### **AGENCY'S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS**

#### 1. Agency Accomplishments and Significant Events in FY2023

The South Carolina Department of Disabilities and Special Needs (DDSN) has experienced significant change during FY2023. Of initial note is the resignation of our State Director in January 2023 followed by the appointment of our General Counsel to the Interim State Director role. In addition, DDSN continues to work with other state agencies, including the South Carolina Department of Health and Human Services (SCDHHS), on providing services and supports to DDSN-eligible individuals with complex needs while also focusing on increased oversight and regulation of DDSN-contracted providers throughout the state. Multiple audits and assessments of DDSN were initiated or in process in FY2023, as outlined below, but DDSN has continued to focus on ensuring those eligible for DDSN services are supported. DDSN continues to plan, develop, coordinate, and fund services for residents with various severe, lifelong disabilities, and we are pleased to highlight the following accomplishments and significant events from FY2023.

#### A. Resignation of State Director and Appointment of Interim State Director

In late December 2022, former DDSN State Director Dr. Michelle Fry informed the Commission on Disabilities and Special Needs (DSN) of her resignation, effective January 5, 2023. On January 4, 2023, the Commission on DSN appointed DDSN General Counsel Constance Holloway as the Interim State Director. Constance Holloway's transition was aided by her previous experience as Interim State Director in 2021 for approximately seven (7) months. At the July 20, 2023, Commission on DSN meeting, Constance Holloway was appointed State Director. Of additional note, all executive staff members have remained in place throughout this transition period and there was no interruption to DDSN operations.

#### B. Ending of Federal Public Health Emergency in May 2023

The announcement of the unwinding of the federal public health emergency flexibilities related to COVID-19 during FY2023 has presented challenges for DDSN. These changes mean:

- DDSN is reviewing and revising policies related to the public health emergency,
- DDSN is addressing the unwinding of Appendix K flexibilities to DDSN-operated waiver services that were implemented as part of the public health emergency in coordination with SCDHHS,
- DDSN is working with SCDHHS on Medicaid eligibility, as paused disenrollment of individuals eligible for Medicaid is ending with the unwinding of the public health emergency, and
- DDSN is unwinding vaccine mandates and policy based on the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) final rule withdrawal that required staff at DDSN's Regional Centers to have COVID-19 vaccinations.

#### C. DDSN-Operated Waiver Renewals and Amendments

DDSN, in coordination with SCDHHS, worked during FY2023 on Intellectual Disability/Related Disability (ID/RD), Community Supports (CS), and Head and Spinal Cord Injury (HASCI) waiver renewals and amendments. Significant changes are noted below:

- For the ID/RD waiver, rates for services were raised and there were collapses of separate personal care and nursing services into one category for each.
- For the CS waiver, rates for services were raised, personal care services were combined, and there were updates on the policy for payment to relative and legal guardians for provision of care.
- For the HASCI waiver, rates for services were raised and some services were consolidated to improve service flexibility.

#### D. Legislative Audit Council (LAC) Part 1 Report on DDSN

An audit of DDSN was requested by the South Carolina Legislature in 2021. The LAC completed and finalized Part 1 of their report on DDSN in March 2023. The review period for Part 1 was 2021 to 2022, and the report outlined recommendations as they relate to governance of DDSN. DDSN has been working with our current Commission on DSN to implement recommendations. Part 2 of the LAC report draft was received by DDSN on September 12, 2023.

#### E. SCDHHS Annual Review of DDSN

As part of their administrative contract with DDSN, SCDHHS requested an annual review of the three (3) DDSN-operated waivers (ID/RD, CS, and HASCI waivers). This review was initiated in April 2023 and DDSN documents were submitted to SCDHHS on June 1, 2023. DDSN is awaiting next steps from SCDHHS to continue and complete the requested annual review.

#### F. State Fiscal Accountability Authority (SFAA) Exemption and Provider Qualifications

FY2023 has presented challenges in service delivery for those that are eligible for DDSN services. There are shortages with regards to providers offering different services, as well as staffing within current contracted providers. In order to both minimize the burden on recruiting and qualifying providers to serve those eligible for DDSN services, DDSN requested an exemption to the South Carolina State Procurement Code of Laws through SFAA, which was approved in March 2023. DDSN has been diligently working to implement policy changes and to streamline the provider qualification process. DDSN expects to implement the new provider qualification process in early FY2024.

#### G. DDSN-Eligible Individuals with Complex Needs

During FY2023, DDSN saw an unprecedented increase in the number of South Carolinians eligible for the agency's services who presented to DDSN with extremely complex needs and in dire situations. Examples include, but are not limited to:

- Children with autism spectrum disorder (ASD) and other co-occurring conditions who are unable to receive needed services in their homes and communities, which leaves families unable to continue to support them,
- Adults and children with co-occurring disabilities who are incarcerated, not competent
  to stand trial, and who continue to display behaviors that are unsafe to others,
  especially other vulnerable adults or children, and
- Adults with disabilities being admitted to hospitals from various locations with prior home or community-based caregivers refusing to continue care post-discharge.

