The only financial arrangement I can recall that could pose a potential conflict of interest was a deal brokered by Jeremy Lee f Right of Way Services on May 20, 2010 for the sale of 0.01 of an acre of my property at 9565 Sullivan Drive Murrells Inlet, SC I sold to SCDOT for the expansion of Highway 707. This transaction was completed and filed in the Horry County Courthouse and would have no further bearing in my position as a Public Service Commissioner for the 7th district.

Amended Response (3/25/20):

In my original response to this question, I answered "No" as I had forgotten an issue I had with a couple that rented property from me back around 2011. I rented my house off Sullivan Drive in Murrells Inlet to a couple, Matthew and Michelle Taylor, on the recommendation of a dear friend of my current wife. The story I got from the friend was that this family was being evicted from their home due to the owner taking the rental payments but not paying the mortgage and as such the house was in foreclosure and they desperately needed a place to stay. I was assured that this couple was of sound financials and of the upmost integrity and based on those recommendations I placed them in my rental house under an opened ended rental contract. At first, everything was fine, they seemed nice enough and the rental payments were on time. Within approximately 6 months, the rental payments started to become late, then later and sometimes not at all. This progressed and I kept giving the couple the benefit of the doubt allowing them to pay when they could as there always seemed to be some sort of excuse for the late payment or later no payment. Finally, in 2012 I decided to evict them and filed a Rule to Vacate on 10/22/2012 in the magistrate's court of Surfside Beach. The couple pleaded with me and made restitution for some of the owed monies and I withdrew the eviction notice. They were good again for a few months and then it started again with late payments and again I filed a Rule to Vacate on 1/25/2013 with the magistrate. This time they were evicted and I filed a summons with the Magistrate to recover the monies I had spent over the course of their rental history. Judge Blanton ruled in my favor and ordered the Taylors to pay \$6,606.93 to me and I worked out a payment plan with Mr Taylor with the blessing of the court. By now, the Taylors

had moved and I had no idea where they had gone. Mr. Taylor never paid any of the money owed to me and finally on 10/23/2014 I filed a judgement against them for the money owed plus the interest dictated by Judge Blanton with the Horry County Courthouse. To date I hold this debt as unrecoverable as I do not believe I will ever see any of the money owed.

public as a volunteer EMT. I received my continuing education through an in-house EMT program with the City of Myrtle Beach Fire Department until 2009.
