INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT ON COMPLIANCE FOR EACH MAJOR FEDERAL PROGRAM: REPORT ON INTERNAL CONTROL OVER COMPLIANCE; AND REPORT ON SCHEDULES OF EXPENDITURES OF FEDERAL AWARDS REQUIRED BY OMB CIRCULAR A-133

Report on Compliance for Each Major Federal Program

We have jointly audited the State of South Carolina's (the State) compliance with the types of compliance requirements described in the U.S. Office of Management and Budget (OMB) Circular A-133 Compliance Supplement that could have a direct and material effect on each of the State's major federal programs for the year ended June 30, 2015. The State's major federal programs are identified in the summary of auditor's results section of the accompanying schedule of findings and questioned costs.

The State's basic financial statements included the operations of certain agencies and component units that have been excluded from the schedules of expenditures of federal awards because each of the entities engaged other auditors to perform an audit in accordance with the Single Audit Act Amendments of 1996. As described in Note 1, these agencies and component units expended \$2,742,390,078 in federal awards during the year ended June 30, 2015.

Management's Responsibility

Management is responsible for compliance with the requirements of laws, regulations, contracts and grants applicable to each of its federal programs.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on compliance for each of the State's major federal programs based on our audit of the types of compliance requirements referred to above. We conducted our audit of compliance in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America; the standards applicable to financial audits contained in Government Auditing Standards, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States; and OMB Circular A-133, Audits of States, Local Governments, and Non-Profit Organizations. Those standards and OMB Circular A-133 require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether noncompliance with the types of compliance requirements referred to above that could have a direct and material effect on a major federal program occurred. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence about the State's compliance with those requirements and performing such other procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances.

We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion on compliance for each major federal program. However, our audit does not provide a legal determination of the State's compliance

Basis for Qualified Opinion on Child Care and Development Fund Cluster (93.575 and 93.596)

As described in the accompanying schedule of findings and questions costs, the State did not comply with requirements regarding the Child Care and Development Fund Cluster (CFDA Nos. 93.575 and 93.596) as described in finding number 2015-014 for Matching and Allowable Costs. Compliance with such requirements is necessary, in our opinion, for the State to comply with the requirements applicable to that program.

Qualified Opinion on Child Care and Development Fund Cluster (93.575 and 93.596)

In our opinion, except for the noncompliance described in the Basis for Qualified opinion paragraph, the State complied, in all material respects, with the types of compliance requirements referred to above that could have a direct and material effect on the Child Care and Development Fund Cluster (93.575 and 93.596) for the year ended June 30, 2015.

Unmodified Opinion on Each of the Other Major Federal Programs

In our opinion, the State complied, in all material respects, with the types of compliance requirements referred to above that could have a direct and material effect on each of its other major federal programs identified in the summary of auditors' results section of the accompanying schedule of findings and questioned costs for the year ended June 30, 2015.

Other Matters

The results of our auditing procedures disclosed other instances of noncompliance which are required to be reported in accordance with OMB Circular A-133 and which are described in the accompanying schedule of findings and questioned costs as items 2015-001 through 2015-013 and 2015-015. Our opinion on each major federal program is not modified with respect to these matters.

The State's responses to the noncompliance findings identified in our audit are described in the accompanying Appendix B – Agency Corrective Action Plans to Findings and Recommendations. The State's responses were not subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of compliance and, accordingly, we express no opinion on the responses.

Report on Internal Control over Compliance

Management of the State is responsible for establishing and maintaining effective internal control over compliance with the types of compliance requirements referred to above. In planning and performing our audit of compliance, we considered the State's internal control over compliance with the types of requirements that could have a direct and material effect on each major federal program to determine the auditing procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances for the purpose of expressing an opinion on compliance for each major federal program and to test and report on internal control over compliance in accordance with OMB Circular A-133, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of internal control over compliance. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of the State's internal control over compliance.

Our consideration of internal control over compliance was for the limited purpose described in the preceding paragraph and was not designed to identify all deficiencies in internal control over compliance that might be material weaknesses or significant deficiencies and therefore, material weaknesses or significant deficiencies may exist that were not identified. However, as discussed below, we identified certain deficiencies in internal control over compliance that we consider to be material weaknesses and significant deficiencies.

