Dear Mr. Hayden:

On behalf of Governor Sanford, we write in response to your letter of October 22, 2009 requesting information regarding Governor Sanford's use of state-owned aircraft. Specifically, you have asked for information related to fifty-three (53) separate flights that occurred between April 5, 2003 and June 4, 2009.

Please find the information you requested regarding each individual flight in the enclosed chart. This chart provides the date, passengers, and descriptions of the official business connected to each flight in question, all of which confirms the legitimacy and legality of these flights. In addition, enclosed please find a CD with electronic copies of fifty-seven (57) exhibits containing documentation, such as invitations and news articles, confirming the official nature of these flights and the related events.

In support of our response and to assist your investigation, below please find our discussion of the applicable statute of limitations and the definition of "official business" as it relates to the use of state-owned aircraft.

Statute of Limitations Defense

As a threshold matter, the applicable statute of limitations found in S.C. Code § 8-13-320(9)(d) prohibits action from being taken by the Ethics Commission regarding any flights that occurred prior to August 18, 2005. Therefore, the Commission is barred from taking any action on any of the twenty-five (25) flights listed in the enclosed chart that occurred from April 5, 2003 to July 8, 2005, and we specifically object to the Commission taking any action with regard to any of the flights that occurred prior to August 18, 2005 on these grounds. Nevertheless, without waiving our objection and our right to assert a statute of limitations defense, and in the spirit of cooperation with your investigation, we have included information regarding these flights on the enclosed chart.

Definition of "Official Business"

In addition, set forth below are the legal principles involved in determining whether state aircraft was used for "official business." In your letter, you point out that the proviso in the annual appropriations act limits the use of state aircraft to only "official business," but that term has not been defined by the proviso, statutes, or the courts.¹ The South Carolina Attorney General's Office, however, has addressed the meaning of "official business" for the purpose of using state aircraft under the appropriations act proviso in two separate opinions. Accordingly, as the sole legal authority on this precise issue, the Ethics Commission should apply the guidance from these two Attorney General opinions in analyzing whether Governor Sanford's use of state aircraft was for official business. See *Price v. Watt*, 280 S.C. 510, 514, 313 S.E.2d 58, 60 fn. 1 (Ct.App. 1984) (stating that Attorney General's opinion "should not be disregarded without cogent reason").

The Attorney General's Office most thoroughly considered the meaning of "official business" in a May 19, 1988 opinion letter to Rep. Jarvis Klapman, who requested an interpretation of what constitutes "official business" in the context of the state aircraft proviso. The Attorney General opinion "offer[ed] a 'rule of thumb' to officials of state government using state aircraft for official business." The Attorney General "rule" provides that "for an activity or use of an official to be official, such activity or use must be done in his official capacity, under color of office. . . . *Any activity which a state official is invited or required to do that would not occur but for the public office or position he holds could thus be considered 'official business' for the purposes of using state aircraft.*" 1988 WL 485301 at *3 (emphasis added). Thus, under this standard the governor may use the state aircraft for transportation to or from any event that he attends in his official capacity, except as otherwise prohibited by law. Accordingly, in determining whether Governor Sanford's travel at issue was for "official business," the Ethics Commission should consider whether Governor Sanford would not have used the state aircraft but for his position as governor. If the answer to this question is "yes," then the use of state aircraft was for official business and therefore appropriate as a matter of law.

In an August 31, 1984 opinion letter to James A. Timmerman, then director of the South Carolina Wildlife and Marine Resources Commission (which is the predecessor of the current Department of Natural Resources), the Attorney General's Office addressed several questions regarding the WMRC's use of state aircraft under the proviso. The final question answered by the Attorney General's Office was whether a prohibition in the proviso against travel to and from meetings of the General Assembly or committee meetings would preclude air transportation of the WMRC commissioners to WMRC meetings. The Attorney General's Office concluded that only legislative meetings were intended to be prohibited and that all other state officials could use state aircraft to travel to and from official meetings. This opinion permitted the WMRC to fly its aircraft from Columbia with no passengers to pick up WMRC commissioners at their residence or other location, bring them to Columbia for official business, return them to their residence or other location, and return the aircraft to Columbia with no passengers.

¹ By way of clarification, we would point out that the proviso has actually been in effect *at least* since FY 1983, not FY 2003 as indicated in your letter.

