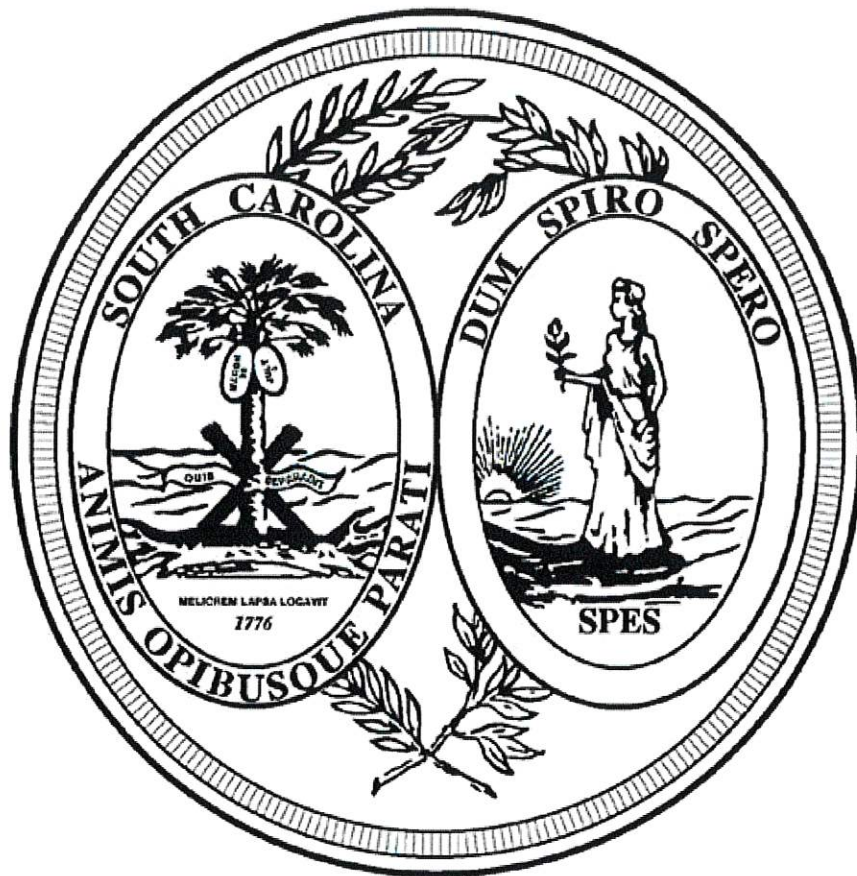

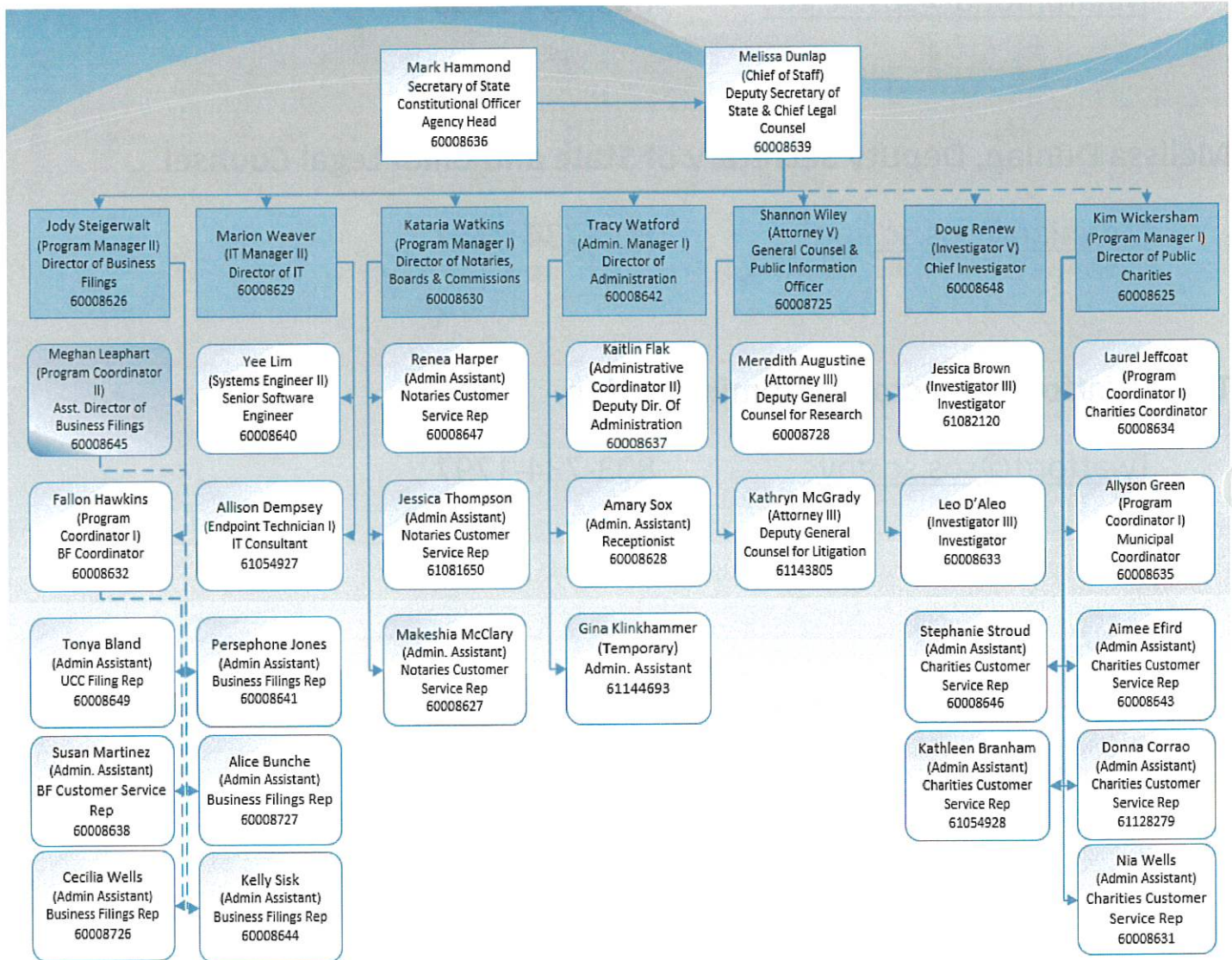

Secretary of State's Office Mission Statement

The mission of the Secretary of State's Office is to provide innovative technology to enhance the transaction of business in the state, to serve the business community and members of the public with prompt and efficient customer service, to protect the charitable donors of South Carolina, and to fulfill all other statutory duties of the office.

Budget Request Summary

I. General Funds Appropriations Salary Increase – \$100,000

- The Secretary of State's Office is appropriated State funding for 18 full-time equivalent positions. However, with current appropriations, the agency is only able to fully fund 14 of those 18 full-time equivalent positions. The agency must supplement 4 positions with other funds.
- The \$100,000 increase would allow the agency to provide the necessary funding for the remaining 4 FTEs.

II. Other Funds Authorization Increase - \$95,000

- The office is seeking an increase of \$95,000 in spending authority to be spread throughout the programs in the agency.
 - Funds would be used for further enhancement of our free Give Smart SC mobile app (available for Apple and Android devices) that provides convenient, immediate information on charitable organizations registered with the Secretary of State's Office including registration verification, financial reports and percentage of charitable donations dedicated to program services. The enhancements include the ability to submit a complaint to the Secretary of State's Office for investigation directly through the Give Smart SC App.
 - Funds would also support a new Point-of-Sale system for walk-in customers, to allow them to pay by credit card.
 - In addition, this funding would provide the necessary technology and equipment required for the agency to meet the goals of maintaining critical IT storage for permanent state records, and to fulfill the statutorily mandated duties of the office.
 - An increase in operating funds will help offset the consistently increasing cost of postage rates.

III. Other Funds Retirement, Health, and Pay Allocation - \$90,322