A deficiency in internal control over compliance exists when the design or operation of a control over compliance does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct, noncompliance with a type of compliance requirement of a federal program on a timely basis. A material weakness in internal control over compliance is a deficiency, or combination of deficiencies, in internal control over compliance, such that there is reasonable possibility that material noncompliance with a type of compliance requirement of a federal program will not be prevented, or detected and corrected, on a timely basis. We consider the deficiency in internal control over compliance described in the accompanying schedule of findings and questioned costs as item 2015-014 to be a material weakness.

A significant deficiency in internal control over compliance is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control over compliance with a type of compliance requirement of a federal program that is less severe than a material weakness in internal control over compliance, yet important enough to merit attention by those charged with governance. We consider the deficiencies in internal control over compliance described in the accompanying schedule of findings and questions costs as items 2015-001 through 2015-013 and 2015-015 to be significant deficiencies.

The State's responses to the internal control over compliance findings identified in our audit are described in the accompanying Appendix B – Agency Corrective Action Plans to Findings and Recommendations. The State's responses were not subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of compliance and, accordingly, we express no opinion on the responses.

The purpose of this report on internal control over compliance is solely to describe the scope of our testing of internal control over compliance and the results of that testing based on the requirements of OMB Circular A-133. Accordingly, this report is not suitable for any other purpose.

Report on Schedules of Expenditures of Federal Awards Required by OMB Circular A-133

We have jointly audited the financial statements of the governmental activities, the business-type activities, the aggregate discretely presented component units, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information of the State of South Carolina as of and for the year ended June 30, 2015, and have issued our report thereon dated November 25, 2015 which contained an unmodified opinion on those financial statements. Our audit was conducted for the purpose of forming an opinion on the financial statements as a whole. The accompanying schedules of expenditures of federal awards are presented for purposes of additional analysis as required by OMB Circular A-133 and are not a required part of the basic financial statements. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the basic financial statements and certain additional procedures including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. In our opinion, the schedules of expenditures of federal awards are fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the basic financial statements taken as a whole.



Entity

Accordingly, the accompanying schedules of expenditures of federal awards present the federal financial assistance programs administered by the State, as defined on the previous page, for the year ended June 30, 2015.

Non-Cash Federal Programs

The State is the recipient of federal financial assistance programs that do not result in cash receipts or disbursements, termed "non-cash programs". The distributions under these programs are included in the accompanying schedules of expenditures of federal awards.

Loan Programs

The amounts reported in the accompanying schedules of expenditures of federal awards for the loan programs listed below represent federal capital contributions and administrative costs incurred during the year ended June 30, 2015. All programs/clusters that had either loans outstanding or total expenditures (including administrative expenses) in excess of \$23,751,729 were determined to be Type A programs and were subjected to a risk assessment process for the selection of major programs to be tested.

Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CFDA 66.458) - The Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF) was established to provide low interest loans to local governments for the purpose of constructing municipal wastewater treatment facilities, nonpoint source pollution facilities and estuary management plans.

Safe Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (CFDA 66.468) - The Safe Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) was established to provide communities with affordable financing in the form of long-term, low-interest loans for the construction of public drinking water facilities.

ConserFund Revolving Loan Fund - This fund was set up using Petroleum Violation Escrow (PVE) funds (CFDA 81.502) by the South Carolina Budget and Control Board - State Energy Office. The fund was established to provide loans to State agencies, school districts, local governments and nonprofit corporations for energy efficiency improvements.

Other Federal Assistance

The "Other Federal Assistance" presented in the accompanying schedules of expenditures of federal awards consists of federal financial assistance programs that have not been assigned CFDA numbers. The detail of grants without CFDA numbers is presented in Schedule 2 by State agency.

Pass-Through Expenditures

Federal funds received by one State grantee agency and redistributed (expended) to another State grantee agency (i.e., a pass-through of funds by the primary recipient State grantee agency to a subrecipient State grantee agency), are reported in Schedule 1 as federal expenditures of the primary receiving/expending State grantee agency. This is to avoid duplication and the overstatement of the aggregate level of federal financial assistance expended by the State.

The pass-through funds are included in both the primary recipient and subrecipient State grantee agencies in Schedule 2, the Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards by State Agency. The pass-through funds are separately identified in Schedule 2 to provide a complete schedule of all federal funds administered by State agencies within the single audit entity during the year ended June 30, 2015.

