Statute Title 24, Ch. 3, Article 1, Section 24-3-40, 2(a) reads: if the prisoner is engaged in work at paid employment in the community, five percent must be placed on deposit with the State Treasurer for credit to a special account to support victim assistance programs established pursuant to the Victims of Crime Act of 1984, Public Law 98-473, Title II, Chapter XIV, Section 1404, and fifteen percent must be retained by the department to support services provided by the department to victims of the incarcerated population;

Proviso reads:

(GP: Victims Assistance Transfer) The Department of Corrections shall transfer \$20,500 each month to the Department of Public Safety (2017, 2018) or the Office of the Attorney General (2019, 2020) for distribution through the State Victims Assistance Program.

This proviso has been in place since FY 2011, resulting in over \$2.2 million dollars in subsidy to the State Victims Assistance Program.
