25	(B) Beginning with Fiscal Year 2011-2012, consolidating
25 26	districts shall receive per pupil general fund appropriations at the level of the district that received the most per pupil state aid prior

28	to consolidation for four years after the date of consolidation. If
28 29	per pupil general state aid is less in the first year of consolidation for the districts than it would have been had the districts not
30	consolidated, the General Assembly shall make supplementary per

34	(C) For a four-year period following the date of consolidation, consolidating districts also shall receive state grants to compensate

41	to the difference for the first four years of the consolidated district.

- (D) Consolidating districts also may receive a one-time grant to cover some portion of the negative fund balance verified by audit that an individual district brings into the consolidation. A single supplemental aid payment must be made to the consolidated district equal to the difference between the largest and smallest deficit. For purposes of this subsection, a district with a positive fund balance is considered to have a deficit of zero.
- (E) For three years following the date of consolidation, a consolidated district may not receive district report card ratings; however, individual schools within the consolidated district shall continue to receive individual report card ratings."