When a State agency receives funds as a subrecipient from outside the single audit entity, these funds are included in both Schedules 1 and 2. These funds are included as a part of "Total Passed Through Entities Not Included in Reporting Entity" in Schedule 2.

Notes to the Schedules of Expenditures of Federal Awards For the Year Ended June 30, 2015

NOTE 2 - BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

The expenditures presented in the accompanying schedules of expenditures of federal awards were developed from the South Carolina Enterprise and Information System (SCEIS). SCEIS is the State's accounting system which serves as the primary source of information in the preparation of the State's financial statements. Generally accepted accounting principles for governments require the use of the accrual and modified accrual basis of accounting. The expenditures reported in Schedule 1 and 2 and the related note disclosures are reported on the modified accrual basis of accounting.

Federal revenues and expenditures are included primarily in the governmental funds in the State's financial statements.

NOTE 3 - MATCHING COST

Matching costs, i.e. the non-federal share of certain program costs, are included in the accompanying schedules of expenditures of federal awards when the federal and state portions of costs are combined and the state portion cannot be separately identified.

NOTE 4 - PETROLEUM OVERCHARGE RECOVERIES

In the current and prior years the State received monies relating to recoveries from petroleum companies which had overcharged customers when price controls were in effect. These monies are expended under specific federal programs in accordance with the federal laws and regulations pertaining to such programs. Accordingly, these amounts are included in the accompanying schedules of expenditures of federal awards under the specific federal program to which they relate.

NOTE 5 - RELATIONSHIP TO FEDERAL FINANCIAL REPORTS

The regulations and guidelines governing the preparation of federal financial reports vary by federal agency and among programs administered by the same agency. Accordingly, the amounts reported in the federal financial reports do not necessarily agree with the amounts reported in the accompanying schedules of expenditures of federal awards which are prepared on the basis explained in Notes 1 and 2. The federal financial reports have been reconciled to amounts included in the schedules of expenditures for all major programs.

NOTE 6 - WIC REBATES

During the fiscal year ended June 30, 2015 the South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control received cash rebates from infant formula manufacturers in the amount of \$30,030,209 on sales of formula to participants in the WIC program (CFDA 10.557). Rebate contracts with infant formula manufacturers are authorized by 7 CFR 246.16a as a cost containment measure. Rebates represent a reduction of expenditures previously incurred for WIC food benefit costs. Applying the rebates received to such costs enabled the South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control to serve 412,380 people.

- Funding of program development cost should not occur prior to all required funding of administration of area plans.

Context: The final report for the 2012 grant was filed during our audit period and therefore was used to test the aging cluster earmarking requirements. The following details were noted:

- The amount spent for the administration of area plans exceeded the earmarked 10 percent by \$79,292. As noted on the supplemental form of the filed report, \$1,765,645 was spent for administration of area plans, compared to the 10 percent earmarked amount of \$1,686,353.
- Testing of grant disbursements disclosed that procedures were not in place to prevent payments to fund program development costs prior to meeting the funding requirements for administration of area plans. Of the approximate \$227,000 of program development expenditures charged to the grant, the specific portion which was funded prior to meeting the area plans administration funding requirements was not quantified.

Although the Office was in possession of some subrecipient OMB Circular A-133 audit reports, all four subrecipients haphazardly selected for testing, and reimbursed in the previous State fiscal year, had not submitted audit reports to the Office even though it was more than nine months beyond the end of those subrecipient's audit periods. The Office had not obtained copies of the reports for review and did not have adequate documentation to support why the past due reports were not obtained.

Criteria: 31 USC 7502 (f) (1) states, "Each pass-through entity shall - (C) review the audit of a subrecipient as necessary to determine whether prompt and appropriate corrective action has been taken with respect to audit findings, as defined by the Director, pertaining to Federal awards provided to the subrecipient by the pass-through entity."

Criteria: Federal regulations require that an IPE be completed as soon as possible. 29 USC 722(b)(3)(F) requires that the individualized plan for employment be developed no later than a deadline of 90 days after the date of the determination of eligibility, unless the designated State unit and the eligible individual agree to an extension of that deadline to a specific date. The Department's written policy for IPE development is in accordance with the details of this federal requirement.

Cause: Department personnel could not explain why the Department had not completed the IPEs within the prescribed time requirements. Documentation was not available to adequately support the delays.

