Poverty

According to the US Census Bureau, nationally, more Americans were living in **poverty** in 2016 than at any time since the 1950s, with the overall poverty rate of 15%.

South Carolina minorities living below poverty are pervasive and well above the national rate:

Blacks (28%),

Hispanics (29%),

Native Americans (12%)

Therefore, poverty rates among South Carolina minorities are more than twice the national average and twice that of whites (13%) in South Carolina.



Our Great Idea....

Address poverty with a robust *Microenterprise Development Program*

Microenterprise Development is a strategy with a 25 year history in the US. Adopted by a broad range of organizations, as a tool for poverty alleviation and local economic development...

What is a Micro Business

- 5 or less employees
- Less than \$35K-\$50k to startup
- Traditionally limited access to capital
- Owner is usually manager and employee

Micro businesses are commonly referred to as "Mom and Pop" shops
