EBMRC serves hundreds of people each year. All services, including room and board, are provided at no charge to South Carolina residents who are blind or visually impaired. The average length of stay at the EBMRC is 12-16 weeks, depending upon each individual's needs.

The EBMRC is staffed by instructors specifically trained to teach adjustment to blindness services to people who are blind and visually impaired. The adjustment to blindness services offered at the EBMRC may include:

- Orientation and Mobility (various travel techniques)
- Braille and other communication methods
- Woodshop
- Home Management
- Recreational Activities

Vocational Rehabilitation Division

The Vocational Rehabilitation
Division of the South Carolina
Commission for the Blind works
with eligible blind and visually
impaired South Carolina residents
to assist them in reaching their
employment goals.

The Vocational Rehabilitation services assist consumers in gaining skills needed to become economically and socially independent. Services range from adjustment to blindness to job placement assistance.

The Vocational Rehabilitation services are provided to individuals whose vision is causing problems obtaining and/or maintaining employment.

Each consumer at the South
Carolina Commission for the
Blind works with a Vocational
Rehabilitation Counselor in their
area who assist them in:

- Determining eligibility
- Deciding on an employment goal
- Developing a program for Vocational Rehabilitation services

- to achieve a goal
- Assistance in the job placement and job retention process.

As part of the Vocational Rehabilitation program, the South Carolina Commission for the Blind provides specialized services for consumers who are *Deafblind* (having both vision and hearing loss).

#### **Deafblind** services may include:

- Activities of Daily Living
- Orientation and Mobility
- Vocational Consultation
- Job Placement Services

The Vocational Rehabilitation Division also provides educational and career guidance for adolescents and young adults ages 15-21 through the *Transition Program* and *Independent Living Services (IDL-B)* to enhance independent living within the home for individuals ages 18-54.

# The Vocational Rehabilitation division may also provide the following services based on eligibility:

Counseling and Guidance

- Educational Assistance
- Coordination of Community Resources
- Educational Radio for the Blind
- Vocational Evaluation
- Comprehensive Assessment

### Eligibility for services is based upon the following:

- Seeking services to prepare for, enter in, or retain gainful employment
- Legal blindness (having a central visual acuity of 20/200 in the better eye with best corrective lens or a visual field of 20 degrees or less)
- Having a progressive visual disability that will result in legal blindness
- Requiring and benefiting from Vocational Rehabilitation Services
- Be a resident of South Carolina

The SC Commission for the Blind's Vocational Rehabilitation Division offers adjustment to blindness services through its residential facility, the *Ellen Beach Mack Rehabilitation Center (EBMRC)*. The
