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# **Review of South Carolina Tuition Grants Program**

The South Carolina Tuition Grants Program has proven to be a valuable tool in supporting students toward college completion. Based on the data collected from the twenty-two participating institutions, the following points highlight the success and value of the Program:

# Graduation Rates Among Recipients:

Across the three academic years reviewed (2021-22, 2022-23, and 2023-24), **approximately one in four (25%) of all students who received SCTG graduated each year**. Specifically:

- o 26.12% of recipients graduated in 2021-22,
- o 24.39% in 2022-23,
- o 25.04% in 2023-24.

These figures demonstrate consistent graduation outcomes, especially notable given that recipients face additional financial barriers that could otherwise hinder their persistence.

### • Extended Support Leads to Greater Success:

Notably, **nearly half (48.78%) of the graduates received the grant for four years**. Longerterm participation in the Program is associated with greater success, indicating that sustained financial support has a direct, positive impact on completion.

## Program Flexibility Helps More Students Finish:

The introduction of 5th-year funding (for approved circumstances) has assisted a small but meaningful portion of students (1.38%) in completing their degrees. This flexibility strengthens the program's ability to adapt to student needs. The most common program of study students with approved 5th-Year Grant Appeals are enrolled in are Nursing programs.

#### • Wide Institutional Impact:

All participating colleges report strong outcomes, with some, such as Coker University and Southern Wesleyan University, seeing over 30% of their total grant recipients graduate annually. Spartanburg Methodist College, a two-year institution, also shows impressive gains, with **graduation rates for recipients increasing from 23% in 2021-22 to 36% in 2023-24**.

#### • Addressing Student Need and Achievement:

Given that Program recipients qualify based on financial need rather than academic merit alone, these graduation figures affirm the Program's role in leveling the playing field. Financial assistance is clearly helping students with economic challenges to stay enrolled, persist, and complete their degrees.

#### **Factors important to note:**

Need-based financial aid programs operate much differently from merit-based scholarship programs. Most merit-based scholarship programs do not require an annual application and is automatically renewable for up to the maximum timeframe offered so long as the student continues to make progress toward degree completion and remains academically meritorious. Whereas eligibility for

need-based grant programs can vary greatly, regardless of the student's academic progress or merit. A student could qualify for a Tuition Grant in one academic year based on their family's financial circumstances, have no change in their academic performance but lose eligibility because they no longer demonstrate financial need. Additionally, because eligibility requires financial need, students must reapply annually by the Program's application deadline (August 1).

#### **Requested Data:**

All students who graduated during the 2021-2022, 2022-2023, or 2023-2024 academic years, and who received South Carolina Tuition Grants during at least one semester of enrollment. This data was compared against internal disbursement records to comprise the following record sets.
