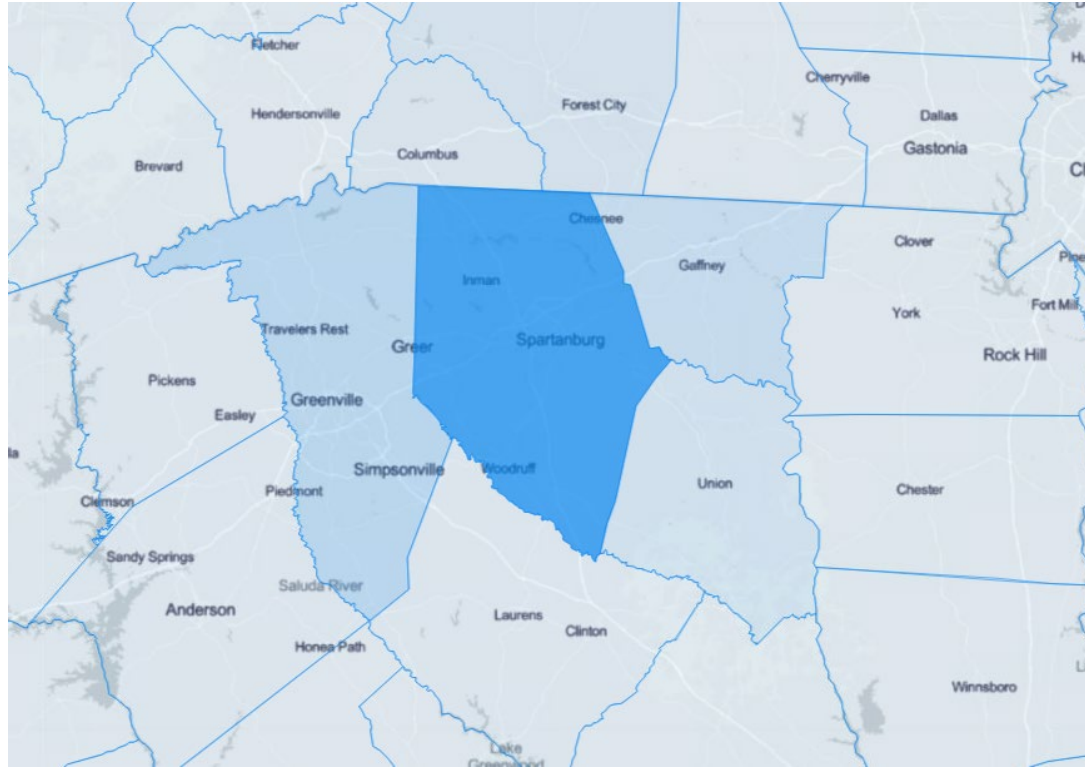

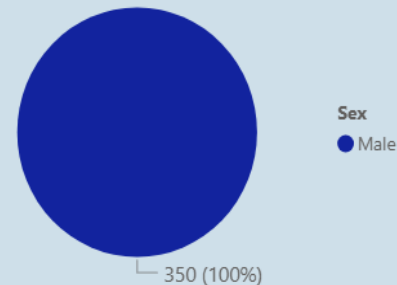

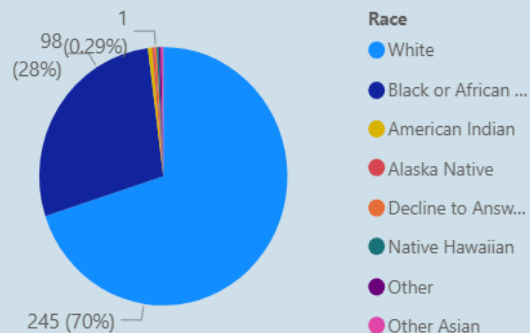

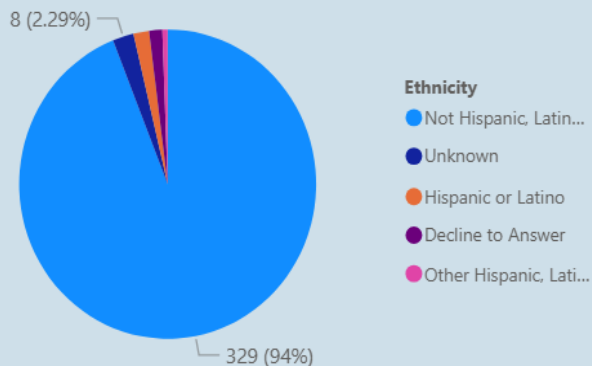
Patients by Sex



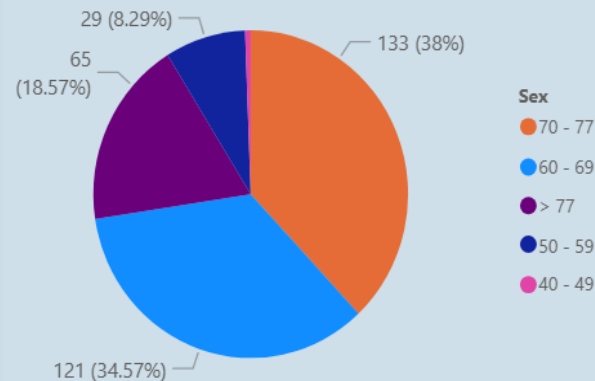
Patients by Race