This is significant to the inquiry into Governor Sanford's flights because several media outlets have questioned the practice of flying the state aircraft without passengers to a location to provide Governor Sanford with transportation either to or from an official event. For example, one news story focused on the state aircraft flying empty to pick up the governor and his family from Thanksgiving vacation near Savannah, GA and returning them to Columbia to participate in the annual Governor's Carolighting ceremony on the Statehouse grounds. The Attorney General's August 31, 1984 opinion clearly permits this type of transportation as long as it is provided either to or from an official event. Further, it has been a common practice for many other state officials, including General Assembly members, to have the state aircraft fly empty to pick them up from a location other than Columbia and transport them to or from an official event.²

There also appears to be confusion over the issue of whether the state aircraft can be used for "political" events. Media reports and hand-written notes on the flight materials provided by the Ethics Commission suggest that the state aircraft cannot be used for "political" events. This argument fails to recognize that the very nature of the office of Governor means that the official business of the officeholder often unavoidably involves a "political" element. *Black's Law Dictionary* defines "political" to mean the following:

Pertaining or relating to the policy of the administration of government, state or national. Pertaining to, or incidental to, the exercise of functions vested in those charged with the conduct of government; relating to the management of the affairs of the state, as political theories; of or pertaining to exercise of rights and privileges or the influence by which individuals of a state seek to determine or control is public policy; having to do with organization or action of individuals, parties, or interests that seek to control appointment to action of those who manage affairs of a state.

Black's Law Dictionary, 1158, 6th Edition, 1991. Given the broad meaning of the word "political," nearly everything the governor does could be characterized as political since his job directly relates to the administration of government and pertains to organizing individuals to advance his policy agenda. This does not mean, however, that state aircraft cannot be used to travel to such an event as long as the purpose of the trip was for official business. For example, when the governor holds a press conference to bring public attention and pressure to bear on a particular public policy matter in support of his agenda, the event is clearly an official function of his office, even though it may contain both political and official elements. Similarly, if the governor attempts to advance his policy and legislative agenda by speaking to a smaller but more politically active group of individuals, such as a political party or issue-advocacy organization, he does so as part of the business of his office and the event remains official regardless of the political audience and purpose.

² We have provided several flight logs and passenger manifests in the materials accompanying the enclosed chart showing where other state officials used state aircraft in this manner.

Accordingly, in determining whether the use of state aircraft to and from events that appear political in nature is unlawful, the Ethics Commission must examine whether the use was for official business. As explained above, this test is based on whether Governor Sanford would not have used the state aircraft to attend a particular event but for his efforts to conduct the business of his office in his position as governor. As the attached chart and the accompanying materials demonstrate, the flights at issue were for official business and were therefore appropriate and legally permissible.³

Please let us know if you need any additional information regarding these matters. We reserve the right to supplement this information if it should become necessary. In addition, please confirm that the entirety of the explanatory information contained in this letter and the enclosed chart and materials will be included in the Commission's investigatory report and its preliminary report that will be provided to the Commission members for use in their probable cause determination.

³ During his campaign for re-election in 2006, Governor Sanford flew to several political events to campaign for his re-election and to support other candidates. However, as explained in correspondence and records we previously supplied to the Commission, he did so in each instance not at taxpayer expense but rather by flying on private aircraft, and he reported these flights on his campaign disclosure reports. The fact that the governor recognized that he must use private aircraft for campaign purposes and report the use of such aircraft on his campaign reports indicates that he was cognizant of the prohibition on using public resources to influence the outcome of an election and that he did not use state aircraft for this purpose.

Dear Dr. Timmerman:

You have asked several questions of this office concerning Section 174, the aviation proviso in the 1984-1985 Annual Appropriations Act. Your questions are taken up in the order posed to this office.

You have inquired whether or not the South Carolina Wildlife and Marine Resources Department (hereafter SCWMRD) is considered to be 'furnishing transportation,' as that term is utilized in Section 174 of the 1984-1985 Annual Appropriations Act, when its law enforcement officers are assigned to fly in Department **aircraft** to perform duties on law enforcement flights as aerial observers.

Generally, words in a statute should be taken in their plain and ordinary meaning. *State v. Hardee*, 279 S.C. 409, 308 S.E.2d 521 (1983) 'Furnish' generally means to supply, provide or equip for the accomplishment of a particular purpose. *Black's Law Dictionary*, 5th Ed., 1979. 'Transportation' is defined as the act of transferring or conveying from one person or place to another. *Webster's Third New International Dictionary*, unabridged (1976).

