SECTION 8-13-1346. Use of public funds, property, or time to influence election prohibited; exceptions.

- (A) A person may not use or authorize the use of public funds, property, or time to influence the outcome of an election.
- (B) This section does not prohibit the incidental use of time and materials for preparation of a newsletter reporting activities of the body of which a public official is a member.
- (C) This section does not prohibit the expenditure of public resources by a governmental entity to prepare informational materials, conduct public meetings, or respond to news media or citizens' inquiries concerning a ballot measure affecting that governmental entity; however, a governmental entity may not use public funds, property, or time in an attempt to influence the outcome of a ballot measure.

Commission staff received information regarding a June 2018 newsletter Representative Collins sent to his constituents in Pickens County. A review of the newsletter revealed the following statement: "After two decades, we were finally able to put to voter referendum granting the Governor the authority to appoint the office of Superintendent of Education. I strongly recommend that you vote for Superintendent to be an appointed position."

On July 2, 2018, Investigator Bagnall contacted Representative Collins regarding the newsletter. Representative Collins stated the newsletter was paid for using public money and campaign money. Representative Collins also stated the newsletter was printed at the House/Senate print shop.

The initiation of a Commission Complaint is requested to determine if Representative Collins did use public funds, property, or time to influence the outcome of an election in violation of §8-13-1346, S.C. Code Ann., 1976, as amended.

All investigations, inquiries, hearings, and accompanying documents must remain confidential until a finding of probable cause or dismissal unless the respondent waives the right to confidentiality. The willful release of confidential information is a misdemeanor, and any person releasing such confidential information, upon conviction, must be fined not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or imprisoned not more than one year. Section 8-13-320(10)(g).
