 - c. By school district
 - d. By educational institution that receives funding from the General Assembly
- IV. Average starting wage for high school graduates, technical school graduates, and four-year degree graduates, by major, four years after graduation. Please provide this information by U.S. BEA and NAICS codes at the sector and sub sector level.

Please provide responses to the questions by Wednesday, February 23, 2022, so the Subcommittee members may have time to review it prior to the next meeting on Monday, February 28, 2022.