As I understand it, Wildlife Law Enforcement Officers performing crew member duties on patrol flights are usually picked up at an airport in the locality to be patrolled and returned to the same airport at the termination of the flight. This would not constitute 'transportation' as the term is commonly defined, and would not therefore constitute transportation under Section 174 of the Appropriations Act. Moreover, the clear intent of Section 174 is to impose its requirements upon state officials utilizing state **aircraft** for air transportation. Officers assigned to fly as aerial observers on wildlife department patrols are not utilizing the **aircraft** for air transportation, but are rather functioning as flight crew members. Therefore, no sworn statement is required for law enforcement flights during which law enforcement officers are serving as aerial observers.

Your second question asks who must prepare a sworn statement when SCWMRD provides air transportation to State officials who are neither members of the Wildlife Commission nor employees of your Department. The applicable portion of Section 174 is as follows

. . . Provided, Further, That no member of the General Assembly, no member of a state board, commission or committee, and no state official shall be furnished air transportation by a state agency other than the Aeronautics Commission unless such agency prepares and maintains in its files a sworn statement from an appropriate official of the agency certifying that the member's or state official's trip was in conjunction with the **official business** is the agency. **Official business** shall not include routine transportation to and from

meetings of the General Assembly or committee meetings for which mileage is authorized.

*2 The question as to who must prepare a sworn statement for an **aircraft**-operating agency other than the Aeronautics Commission turns on how the legislature intended to use the term 'agency' in the last sentence of the section above quoted. Several rules of statutory construction are useful in making that determination

The paramount rule of statutory construction is to discern and give effect to the intent of the legislature in enacting a statute, Anders v. S.C. Parole and Community Corrections Board, 279 S.C. 206, 305 S.E.2d 229 (1983); Bankers Trust of S.C. v. Bruce, 275 S.C. 35, 267 S.E.2d 424 (1980). In seeking legislative intent in statutory construction, our courts have not considered themselves necessarily bound by the apparent meaning of words but have instead considered statutes as a whole in light of conditions existing at the time of enactment and the purpose sought to be accomplished. Fulghum v. Bleakley, 177 S.C. 286, 181 S.E. 30 (1935).

Applying these principles to the paragraph quoted above, in light of the questions posed, it becomes apparent that the primary thrust of Section 174 is that **aircraft** owned and operated by the State of South Carolina be utilized only for **official business** of the State. There is also a clear intention, expressed in the second sentence quoted above, that agencies owning and operating **aircraft** (such as SCWMRD) be able to furnish air transportation to the Governor, Constitutional Officers, members of the General Assembly, and members of State boards, commissions and agencies. This language is modified by the last sentence in the section cited, beginning with 'provided further'. A proviso such as this generally must be read together with the main provisions of the body of the act. State v. Standard Oil Company of New Jersey, 195 S.C. 267, 10 S.E.2d 778 (1940).

Utilizing these rules of construction, it appears that the legislature simply intended to impose some additional steps to insure that flights in agency-owned and operated **aircraft** are for official state business. In order to furnish transportation to a state official, an agency owning the **aircraft** must prepare and maintain in its file a statement that the flight was in connection with the '**official business** of the agency.'

As to who must actually execute the sworn statement, there are two possible readings of the Act. One possible interpretation is that an official of the agency owning and operating the **aircraft** must certify that the flight is in connection with the **official business** of the agency operating the **aircraft**. However, when read together with the provision expressly authorizing agencies to furnish transportation to various state officials, this construction appears inappropriate. Where transportation is to be provided state officials not employed by an agency owning **aircraft**, it appears consistent with the intent and purpose of the act to require an official of the agency requesting such transportation to execute a sworn statement that the flight would be in conjunction with the **official business** of the agency. The term 'agency' as it is used the last two times in the proviso, refers to the Office of the Governor, Constitutional Officers, legislative bodies, or the various State boards, commissions and agencies for which air transportation may be furnished. This construction gives full effect to all provisions of Section 174, and is reasonable in that it requires those officials with particular knowledge of the need for a flight or the purpose for which it is intended. To subject an official of the **aircraft**-operating agency to the sanctions provided in the act, when that official might have no basis for knowledge of the purpose of another state official's flight, would be unfair and unreasonable. Statutes should be sensibly construed so as to avoid absurd or unreasonable application. Stephens v. Hendricks, 226 S.C. 79, 83 S.E.2d 634 (1954).