Cause: The recipient's benefits were discontinued and the case was closed due to caseworker error. The case has since been reopened for review. The file for another recipient was incomplete and the original file that contained documentation of eligibility determination for the other recipient could not be located by Department personnel.

Effect: The Department could not support eligibility determinations in accordance with its State plan.

Recommendation: We recommend the Department maintain files to support its eligibility determinations in accordance with its State plan.

As a result, the Department received a letter from the United States Department of Health and Human Services (USDHHS) Division of Administration for Children and Families (ACF), dated January 27, 1998, providing formal notice that ACF intends to "disapprove South Carolina's State IV-D Plan." The letter states that the basis for this decision is "South Carolina's failure to submit a State plan amendment by December 31, 1997, certifying that it is operating an automated child support enforcement system that meets all the requirements enacted on or before the date of enactment of the Family Support Act in accordance with Section 454 (24) (A) of the Act, as amended by the Responsibility and Work Personal Opportunity Reconciliation Act (PRWORA)." The Department and USDHHS have reached an agreement in which the Department pays penalties to USDHHS for their noncompliance. Because the automated information and retrieval system has not yet been implemented, certain data necessary for proper completion of the OCSE 34A financial report is not available. The Department used the best available data and estimates in completing the report but we could not attest to the accuracy of that data.

7 CFR Part 226 (m)(6)states State Agencies must annually review at least 33.3% of all institutions and at least 15% percent of the total number of facility reviews required must be unannounced.

Cause: Program management indicated that a staffing shortfall was the cause of the delay in monitoring activities.

Effect: The Department is not in compliance with federal requirements and may be reimbursing subrecipients for unallowable activity.

Context: Upon approval of the NFP program and activities plan the Department would pay the NFP up to \$5,698,164. The NFP's monetary match is \$5,176,513. The Department did not record the receipt of the NFP match in the Child Care and Development Block Grant general ledger account. Instead the Department recorded it in a non-federal general ledger account. Furthermore, we could not determine if the NFP incurred expenditures totaling \$5,698,164 or just returned the monetary match from the amounts received from the Department.

The Department explained that they considered the receipt of funds from the NFP to be donated funds and it was their intent to use the donated funds to meet the "state" matching requirement; however, since the matching funds were associated with the expenditure of federal expenditures it appears to be an unallowable cost. The Department has expended \$1,333,373 of the amounts received from the NFP in fiscal year 2014 as a "state" match to meet federal match requirements of this and other federal programs. The remaining balance was unspent at June 30, 2015.



Condition: The Office monitoring controls did not adequately ensure that all subrecipients meeting the requirements for an OMB Circular A-133 audit submitted the required audits within nine months of the end of the subrecipient's audit period.

Context: We selected samples of subrecipients to test Office compliance with all their subrecipient monitoring requirements as a pass-through entity. Although the Office was in possession of some subrecipient OMB Circular A-133 audit reports, all four subrecipients haphazardly selected for our test, and reimbursed in the previous State fiscal year, had not submitted audit reports to the Office even though it was more than nine months beyond the end of those subrecipient's audit periods. The Office had not obtained copies of the reports for review and did not have adequate documentation to support why the past due reports were not obtained.

Criteria: 31 USC 7502 (f) (1) states, "Each pass-through entity shall – (C) review the audit of a subrecipient as necessary to determine whether prompt and appropriate corrective action has been taken with respect to audit findings, as defined by the Director, pertaining to Federal awards provided to the subrecipient by the pass-through entity."

Cause: Office policies and procedures over the monitoring of disaster grants subrecipient audit reports was not in place and operating effectively to ensure that all subrecipient audits were being monitored in accordance with the federal requirements.

Effect: The Office could not demonstrate compliance with the applicable federal monitoring requirements and may not be aware of subrecipient audit findings that could have a material effect on the program.