DDSN has implemented strategies to, in-part, address the immediate needs of those who have presented. For example, DDSN hired six (6) state level case managers in FY2023 to help coordinate these cases and will look to hire additional staff in FY2024. Additionally, DDSN is seeking best practice standards to better address such needs and will work to implement strategies in FY2024 and beyond that better equip families to prevent situations from becoming dire.

#### H. CMS site visit and HCBS implementation

The Home and Community-Based Services (HCBS) Settings Regulation implementation has been underway for a number of years. All settings in South Carolina where HCBS are delivered, including DDSN-supported residential and day services settings, have been reviewed. To date, 99% of the settings have been determined by the state to be compliant with the Regulation. As part of the verification of compliance, CMS conducted an in-state visit of eight (8) settings that deliver either DDSN-supported residential or day services in January 2023. The state received a report of the visit in April 2023 and a response to the report was provided to CMS in May 2023. Additional site visits were conducted by SCDHHS in FY2024, and results are pending.

#### I. Information Technology (IT)

DDSN is focused on continuing its efforts to enhance both its technology and security landscape. FY2023 accomplishments are itemized below:

- Technology Refresh: DDSN IT continues its on-going assessments on all technology infrastructure. IT continues to replace technology that is outdated.
- Automation: DDSN IT is currently working to improve its office automation efforts. IT is working with various departments to help automate manual processes. During FY2023, DDSN IT completed the following automations projects:

- Vocational Rehabilitation Transition, which tracks individuals transitioning out of high school to workforce,
- Fleet Management, which provides electronic vehicle reservation, trip log and automation of task and reporting, and
- Employee Performance Management System (EPMS) Automation, which automated the performance review process and created an electronic system to replace a manual one.
- Digitizing: DDSN is expanding its Electronic Document Management System capabilities and started the discovery process to determine the needs of the various DDSN departments in FY2023. Several divisions, including Eligibility, Clinical Services, Internal Audit, and Quality Management, began the document scanning process in FY2023.
- Website Redevelopment: DDSN implemented a new website in FY2023. Communications and IT will continue working with DDSN programs to enhance and update the new website.
- Contract Management System: DDSN IT started working on procurement of an electronic contract management system in FY2023 and is waiting for the vendor to provide a project start date.
- Endpoint protection: DDSN security and IT completed implementation of Microsoft Endpoint Protection in FY2023.

#### 2. Current Efforts and Future Plans

While DDSN acknowledges that the above Items A-H are ongoing and will continue in the current fiscal year, DDSN would also like to highlight some current efforts outside of these significant events that will continue into FY2024.

#### A. Agency Strategic Planning

DDSN began the strategic planning process during FY2023 with a contracted vendor. Using the Charting the LifeCourse framework, DDSN has ensured a person-centered approach to strategic planning. Data collection focused on persons supported by DDSN, their families, contracted providers, partner state agencies, advocacy organizations, and other groups DDSN works closely with throughout the state. The drafted plan was released for public comment in early FY2024, and DDSN will continue to finalize the plan and associated goals and objectives with our vendor.

B. Conversion of Other Services to Fee-For-Service (FFS)/Direct Billing
As a reminder, DDSN, in coordination with SCDHHS, implemented FFS and Direct Billing for
waiver services during FY2022. DDSN is diligently working with SCDHHS on conversion of other
services to this payment model, with a current focus on the Intermediate Care Facilities for
Individuals with Intellectual Disabilities (ICF/IID) service.

#### C. Level of Need Assessment

DDSN has been working with an external vendor in FY2023 to identify level of need assessment tools, recommend a tool for use by DDSN, and develop a pilot project to test the efficacy of the tool in individuals eligible for DDSN services and supported residentially. FY2024 will involve solicitation of a vendor to implement the pilot project, which is near finalization. The intended use of the assessment tool is to better align dollars with services needed, and DDSN will work closely with SCDHHS throughout pilot implementation.


#### 3. Risk Assessment and Mitigation Strategies


The biggest risks to services provided by DDSN are shortages in providers willing to serve individuals eligible for DDSN services, especially those with complex needs, and workforce shortages in the human services industry. DDSN recommends:

- Continued interagency collaborations that are solution-based to ensure individuals eligible
  for services from multiple agencies receive those necessary services in a coordinated
  manner,
- Supporting efforts statewide to recruit and retain direct support personnel to ensure necessary services can continue to be delivered in home and community-based settings, and
- Developing ways to individualize services and service delivery to all who DDSN supports.



# **AGENCY ORGANIZATIONAL CHART**







