


How Release Date is Determined

Current as of September 2021



Release Date =
 Service Credits + Goodtime Earned – Goodtime Loss – Goodtime Forfeited + Earned Work (EWC) Credits + Earned Education (EEC) Credits

When is a Release Date recalculated?

When change occurs, the program calculates all the credits accrued up to the date of the change and determines how much time remaining to serve. It assumes the inmate will continue to earn credits at the same rate of the date of the change and projects the maxout date

- ◇ Change in EWC/EEC
- ◇ Change in Status
- ◇ Change in Conviction
- ◇ Disciplinary

Statuses Considered as Dead Time (Earns NO Credit)

- ◇ 03 Probation
- ◇ 04 Release
- ◇ 05 Escape
- ◇ 07 Dead Time
- ◇ 12 Terminated YOA Parole
- ◇ 27 Community Supervision

Disciplinary types that cause Goodtime Forfeiture

- ◇ 01 Major Disciplinarys
- ◇ 07 Good Credit Loss
- ◇ 08 Administrative Resolution

After all convictions have a completion date calculated, the inmate’s release date is the greatest of these dates.