Recommendation: We recommend that the Office develop and implement procedures to ensure that all subrecipient A-133 audit reports

SCEMD plans to be more proactive ensuring all sub-recipients (previously sub-grantees) that meet the expenditure threshold for federal grant expenditures submit audit reports as required in OMB Circular A-133. SCEMD does enter into an agreement with all sub-recipients of Presidential Declared Public Assistance grants that includes the requirement to provide an annual audit. SCEMD does consider the risk associated with the grant awards to the approved sub-recipients to be very low because of the intense scrutiny required by FEMA and monitored by SCEMD Public Assistance staff prior to any payment amount being awarded. SCEMD will assemble a spreadsheet with each sub-recipient, point of contact, and total award amount. From this information each sub-recipient will be contacted to ascertain if they meet the federal expenditure threshold and if so request a copy of the audit covering the grant award amount either electronically or by mail. The spreadsheet will be annotated with the date of contact and result. Each received audit bill be reviewed for any finding regarding the Presidential Declared Public Assistance grant funding. This information will also be added to the spreadsheet and followed up as necessary for audit review.

We have reviewed the findings reported for the recently concluded Single Audit of the South Carolina Department of Education (SCDE) for the period ending June 30, 2015. We sincerely appreciate the professional manner in which your audit team conducted this audit and believe that our operations will be improved as a result of your findings.

There was one reportable condition, and we will address this condition as it was presented to us.

2015H63-003. Subrecipient Monitoring

Special Education Cluster (IDEA) CFDA No.: 84.027, 84.173

Grant No.: H027A140081 and H173A140085

Type of Finding: Significant deficiency in internal control over compliance,

noncompliance

Condition: The Department does not have a formal rotation plan in place for Tier II monitoring and does not have a formal risk assessment in place for Tier III monitoring as part of the Department's monitoring policies and procedures.

Recommendation: We recommend that the Department implement a formal rotation plan to ensure all subrecipients are selected for at least a Tier II review on a rotating basis. Additionally, we recommend that the Department implement a formal risk assessment process in order to document the reasoning and purpose of specific subrecipients which selected for the Tier III review.

Response:

The SCDE concurs with recommendations. Written procedures outlining the steps for a formal rotation plan for Tier II monitoring will be written and submitted to the U.S. Department of Education. Consistent procedures will be used across the years, and the plan will be adhered to by the SCDE, Office of Special Education Services (OSES).

In addition, the OSES will establish a formal risk-assessment process to document the rationale for selecting subrecipients for Tier III onsite monitoring visits. This process will include not only results from Tier II monitoring but also the agency-wide risk assessment for all subrecipients that is currently in place. Written procedures will be submitted to the U.S. Department of Education.

The revised process and written procedures will be shared with LEAs and placed on the agency's website. In addition, face-to-face training will be given at the OSES Research To Practice Conference held in July 2016.

As a final note, the OSES does have a rotation plan in place for Tier II monitoring and a process for determination of Tier III monitoring. However, turnover in personnel on the Fiscal and Data Management (FDM) Team in FY 15 resulted in lack of documentation that procedures were followed. A new team lead for FDM was hired in January 2016 and an additional staff member will be added to the team after July 1, 2016. This will enhance monitoring efforts and proper documentation of protocols.

The South Carolina Vocational Rehabilitation Department respectfully submits the following corrective action plan for the finding identified in the Schedule of Findings and Questioned Costs for the year ended June 30, 2014.

2015-004 Individualized Plan for Employment (IPE)

Condition: The Department did not complete its IPEs timely in accordance with federal regulations and Department written procedures.

Recommendation: We recommend the Department review processes to ensure that IPEs are developed timely in accordance with the Department written procedures and applicable federal regulations.

Agency Response: This finding is of great concern to the South Carolina Vocational Rehabilitation Department. The agency has policies and casework aids to alert staff that the 90 day IPE completion timeframe is approaching in order to take the appropriate action.

- The local staff are required to monitor all cases in status 10 every week to expedite case progression. In the
 event the IPE cannot be developed within 90 days, an extension letter is to be sent to the client explaining
 the need to extend the time period noted in the letter.
- A new !T program is being developed to strengthen monitoring and appropriate actions to be taken. An
 automated message will be sent weekly to the counselor and support staff with copies to the local area
 supervisor and area client services. This message will document upcoming IPE completion dates and
 specific clients whose IPEs are due for completion within the next 15 days.

Client Services staff at the SCVRD state office will conduct an intensive review of all cases opened in this state fiscal year (July 1, 2015 to February 2016). The findings of this review will be shared with the appropriate staff to initiate follow up actions to include disciplinary actions if appropriate.

State of South Carolina Schedule of Findings and Questioned Costs for the Year Ended June 30, 2015 Corrective Action Plan

Condition: The Department did not perform annual eligibility reviews for Medicaid and CHIP recipients in accordance with Section 101.10 of the South Carolina Medicaid Policies and Procedures Manual.

