(b) Guggenheim Partners (2015 –2018) - Vice President, Power & Utilities - Part of the investment banking and capital markets arm of Guggenheim Partners (~\$300bn AUM), the research team provides differentiated macro/industry insight and fundamental asset-level analysis to formulate investment decisions.

- a. Formulated industry thesis, as well as viewpoints on trends such as consolidation, alternative financing structures, environmental policy, and growth opportunities across the energy and utility value chain.
- b. Applied various valuation methodologies as appropriate (e.g., discounted cash flow for IPPs, dividend discount for yield vehicles, and relative to forward yield expectations for regulated utilities that act as bond surrogates).

- c. Built Guggenheim's Levelized Cost of Energy model to compare the economics of various thermal and renewable generation technologies.
- d. Managed relationships with investors, management teams, state and federal utility regulators, and other industry contacts; disseminating information and/or facilitating conversations where appropriate (e.g., between regulators and investors with vested interests).