*3 Therefore, although a final answer to this question can only be provided by our Supreme Court, it is the opinion of this office that Section 174 of the 1984-1985 Appropriations Act requires an official with the agency requesting a flight upon an **aircraft** owned by a separate agency to certify in a sworn statement that the flight is in

Your final question asks whether or not a prohibition in the statute against travel to and from meetings of the General Assembly or committee meetings would preclude air transportation of Commissioners to meetings of the South Carolina Wildlife and Marine Resources Commission. The pertinent language reads as follows:

Official business shall not include routine transportation to and from meetings of the General Assembly or committee meetings for which mileage is authorized.

Obviously, the Legislature intended that this language apply only to meetings of the General Assembly and legislative committee meetings. Elsewhere in Section 174, when the authors of this section wished to include other State agencies, boards and committees, the phrase ' . . . State board, commission, or committee. . .' has been utilized. Having previously employed such language, the fact that the legislature here referred only to 'meetings of the General Assembly' and 'committee meetings' in the same sentence, implied that other state boards and commissions were intended to be excluded. The language would not, therefore, include meetings of the Wildlife and Marine Resources Commission in its prohibition

Dear Representative Klapman:

Your letter to Attorney General Medlock regarding an interpretation of certain provisions of Proviso 129.40 of the 1987-88 Appropriation Act has been referred to me for a response. I shall address specifically the four questions you raise hereinafter; however, your central request deals with a clarification or definition of 'what constitutes 'official use' of state aircraft.' As I am certain you realize, 'official use' is difficult to define without resorting to a specific factual situation. [FN1] Thus, I shall discuss various general definitions of 'official use' or similar phrases and I shall analyze several cases, both within and without South Carolina, dealing with official use in the context of motor vehicles. I found no case which dealt with 'official use' in the context of aircraft transportation.

I. 'What defines official use?'

Proviso 129.40 of the 1987-88 Appropriation Act provides in part that '[a]ny and all aircraft owned or operated by agencies of the State Government shall be used only for **official business**.' 'Official business' is not 'defined' in their Proviso. Generally, words used in a statute are to be given their plain and ordinary meaning absent an express intention to the contrary. *Worthington v. Belcher*, 274 S.C. 366, 264 S.E.2d 148 (1980). I note no indication to give 'official business' any meaning other than its plain and ordinary one.

In statutory construction the primary consideration is the intention of the legislature. *Citizens and Southern Systems, Inc. v. South Carolina Tax Comm'n.*, 280 S.C. 138, 311 S.E.2d 717 (1984). When interpreting a statute, legislative intent must prevail if it can be reasonably discovered in the language used, which must be construed in light of the intended purpose of the statute. *Gambrell v. Travelers Ins. Co.*, 280 S.C. 69, 310 S.E.2d 814 (1983). However, when a statute is plain and unambiguous, it should be applied literally. *Duckworth v. Cameron*, 270 S.C. 647, 244 S.E.2d 217 (1978).

'Official act' is defined generally as one 'done by an officer in his official capacity under color and by virtue of his office.' *Black's Law Dictionary*, 1236, 4th Edition, 1968.

While we have found no South Carolina cases construing 'official business' in the context of Proviso 129.40 of the 1987-88 Appropriation Act, our Supreme Court has examined 'official business' as it relates to the Governmental Motor Vehicle Tort Claims Act and stated.

Under the settled law of this State governmental entities have no business except 'official business' and therefore the statutory phrase 'while in and about the official business of such governmental entity' merely

imposes the requirement that the employee be about the business of the employer.
Morris v. S.C. State Highway Dept., 264 S.C. 369, 215 S.E.2d 430, 433 (1975) (J. Bussey, dissenting)

***2** Obviously, no meaningful analysis of 'official business' can be undertaken without a specific fact situation to analyze (i.e. 'official business' is determined on an ad hoc basis). I shall examine two cases which have discussed 'official business.'

In South Carolina, acts of adultery between a physician and Plaintiff's wife, both of whom were employed by the Department of Mental Health, were held not official actions sufficient to subject the Department of Mental Health to liability under a theory of respondent superior. *Morris v. Mooney*, 288 S.C. 477, 343 S.E.2d 442 (1986). The reason for this conclusion was that the acts of adultery were not reasonably necessary to the accomplishment of the physician's employment and, thus, were not within his scope of employment.

