RE: State Volume Cap Allocation

Director Hutto:

The House Legislative Oversight Committee is currently conducting a study of the Jobs-Economic Development Authority ("JEDA"). The Committee requests that you provide a response to the following inquiry by **Friday, September 8, 2023**.

During JEDA's August 29, 2023, presentation before the Economic Development, Transportation, and Natural Resources Subcommittee, JEDA briefed the subcommittee on the state's volume cap allocation, a limitation on the maximum issuance allowed for most categories of qualified private activity bonds. South Carolina's annual volume cap is based on the greater of a specified dollar amount multiplied by the state's population. For 2023, that amount was \$633,916,080. According to JEDA, at the end of each calendar year, any unused volume cap is assigned to the State Housing Authority ("SC Housing") and must be used within three years, or the volume cap is abandoned.

As indicated by the enclosed data from the Council of Development Finance Agencies, the unused volume cap allocated to the SC Housing and subsequently abandoned during the last 5 years is as follows:

• 2015: \$191 million

• 2016: \$7.8 million

• 2017: \$248.8 million

• 2018: \$260.7 million

• 2019: \$37.6 million

• 2020: \$3.2 million

Please provide the subcommittee with (1) an explanation of how SC Housing generally uses carryforward allocations; and (2) the reasons SC Housing abandoned the carryforward allocations set forth above. Please feel free to include any additional information you believe would be helpful to the Subcommittee.
