4667, in the State Register to amend Regulation 61-105, *Infectious Waste Management Regulations*. Due to the complexity of issues raised by public comments received, the Department canceled the March 9, 2017 public hearing for the proposed amendments and is now terminating Document No. 4667. The Department will consider these comments in proposing revised amendments to R.61-105, which will begin shortly with issuance of a new Notice of Drafting and, ultimately, a Notice of Proposed Regulation under a new document number. This will provide the public with additional opportunities to review and provide input for proposed amendments incorporating consideration of the previously received comments.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH STANDARDS

South Carolina Department of Labor, Licensing and Regulation (SC DLLR) does hereby give notice under Section 41-15-220, SC Code of Laws, 1976, as amended, that a public hearing will be held on May 24, 2017 at 10:00 a.m. at the SC DLLR, 110 Centerview Drive, Columbia, SC, Room 108, at which time interested persons will be given the opportunity to appear and present views on the occupational safety and health standards being considered for adoption.

The hearing is to determine if the Director of the SC DLLR will promulgate, revoke, or modify Rules and Regulations pursuant to Section 41-15-210, SC Code of Laws, 1976.

OSH Rules and Regulations being considered at the hearing are as follows:

In Subarticle 6 (General Industry):

Revisions to Sections: 1910.1000 – Air Contaminants, 1910.1024 - Beryllium, Appendix A to § 1910.1024

In Subarticle 7 (Construction):

Revisions to Sections: 1926.55 – Gases, vapors, fumes, dusts, and mists, 1926.1124 -Beryllium, Appendix A to § 1926.1124

Summary of changes: SC OSHA is amending its existing standards for occupational exposure to beryllium. The amended standard establishes a new permissible exposure limit for beryllium. Provisions of the standard are also being made to protect employees, such as requirements for exposure assessment, methods for controlling exposure, respiratory protection, medical surveillance, hazard communication, and recordkeeping.

SC OSHA is also issuing two separate expanded standards for beryllium, in both general industry and construction to address the hazards found in these sectors.

Any omissions or corrections to the occupational safety and health standards being considered for adoption published in the FEDERAL REGISTER prior to this hearing may be presented at this hearing. These revisions are necessary to comply with federal law and copies of them can be obtained or reviewed at the SC DLLR during normal business hours by contacting the OSHA office at 803-896-5811.

Persons desiring to speak at the hearing shall file with the Director of the SC DLLR a written notice of intention to appear and the approximate amount of time required for her/his presentation on the particular matter no later than May 17, 2017. Any person who wishes to express her/his views, but is unable or does not desire to appear and testify at the hearing, should submit those views in writing on or before May 17, 2017.

#### **Synopsis:**

On behalf of and with the advice and consent of the State Advisory Committee on the Regulation of Childcare Facilities, the Department of Social Services is charged with submitting amended regulations governing the operation of public and private child care centers every three years (Section 63-13-180). Enforcement of the regulations is currently effected by the Department of Social Services' Child Care Licensing program. The proposed regulations establish updated standards that further protect the health, safety and well-being of children receiving care in child care centers.

Legislative review of this proposal will be required.