Department's Response:

In 2015, the Department continued to address a backlog that had developed in processing Medicaid applications. Unfortunately this had an impact on the timely processing of some Medicaid annual renewals.

SSI Nursing Home Annual Reviews: In order to work within our limited resources while responsibly addressing the risks associated with a backlog, the Department utilized its specially-trained long term care staff of approximately 45 workers to prioritize long term care applications. The Department addressed applications as its highest priority to ensure this vulnerable population was not put at serious health risk due to delayed application processing. Through a business process redesign, efforts have been in place since July 2015 to minimize the Long Term Care (LTC) backlog with significant progress made to date. The state has been in close communication with CMS regarding our strategies and progress. It is anticipated that over the course of the next year, as we are able to stay timely with current eligibility determinations that reviews will be handled timely as well. We are evaluating policies and procedures surrounding LTC reviews and reaching out to CMS and other states to identify approaches to handle LTC reviews that are efficient, less cumbersome for the beneficiary and the worker, and minimize the risk of maintaining eligibility when an individual is no longer eligible.

MAGI Annual Review: Implementation of the Affordable Care Act in 2013 made it necessary to request significantly more information from the beneficiary to conduct a



review so that appropriate household composition and household income, based on tax filing status of household members, and could be correctly assessed. This was the first time in the history of the Medicaid program that states began collecting tax filer status information from applicants and beneficiaries. This led to a much longer, complex review form and process for completing reviews. With that, CMS allowed states to pursue a waiver to delay 2014 MAGI reviews until 2015. South Carolina submitted and was approved for this waiver. The 2014 reviews were to be delayed until the same month in 2015, essentially doubling the number of reviews to be completed each month. Paired with implementation of a new eligibility system in November 2014 and associated issues, backlog for these reviews grew. The Department has taken the following steps to work towards rectifying this situation:

- Development of a "Review Script" in the new eligibility system which allows for more efficient processing of reviews.
- 2. Hiring and training a pool of temporary workers to assist with completing these reviews.
- 3. Creating processing centers focused solely on case processing and running 24 hours per workday with three shifts of workers.
- 4. Implementation of an auto renewal process in March 2015, in which income and other categorical criteria are matched with available databases, including state wage data. For those who achieve a successful data match indicating continued eligibility, no review is sent to be completed and benefits continue for up to another year, pending any reported changes. This functionality has improved since its first run. Currently, each month, over 45% of beneficiaries are able to be auto renewed as opposed to being sent a review form to be completed and processed.
- 5. Auto renewals for reviews received. Tentatively scheduled for April, functionality will be in place with the new eligibility system to use the auto renewal process for beneficiaries who have returned review forms but could possibly benefit from the auto renewal process due to the continuing improved functionality with the data matching process.

For reviews that need to be processed by a worker, strategies to prevent the need to pend or re-pend a review due to missing information have been implemented. This includes collateral calls to obtain needed information; consistency tools to prevent over or under verification of required information and a documentation template to assist the next person who must pick up the case.

Condition: Eligibility files did not contain adequate documentation to support Medicaid recipients' eligibility statuses.

Department's response:

Discontinuation of Benefits: According to the audit findings, the recipient's benefits were improperly discontinued in FY15. Further evaluation of this case revealed the following information. The agency made a change pursuant to CMS guidance on July 1, 2014, allowing a person age 65 or older to have inpatient psychiatric services to be paid by Medicaid. While South Carolina eligibility policy was not modified to reflect this change, a

provider bulletin was circulated by the agency to reflect this change and updated in the provider manuals.

March 1, 2014 – June 30, 2014: Benefits should have been terminated but were not, due to eligibility worker error.

July 1, 2014 – November 30, 2015: It was correct for the beneficiary to maintain eligibility due to the July 2014 policy change.

December 1, 2015 – present: Benefits should not have been terminated due to the July 2014 policy change and have been restored.

Corrective Action Plan:

Eligibility Policy has been drafted to reflect the change allowing for payment of claims for individuals over 65 years old residing in inpatient psychiatric facilities. Staff will be notified of this change via the next monthly Policy Update (April 2016). This policy update will explain that this policy was effective 7/1/2014. The update will be emailed to all staff and addressed as part of a weekly conference call with eligibility supervisors on 3/24/16. Eligibility training materials will be modified to reflect the policy change.