In *Felton v. E.E.O.C.*, 820 F.2d 391 (Fed.Cir. 1987), Judge Bissell discussed whether the use of a discussed government vehicle to transport a typist was appropriate under the following facts:

[O]n that morning Ms. Mitchell a Clerk-Typist in the Louisville Area Office in June, 1984, was on her way to work in her personal vehicle when it broke down on the expressway. She was picked up by an acquaintance and dropped off at her office. . . . [S]he called a car dealership to have her car towed to be repaired. She then telephoned her supervisor, Ms. Felton, who was the Acting Area Office Director at that particular time. This occurred between 7:00 and 7:30 a.m., prior to the 8:00 a.m. regular starting time for the office.

Ms. Mitchell asked Ms. Felton if she could utilize the government vehicle used by the Louisville Area Office in order to go back to her vehicle on the expressway and secure it. Ms. Felton . . . initially . . . misunderstood Ms. Mitchell, and thought Ms. Mitchell wanted to take the government car to her home. She advised Ms. Mitchell that it was improper to do so. At that point, Ms. Mitchell explained she was not going to her home, but just going to secure her personal vehicle which had broken down on the expressway. . . . [A]lthough [Felton] normally considered such a request inappropriate, she believed that in order to make it more convenient for the office to have its only typist available to work, it would be to the government's benefit to allow Ms. Mitchell to utilize the government vehicle. Hence, Ms. Felton admitted she authorized Ms. Mitchell to utilize the car. Ms. Mitchell . . . took the government car and started toward the expressway when it also broke down. At that point, she called for assistance to get the government car towed and she also was picked up by an acquaintance who took her to her personal vehicle on the expressway.

820 F.2d at 392. Based on these facts Judge Bissell concluded that, while technically this use may have been 'nonofficial' in the mind of the employee who was disciplined for authorizing the use of the government motor vehicle, the use of the vehicle was for official purposes since the employee believed her authorization provided 'an arguable benefit' to the government. Thus, the court held that the finding that the employee authorized the use of a government vehicle for other than official purposes was not supported by the evidence. The Felton case demonstrates the subjective nature that surrounds any analysis of official use.

***3** To summarize the foregoing and offer a 'rule of thumb' to officials of state government using state aircraft for official business, it is well to keep in mind that for an activity or use of an official in his business capacity to be official, such activity or use must be done in his official capacity, under color of his office. Such activity or use must be reasonably intended by the official to be one properly belonging to his office. *Bailey v. Clausen*, 192 Colo. 297, 577 p.2d 1207 (1976); *People v. Raymo*, 32 Misc. 2d 534, 223 N.Y.S. 2d 1014 (1962); *People v. Norris*, 40 Cal. 3d 51, 706 p.2d 1141 (1985). Any activity which a state official is invited or required to do that would not occur but for the public office or position he holds could thus be considered 'official business' for the purposes of using state aircraft.

For your information I have enclosed the regulation, (Reg. 19-603) as amended, dealing with the use of State motor vehicles. This regulation demonstrates that while it is possible to specify specific uses and non-uses for State vehicles all situations must be analyzed individually.

2. 'Which individual within an agency should be permitted to sign the statement of use?'

While it is not clear from your inquiry, I assume that your question relates to the portion of Proviso 129.40 which provides:

No member of the General Assembly, no member of a state board, commission or committee, and no state official shall be furnished air transportation by a state agency other than the Aeronautics Commission unless such agency prepares and maintains in its files a sworn statement from an appropriate official of the agency certifying that the member's or state official's trip was in conjunction with the **official business** of the agency.

It appears that 'appropriate official of the agency' refers to one who is positioned to swear to the connection between the **official business** of the agency providing the aircraft (other than the Aeronautics Commission) and the state official's use of the aircraft in connection with that business. The appropriate individual within an agency will vary from agency to agency and, therefore, any analysis obviously must be performed on a case-by-case basis. Frankly, without a specific fact situation it is difficult to distill or define the concept further than the language quoted above from the Appropriation Act.

3. 'Is it advisable that the signature of the requesting agency alone be certification that the flight is for **official business**?'

An opinion from this Office is designed to address questions of law. The wisdom or advisability of a statute lawfully enacted by the General Assembly and signed into law by the Governor is not a matter of legal analysis and, therefore, is not a matter on which this Office is empowered to opine.

4. 'Should the agency specify the exact purpose of the flight?'

