This letter is in response to your request for a preliminary estimate of weighted pupil units for FY 2010-11. Based upon historical data, we anticipate that, despite the recent decline in student weightings for FY 2008-09, the ratio of weighted pupils may return to a higher level in upcoming years and feel that it is prudent to anticipate a weighted classification of students in line with past trends. Additionally, we anticipate an increase in the student population due to increasing births and enrollment shifting away from private schools due to economic conditions. Therefore, we estimate the weighted pupil units for FY 2010-11 to be 874,128. This is a preliminary estimate, and we plan to update it as necessary following the 2010-11 45-day student count. This letter is in response to your request for a preliminary estimate of weighted pupil units for FY 2011-12. Based upon past experience and our most recent surveys of homeschooled students, we expect continued increases in public school enrollment as the recession prompts shifts away from private schools and homeschooling. However, significant increases in enrollment in the SC Public Charter school district will reduce growth in students attending the 85 regular school districts. Since the inception of the Public Charter school district in FY 2008-09, growth in its enrollment has more than doubled from 2,407 to 5,879 in FY 2009-10. Enrollment is expected to increase again in FY 2010-11 to 7,246 based upon information provided by Department of Education staff. EFA funding for the SC Public Charter school district does not receive local match funding and is therefore separate from the calculation for the 85 regular school districts. Additionally, reductions in the weightings for students over the last 3 completed school years have decreased the ratio of weighted pupils. Taking this into account, we estimate the weighted pupil units for FY 2011-12 in the 85 school districts to be 873,427. This is a preliminary estimate, and we plan to update it as necessary following the FY 2011-12 45-day student count. Please contact me if I may be of further assistance.
