
## Number of Notary Public Change in Status, Resignation, and Rejected Filings (FY 2015-16 – FY 2018-19)<sup>39</sup>

<u>Change in Status/Duplicate Commissions</u>: A notary public must notify the Secretary of State within 45 days of a change in the notary's name or address. The filing fee for a Change in Status form is \$10.00. A notary public may also use this form to request a duplicate commission.

<u>Resignation</u>: If a notary public resigns their commission, the notary must immediately file a Change in Status-Resignation form with the Secretary of State. There is no filing fee for this form.

<u>Death</u>: If a notary public dies, the notary's personal representative must notify the Secretary of State in writing and destroy or deface all notary seals of the decedent.