Eligibility policy staff will closely monitor upcoming Medicaid Bulletins, continue to participate in Policy Management Committee meetings to identify proposed agency changes that will have an anticipated or unanticipated impact on eligibility.

Quarterly Reports for Transitional Medicaid Assistance (TMA): The eligibility criteria for enrolling in TMA requires a member transitioning from the Parent Caretaker Relative category (a MAGI category) due to an increase in income. With the waiver approval provided by CMS, the 2014 MAGI reviews were delayed until 2015. Those MAGI beneficiaries whose income increased above income limits seamlessly roll into TMA and may maintain Medicaid coverage for up to two years, in some cases. The system is not able to retroactively send notifications so as soon as a worker was aware of the income change, the policy and procedures were followed.

Application Documentation: Many individuals who receive waiver services, including the beneficiary whose file was reviewed, initiated services over 20 years ago with documents in a paper file that would have been scanned into an electronic file once we transitioned to a document management system. The Level of Care for this case file was inadvertently not scanned into the electronic case file. The purpose of the documentation management system is to prevent incomplete case files. Staff follow specific instructions for how incoming documents are to be scanned, indexed and retrieved. An electronic documentation template is also used to capture the presence of required elements in the case file. However, to address the issue that has the potential to exist with older, paper case files that would have been scanned into the document management system, workers are asked to review the contents of the case file and attempt to retrieve missing key documents from paper files in storage where possible or from the agency contracted to administer the waiver.

Recommendation: We recommend that the Department establish and monitor controls over compliance within the payables department and across regional health departments in order to ensure compliance with South Carolina Procurement Code as set forth in the South Carolina Code of Laws.

Response: The Department will implement the necessary training and improvements to workflow to ensure compliance with South Carolina Procurement Code as set forth in the South Carolina Code of Laws.

Condition: The Department did not update the drinking water state revolving fund (DWSRF) annual report (the report) with current year data. The data reported in Attachment 1 of the report reflected fiscal year 2014 data instead of fiscal year 2015. The Department's internal review process did not detect the error prior to submission of the report.

Recommendation: We recommend that the Department review its current procedures to determine if they are adequate to detect and prevent errors and irregularities. As part of the procedural review, the Department should ensure that the procedures require the reviewer to verify (corroborate, analyze, trace, etc.) report data to supporting documentation. The Department should determine the level of detail and supporting documentation required in order for the adequate review and approval of the report.

I am writing in response to the Schedule of Findings and Questioned Costs – Schedule 3, which states that the South Carolina Department of Alcohol and Other Drug Abuse Services (DAODAS) was not in compliance with: OMB Circular A-87, Attachment B 8 h (3), which requires time-and-effort reporting for employees working on a single or multiple federal awards; and 2 CFR Part 25, which prohibits making an award to a subrecipient unless a DUNS number has been provided.

To address these findings, DAODAS has revised its Time and Effort Employee Procedures (see Attachment A). The maintenance of the time-and-effort reporting has been permanently assigned to our Human Resources Manager. All outstanding time-and-effort certifications have been obtained, and our files are now current.

Relating to the DUNS number requirement, DAODAS has revised its definition of a subrecipient to exclude miscellaneous contracts (outside the "301 System") with forprofit vendors. The agency has revised its internal policy on Monitoring of Subrecipients (see Attachment B). In addition, we have obtained the DUNS numbers of all previously considered subrecipients and revised our Request for Funding form to include the DUNS number as a required item (see Attachment C).

The South Carolina Department of Social Services respectfully submits the following corrective action plan for those findings identified in the Single Audit Schedule of Findings and Questioned Costs for the year ended June 30, 2015.

2015L04-001. Child Support Automated System and OCSE 34A Report

Child Support Enforcement

CFDA No.: 93.563

Grant No.: 1304SC4005, 1404SC4005 and 1504SC4005

Type of Finding: Significant deficiency in internal control over compliance and compliance

Recommendation: We recommend that the Department continue its progress in implementing a data processing and retrieval system that complies with Section 454 (24) (B) of the Act.

