H. 3322 -- Reps. Bannister and Nanney: A BILL TO AMEND SECTION 12-54-122, CODE OF LAWS OF SOUTH CAROLINA, 1976, RELATING TO TAX LIENS, SO AS TO ALLOW THE DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE TO FILE TAX LIENS VALIDLY BY IMPLEMENTING AN INTERNET ACCESSIBLE NOTICE SYSTEM, AND TO CREATE THE ELECTRONIC TAX LIEN OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE.

Summary of Bill:

This bill establishes an Electronic Tax Lien Oversight Committee in conjunction with providing the Department of Revenue the ability to implement an online or electronic public system of filing and indexing tax liens. The Oversight Committee is comprised of nine members appointed by the Governor including the Secretary of State as Chairman. The other members should be stipulated as follows; register of deeds in a county with a population over 100K; register of deeds in a county with a population greater than 33K; register of deeds in a county with a population less than 33K; three abstractors from three separate counties; title company representative; an attorney with SC Bar good standing.

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TO AMEND SECTION 12-54-122, CODE OF LAWS OF SOUTH CAROLINA, 1976, RELATING TO TAX LIENS, SO AS TO 12 13 ALLOW THE DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE TO FILE TAX 14 LIENS VALIDLY BY IMPLEMENTING AN INTERNET 15 ACCESSIBLE NOTICE SYSTEM, AND TO CREATE THE 16 ELECTRONIC TAX LIEN OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE.

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18 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of South 19 Carolina:

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SECTION 1. Section 12-54-122(G) of the 1976 Code is amended 22 by adding an appropriately numbered item at the end to read:

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"()(a) Instead of or in addition to the filing of the tax lien notice 25 pursuant to item (1), the department may implement a system of 26 filing and indexing liens which must be accessible to the public over 27 the Internet or through other means as the department considers 28 appropriate. The liens filed pursuant to this item are effective 29 statewide from the date and time they are recorded and encumber all 30 the taxpayer's property and rights to property as provided in Section 31 12-54-120, regardless of the property's location. Liens filed under 32 item (1) continue to be effective from the date and time they were 33 recorded. Nothing in this item may be construed so as to extend the 34 effectiveness of the lien beyond ten years from the date of filing, as 35 provided in Section 12-54-120.

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- (b) There is established the Electronic Tax Lien Oversight 37 Committee to ensure tax liens are electronically filed and indexed accurately. Within thirty days of the effective date, the Governor shall appoint the following nine members:
 - (i) Secretary of State, who shall serve as chairman;
- (ii) the register of deeds of a county with a population over 42 one hundred thousand;

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1	(iii) the register of deeds of a county with a population
2	greater than thirty-three thousand but less than one hundred
3	thousand;
4	(iv) the register of deeds of a county with a population less
5	than thirty-three thousand;
6	(v) three abstractors representing three different counties;
7	(vi) one person representing a title company; and
8	(vii) one attorney in good standing with the South Carolina
9	Bar.
10	The oversight committee members are entitled to mileage,
11	subsistence, and per diem as authorized by law for members of
12	boards, committees, and commissions while in the performance of
13	the duties for which appointed."
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15	SECTION 2. This act takes effect July 1, 2015.
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
