Representatives G.M. SMITH, SIMRILL, HERBKERSMAN, WHITMIRE, STAVRINAKIS, ERICKSON, LOWE, FINLAY, and BANNISTER propose the following amendment:

STATEWIDE REVENUE

New

118.nr. (SR: Nonrecurring Revenue) (A) The source of revenue appropriated in subsection (B) is nonrecurring revenue generated from the following sources:

- (1) \$103,451,091 from Fiscal Year 2018-19 Contingency Reserve Fund;
- (2) \$463,514,950 from Fiscal Year 2019-20 Undesignated/Unreserved Funds;
- (3) \$125,239,577 from Fiscal Year 2020-21 Debt Service Lapse
- (4) \$36,311,463 from projected Fiscal Year 2020-21 unobligated general fund revenue as certified by the Board of Economic Advisors; and
 - (5) \$51,395,684 from CARES Act Reimbursements.

Any restrictions concerning specific utilization of these funds are lifted for the specified fiscal year. The above agency transfers shall occur no later than thirty days after the close of the books on Fiscal Year 2020-21 and shall be available for use in Fiscal Year 2021-22.

This revenue is deemed to have occurred and is available for use in Fiscal Year 2021-22 after September 1, 2021, following the Comptroller General's close of the state's books on Fiscal Year 2020-21.

(B) The appropriations in this provision are listed in priority order. Item (1) must be funded first and each remaining item must be fully funded before any funds are allocated to the next item. Provided, however, that any individual item may be partially funded in the order in which it appears to the extent that revenues are available.