Patients by Ethnicity

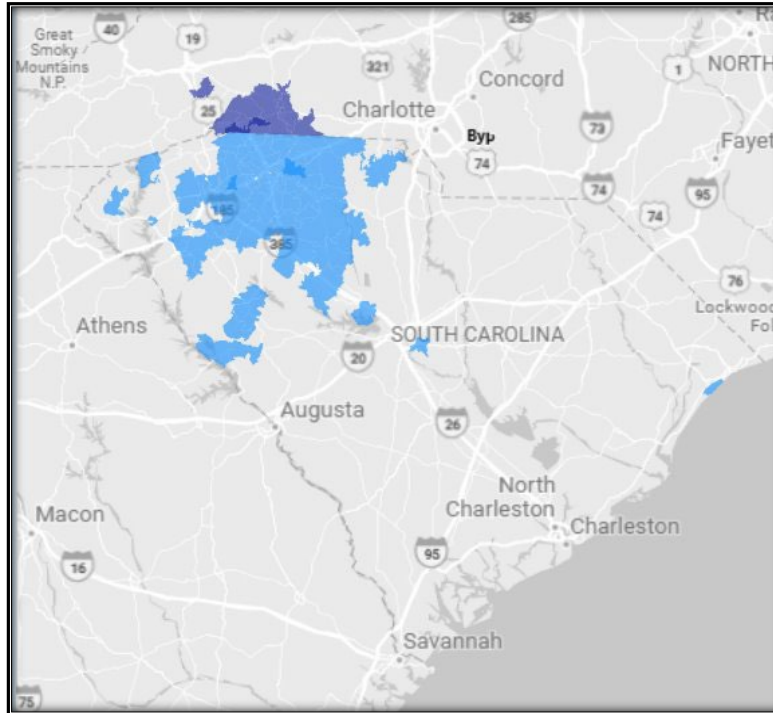

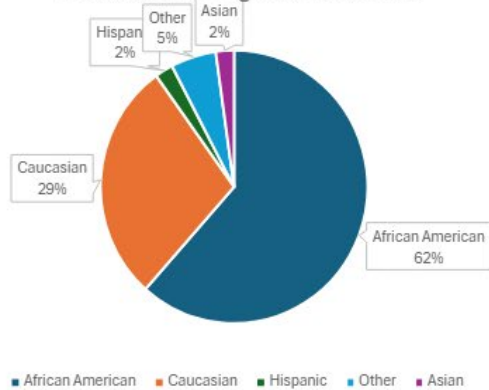

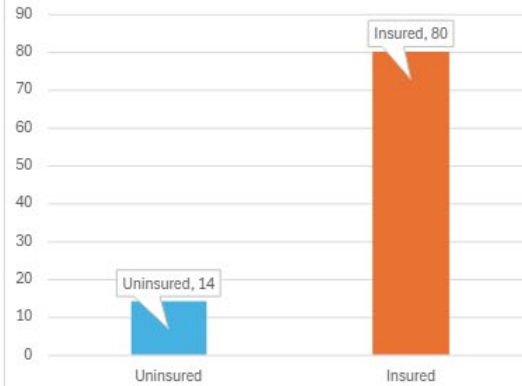

2024 and YTD 2025 Prostate Screening Data

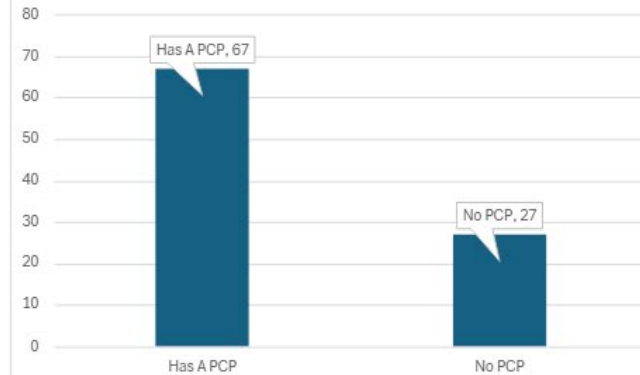
Prostate Screening Race Data 2024