Proviso 129.40 of the 1987-88 Appropriation Act provides in part that:

No member of the General Assembly, no member of a state board, commission or committee, and no state official shall use any aircraft of the Aeronautics Commission unless the member or official files within forty-eight hours after the time of departure of the flight with the Aeronautics Commission a sworn statement certifying and describing the official nature of his trip (emphasis added)

*4 It is clear from this above-quoted language that the 'official nature' of the trip must be described in affidavit form. This burden is placed on the official or member utilizing the state aircraft. Once this burden has been met, the official or member has complied with Proviso 129.40.

I hope the above information has been of assistance to you.

During our investigation of the above-captioned matter, we have reviewed a total of 78 flights on privately owned aircraft listed on Governor Sanford's calendar for the years 2004 through 2008. A review of the Governor's Statements of Economic Interests forms filed with the State Ethics Commission for the same period revealed that 17 of the flights reviewed were disclosed.

In accordance with Section 8-13-1120 (9) of the South Carolina Code of Laws, 1976, as amended, a public official is required to disclose the source and description of any gift, including transportation, from any person, if there is reason to believe the donor would not have given the gift but for the official's position.


Enclosed are copies, in chronological order, of the Governor's calendar depicting those 61 flights which were not disclosed. Please note there is no "friends and family" exception in the statute or the regs. Please review each flight with your client. The question which must be answered in considering whether to disclose a gift is whether the gift would have been given if Governor Sanford was not Governor. Regardless of whom the donor may be, including friends or family, if the answer to that question is "no" then the gift must be disclosed.

If any of these or other flights should have been disclosed, the Governor may file an amended attachment to his Statement of Economic Interests for the appropriate year. If the Governor contends that a particular flight is not disclosable, he must provide the name, address, and telephone number of the donor. In addition, he must answer the following questions about each donor of each flight which he contends is not disclosable..

1. What is the relationship of the donor and the Governor?
2. How long has this relationship existed?
3. How many times did the donor provide flights for the Governor prior to January 2003, and what were the date(s) and purpose(s) of those flights?

A response is required no later than October 19, 2009.



According to McIntosh, MS has taken lots of incoming in Kershaw County for vetoing Battle of Camden money/ PPIC among other things. MS did veto \$200,000 in Battle of Camden funding, but the SC Conservation Bank gave it nearly \$350,000 this year (which wouldn't have happened had MS not pushed to fund the conservation bank for the first time ever) and it also got another \$300,000 from federal Save America's Treasures funding. Additional state funding could have come through competitive grants at PRT and MS should use this to enter trust fund/ government growth remarks. On PPIC, Kershaw School Board did ultimately vote to oppose PPIC but they at least gave the governor's office a chance to present its case (only school board in SC that did that). Obviously there's a willingness to look at new ideas there and that's how change starts. MS should use this as an opportunity to go into the PPIC compromise for below average and failing schools that was sadly not even debated in the House. He could also point out that Camden High is in the States Top 10 in SAT performance, and so while the education product in Kershaw County is quite good, he has an obligation as governor to help kids in Allendale and Barnwell and Clarendon and Marion counties where the education product is not as good. Current unemployment picture in Kershaw is 6.6% - right at the state average. MS should obviously talk about the small business tax cut as a way of improving that number. When MS was elected in January 2003, the unemployment rate in Kershaw County was 8.1%, well above the state average.

We are writing in response to your letter of October 8, 2009, in which you request information with regard to a series of flights on privately owned aircraft. For each flight referenced in your correspondence, you request that Governor (a) amend prior filings to include these flights or (b) provide detailed information as to why a particular flight "is not disclosable."

Please find attached a detailed spreadsheet that lists each flight referenced in your correspondence, along with the date of the flight and whether reporting is/was required. The chart also contains a column labeled "Information" that sets forth a detailed explanation with regard to each flight and states why reporting was/was not required. We contend that the vast majority of the flights at issue do not require reporting. Even though this is the case, we nevertheless request that, upon final disposition of this matter by the Commission, this correspondence and the attached spreadsheet (1) be treated as amendments to Governor Sanford's previous filings and (2) be made part of the public record. By this letter's amendment of previous filings to include even those flights for which no disclosure is required, the circumstances surrounding each flight will be made part of the public record upon final disposition of this matter. This will resolve any concerns about whether reporting is/is not required, and it also obviates any need to gather additional information as described in the second page of your letter.

As you know, the attached travel information has never been a secret, and Governor Sanford has never attempted to prevent its discovery. In fact, every flight referenced in your correspondence appears on Governor Sanford's public calendar, and the Office of the Governor provided his calendar to the media in response to FOIA requests. In those few instances in which a flight was
