To the committe of individuals that has the power to make remarkable change in the current and future status of the SC prison system: While the COVID -19 pandemic has strained our state in many alarming ways, it has shed new light on the daily living conditions and treatment of inmates inside the walls of SCDC. As a forprofit prison system, motives will always be in question. Standards for auditing should be stringent in these scenarios and a 3rd party audit of SCDC operations is warranted and requested at this time. If SCDC operates in a professional, ethical, legal, and moral manner then such an audit will be welcomed. Prison health is a matter of public health: the public has legitimate cause for concern regarding the treatment of inmates, especially during this pandemic. I applaud and support your efforts to pass bills that will reduce sentences based on positive behaviors. Our nation is lagging so far behind in the prison reform movement. Our state, with its deep-rooted cultural barriers, is even further behind. I encourage this committee to apply constant and steady pressure to the other committees, legislators, wardens, judges, and all others needed to change the pace and the face of prison reform in SC. So far, SCDC has been permitted to implement its own educational programs and other requirements of "reclassification" and prison reform programs. SCDC does not have the knowledge nor experience required to determine appropriate programs that will be successfull. What is occurring is an appearance of progress. A wealth of knowledge is readily available from Norway and other countries with proven successfully reform programs. We cannot expect nor allow SCDC to invent its own reform programs; this must be independently and exclusively mandated by a 3rd party entity. In order to achieve measurable, meaningful change in prison reform in SC, SCDC must be held accountable. Lastly I encourage you to engage SCDC regarding community efforts. During this pandemic the public wants to help but constant pleas are denied. This would be the perfect opportunity to join the public with the prison system- a collaboration that will be imperative for the reform movement. As inmates are released, employment opportunities are limited. This can begin to change now by embracing the local communities in efforts to support the prison system. Families, church groups, friends, and volunteers are constantly pleading to donate soap, masks, cleaning supplies, food, and other such items to various facilities within SCDC, but they are denied. This natural desire to help should be harnessed to build needed relationships between the communities, businesses, and prisons; instead, animosity is increasing by the day. While this is not a

legal or legislative matter, this committee has the "voice" needed to motivate SCDC to recognize the community as an ally.