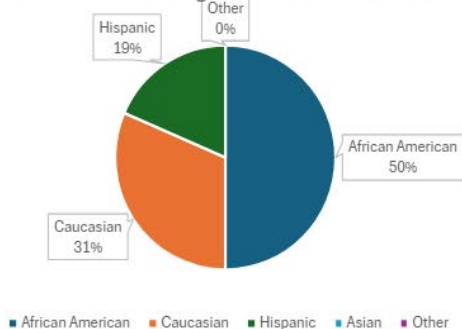
Prostate Screening Insurance Data 2024



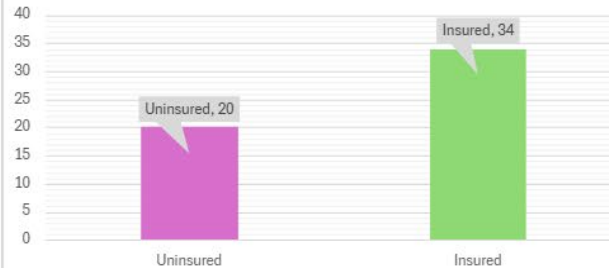
Prostate Screening PCP Data 2024



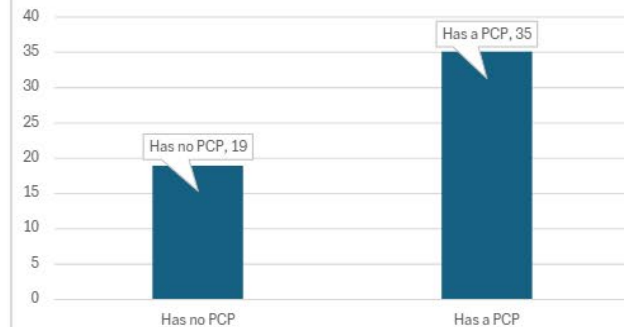

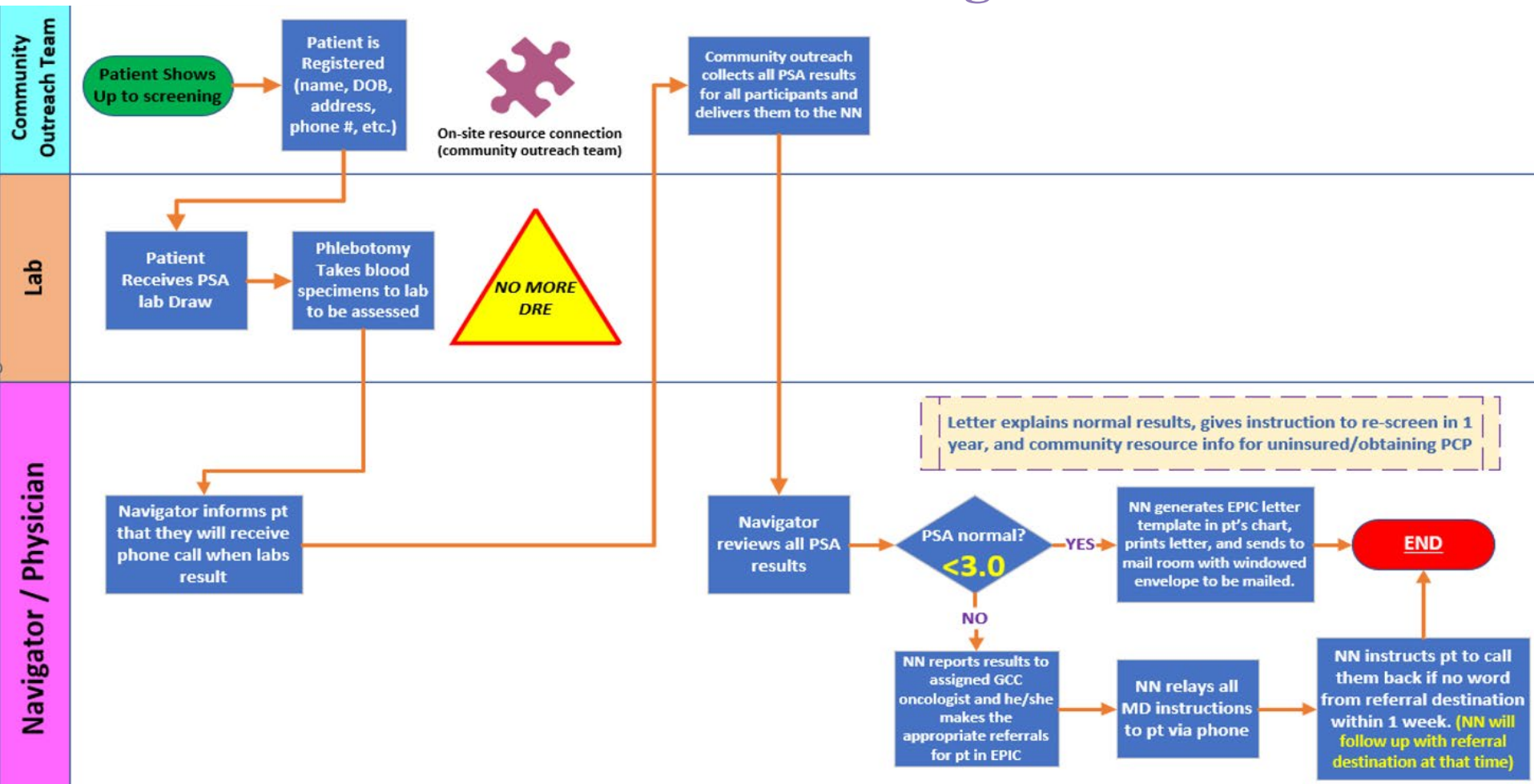
