Dear Representative Hixon,

Following the April 4, 2019 Legislative Oversight Subcommittee meeting, you asked the agency to answer the following questions:

- 1. Do you know of any other states that have the ability to audit the use of DMV data purchased by third parties?
- 2. How do other states with which you are familiar handle investigation and enforcement of vehicle-related crimes?
- 3. How many of each type of special license plate are currently active?
- 4. What are the fees for each type of license plate?
- 5. Are companies that buy information from the DMV required to present any sort of insurance to cover liability in case the data they acquire is inappropriately exposed?

Please allow this letter to serve as a response to the inquiries above.

#### **Question 1**

We informally polled several states to determine if they audit companies that purchase bulk data from them. Of the 18 responses we received ten states do not currently require an audit, however, three of those states are considering adding an audit requirement to future contracts. For the eight states that currently require audits, the audits focus primarily on information security and appropriate use of data. Most of the states who require audits include a clause in the contract with each bulk data purchaser concerning the requirements and frequency for audits. Specifically:

- Three states require companies obtaining bulk data submit an annual audit completed by an independent third party.
- One state requires new companies receiving information to submit an audit conducted by an independent third party within 120 days of entering the program. The company must self-certify annually thereafter, but the agency has the right to require a subsequent audit.
- One state conducts routine inspections but only conducts an audit when there is an allegation of misuse.
- The remaining three states do not have a set schedule for conducting audits but have the ability to audit bulk data purchasers as they deem necessary.

### **Question 2**

Though Kendra informed us the committee received an American Association of Motor Vehicles Administrators (AAMVA) survey of all states addressing this question, we are including the following information regarding how states that we are aware of handle investigation and enforcement of vehicle-related crimes within one agency:

**North Carolina:** Housed under the NC DMV, the DMV LE Division- Field Investigations Unit investigates driver's license and title fraud, odometer fraud, misuse of dealer plates, curbstoning, sales and use tax evasion, and auto theft.

**Virginia:** Housed under the Virginia DMV, the DMV LE Division- Field Investigations Unit investigates driver's license and title fraud, odometer fraud, misuse of dealer plates, curbstoning, sales and use tax evasion, and auto theft.

**New York:** The New York Department of Motor Vehicles has sworn investigators who handle auto theft, title fraud, identity theft, odometer fraud, fraudulent documents and threats against DMV employees.

**Georgia:** has both sworn and non-sworn employees that make up the Georgia Department of Revenue. Non-sworn employees review and investigate cases and pass all criminal case to sworn officers charged with investigating all Department of Revenue criminal cases. The DMV is a division of the Department of Revenue.

**Vermont:** The DMV, housed under the Agency of Transportation, has an Investigative Section that is comprised of both sworn and non-sworn investigators. The primary focus of the Investigative Unit is to regulate, monitor and investigate illegal or questionable activities relating to licensing, registration and title fraud, dealer and inspection regulations and general law enforcement support services.

**Maryland:** Has a special police commission, equivalent to South Carolina's Class 3-Limited Duty Commission. The MD commission investigates crimes occurring on DMV property or DMV related crimes. This unit is the sole investigating agency; cases are not forwarded to another LE agency. Tickets are issued for most violations and prosecuted by the officer in local court. For violations of a more egregious nature, the officer seeks a courtesy summons from magistrate and it is prosecuted in court by the State's Attorney.

Note: The leading advantage of possessing a law enforcement commission, according to the above states, was the ability to investigate and obtain a more timely case disposition and resolution for the customer. Furthermore, states we contacted that did not possess a law enforcement capability within the DMV reported substantial delays in resolving customers' complaints due to DMV related cases receiving lower priority compared to other law enforcement investigations.

### **Question 5**

Currently, companies that purchase information from SCDMV are not required to maintain liability insurance in the event data acquired from SCDMV is inappropriately exposed. We polled the 18 states referred to in question 1 to determine if they require companies that purchase data from them to maintain insurance to cover an inappropriate exposure of data. Of the 18 responses, one state requires a commercial general liability insurance policy of one million dollars per occurrence and two million dollars overall. The other 17 states do not require insurance. However, two of those states have clauses in their contracts stating the company purchasing the information is liable for damages in the event of an inappropriate exposure. Two other states mandate the companies maintain surety bonds-one requires \$25,000 and the other requires \$50,000. Additionally, one of the states that does not require insurance has a requirement for potential new purchasers to provide a copy of their annual report and income statement/balance sheet.



# Dear Chairman Hixon:

Please allow this correspondence to serve as SLED's perspective on several issues raised to the Subcommittee. SLED understands that DMV has recommended the following:

- Tougher penalties for dealers who sell vehicles out of trust
- Broader laws for convictions of crimes or fraud, not just motor vehicle-related fraud (§56-15-350(c))
- Salesman's license for all agents/sales people working for a dealership
- NCIC fingerprint base background check requirement for licensed dealers and sales people

Be advised that SLED supports these recommendations. It is noteworthy that some of South Carolina's current laws provide only a \$50-\$200 fine for certain violations, which does not seem to serve as a significant deterrent to fraudulent behavior that affects South Carolina citizens. In addition, specifically broadening the fraud laws to cover more of the unscrupulous conduct in the vehicular sales context, particularly in the area of what DMV describes as "selling out of trust" may prove helpful in the prosecution or resolution of these matters as well. The issues arising between "floorplanners" and dealers affecting when customers ultimately receive vehicle titles are often viewed by prosecutors and judges throughout the state as civil matters and not criminal conduct. As such, clarity on this issue in terms of specific statutory or regulatory guidance may prove beneficial to all involved.

In addition, SLED supports requiring both state and federal fingerprint-based background checks for licensed dealers and sales personnel. This insures that all involved are aware of the most accurate state and federal information regarding employees and potential employees.

It is also SLED's understanding that the Subcommittee has received information, through DMV, that SLED resolves an average of 35% of the cases referred by DMV. Court Administration data indicate that only 19 cases were filed for unlicensed vehicle sales (CDR codes 2179, 2180, and 2182) in the last three fiscal years.

Be advised that SLED has recently implemented changes to how SLED tracks these cases and how SLED reports this to DMV. These changes have improved communication and will result in a higher resolution rate moving forward. In addition, SLED has implemented a process to notify DMV on a monthly basis the cases that SLED is investigating, the cases that SLED has prioritized, and the resolution of those that have been completed. SLED remains committed to fulfilling SLED's mission.

SLED also understands that DMV has discussed that he current law doesn't include very stiff penalties or minimum sentencing for dealers engaging in unfair practices, nor does it allow the Department to take a previous history of unscrupulous behavior into consideration when determining whether or not to issue a dealer license. Furthermore, the SCDMV has no authority currently to regulate moped dealers, nor does the agency know what the intent of the legislature was in that regard.

To that end, while SLED is not directly involved with the Department's determinations regarding the issuance of dealer licenses, SLED certainly supports allowing the Department to look at cumulative behavior in these decisions. Further, SLED supports the regulation of moped dealers in the same manner as other vehicles.