Corrective Action: Pursuant to the State's settlement with HP Corporation in January of 2015, the contract to design, develop and implement a statewide child support enforcement system has been assigned to Xerox Corporation. The federal Office of Child Support Enforcement (OCSE) approved this contract in August of 2015. Through this contract, SCDSS will work with Xerox to transfer the child support enforcement system that is currently operational in Delaware. Versions of this same system are also operational in New Jersey and Michigan.

Work on this project started soon after the contract was approved in 2015 and as of the end of February 2016, progress has been made in the following areas:

- Approval of the overall project schedule
- Review and approval of 8 key project plans
- Installation, configuration and testing of project infrastructure
- Data conversion planning and data analysis
- Development of a requirement management process
- Validation of requirements for first development effort
- Initial review of system design documentation for first development effort

Another system, the Family Court Case Management System (FCCMS) will also be delivered through the project with Xerox. The system to be implemented is a commercially available, of the shelf system named Agile Court. SCDSS will work with Xerox to make the necessary modifications to this product for use in SC and will deploy

this system in parallel with the child support enforcement system. As of the end of February 2016, the SCDSS project team has worked with Xerox to begin the initial planning phase of this project.

The timeline for implementing these systems is 4 years, with a 3 year design, development and testing phase along with a 1 year implementation phase.

The SCDSS project team submitted the required spending and activity plan, the Implementation Advanced Planning Document (IAPD), to OCSE in August 2015. Conditional approval of this plan was received in November 2015 and final approval received in February 2016.

2015L04-002. Subrecipient Monitoring

Child and Adult Care Food Program

Type of Finding: Significant deficiency in internal control over compliance and compliance

Recommendation: We recommend that the Department develop internal policies related to subrecipient review and prioritize its review schedule to ensure the subrecipients are being reviewed timely.

Corrective Action: SCDSS concurs that documented internal policies and procedures will aid agency staff in the conduct of their work to ensure compliance with applicable laws and regulations and is currently developing and reviewing draft internal manuals. During FFY 2015, staff ensured that all FFY 2015 CACFP monitoring reviews began timely and is on target with the FFY2016 reviews. We have resolved staffing issues and this will allow us to continue to meet the required monitoring as scheduled in the future.

2015L04-003. Federal Finding Accountability and Transparency Act of 2006 (FFATA) Reporting

Child and Adult Care Food Program

CFDA No.:10.558 Grant No.: 5SC300329

Type of Finding: Significant deficiency in internal control over compliance and compliance

Recommendation: We recommend the Department implement policies and procedures to ensure the reporting of the subaward information required by FFATA.

Corrective Action: Draft FFATA policy and procedures have been developed and the agency hired a FFATA Compliance Officer on December 2, 2015. In February 2016, SCDSS completed its first uploading of subreceiptient awards to the FFATA Subaward Reporting System (FSRS). Since that initial upload to FSRS, SCDSS has continued to upload Federal grants and subrecipient awards.

2015L04-004. Allowable Cost, Matching & Procurement

Child Care and Development Block Grant

CFDA No.: 93.575 Grant No.: Various

Type of Finding: Significant deficiency in internal control over compliance

Recommendation: We recommend the Department obtain an opinion from the granting agency regarding this transaction to determine allowability.

Corrective Action: This finding is similar to the 2014 finding 2014L04-008. In that finding, SCDSS was cited for entering into a \$5,951,576 contract on August 6, 2013, with a NFP. The NFP provided SCDSS a monetary match of \$5,410,524 which SCDSS recorded as earmarked revenue. The recommendation of the audit was that SCDSS obtain an opinion from the granting agency regarding the transaction to determine allowability. Both the 2014 and 2015 contracts were signed before the findings dated March 11, 2015, questioning the NFP donations were sent to the agency. On March 26, 2015, SCDSS contacted ACF Office of Grants Management and spoke with the Financial Operations Specialists for CCDF Federal funds. It was explained that the contract with the NFP was poorly drafted in an attempt to comply with a State Proviso requiring a match from all grant recipients. That the monetary match amount was an unrestricted donation from the NFP to SCDSS. On March 30, 2015, SCDSS received an email from the Financial Operations Specialist with ACF stating that "... the general consensus is that if both parties to the contract understood the donation to be unrestricted and did, in fact use the funds in an unrestricted manner, the donor (NFP) goals of an non-restricted donation was met."

In April 2015, based on the concerns expressed by the Auditors, the new Executive Management of SCDSS stopped the practice of contracting with NFP's and receiving monetary unrestricted donations.


