

## MEMBER APPROPRIATION REQUESTS 2023-2024

PROJECT	FUNDING REQUEST
Ray W. Hopkins Senior Center  Mauldin is in the process of making various repairs and improvements to the City's Senior Center in order to continue serving a large population of area seniors. Additionally, more is needed and the City is seeking assistance to repair the roof, multipurpose court, walking trail, ADA bathroom conversion, and other facility amenities to allow it to continue to serve residents and visitors for years to come. The Ray W. Hopkins Senior Center serves nearly 3,000 area senior visitors on a monthly basis.	\$250,000
Total Project Costs - \$500,000 (\$250k City of Mauldin + \$250k State of SC)	
Mauldin Multi-Purpose Trail  The City is in the process of completing the installation of a multi-purpose trail connecting Bridgeway Station to E. Butler Road. As part of this project the City is requesting assistance with additional safety devices and equipment for the bike and pedestrian trail, stormwater improvements, and trailhead improvements. This trail segment will connect to the Swamp Rabbit Trail in the near future.	\$250,000
Total Project Costs - \$500,000 (\$250k City of Mauldin + 250k State of SC)  Mauldin Fire Station	
Mauldin is seeking assistance to upgrade the departments Cascade System, purchase and install a new washer/extractor for turnout gear, Miller Station generator, and make other facility repairs and improvements at its four existing fire stations.  Total Project Costs - \$450,000 (\$200,000 City of Mauldin + \$250,000 State of SC)	\$250,000
Mauklin Sewer System Repairs  Over the last few years, Mauldin has begun making significant repairs to its sewer system. The City desires to reline up to 13 miles of sewer lines in Basin 14 and RG2. The City seeks assistance with these projects and is dedicating resources in the current and future budgets to accomplish these vital task. These repairs will extend the life of the current lines and improve system efficiency.	\$500,000
Total Project Costs - \$1.1 million (\$600k City of Mauldin + \$500k State of SC)  Mauldin Sidewalk Safety Improvements  The City is in the process of making various improvements to sidewalks throughout the community including along Jenkins Court and Miller Road. These improvements will allow residents and visitors to walk to schools, shopping, and more. The City has committed considerable time and resources to the development of these areas, especially Jenkins Court which will serve as the City's new downtown commercial hub. This City is now asking for additional support to complete the Jenkins Court road and sidewalk improvements, and improve the safety of Miller Road to allow high school students to walk safely to school each day.	\$1,000,000