- The requested funding would support all divisions of the agency which are staffed by employees whose compensation is supported by other funds. Therefore, all goals and strategies the office seeks to meet would be impacted by the fulfillment of this funding request.
- The Secretary of State's Office has 16 FTEs supported by other funds. This funding request would support the Pay Plan Allocation in FY23-24. With increasing rates, the Secretary of State's Office needs an increase in its other funds authorization in retirement, health, and dental to cover the employer portion.

Secretary of State's Office Accountability Report

Fiscal Year 2022-2023

- In FY 2022-23, the Secretary of State returned over \$13,500,000.00 to the State General Fund, while receiving state appropriations of only \$1,280,600.
- The Secretary of State's Office is integral in the transaction of business in the state and the duties of the office are mandated by statute.
- Failing to accomplish our goals and objectives would have a detrimental impact on business and the economy in South Carolina.
- The customers we serve include individual members of the public, business entities, nonprofits, charitable organizations, lending institutions, the legal community, accountants, state agencies, and members of the legislative and executive branches of government.

Accountability Report Highlights

- In FY 2022-23, a record number of over 17,000 charitable organizations registered or filed annual applications for registration exemption with the Secretary of State's Division of Public Charities. Of these registration filings, almost 83% were filed using the Secretary of State's Online Charities System.
- The Charities Division also filed 3,786 professional fundraiser registrations, fundraising contracts, and joint financial reports.
- The Secretary of State's Office collected \$654,670 in fine revenue for violations of the Solicitation of Charitable Fund Act in FY 2022-23. Of this amount, \$454,670 was returned to the General Fund. This was the highest amount of fine revenue collected by the office in a fiscal year.
- Over 454 charity complaints were received, which is the highest number ever received in a fiscal year. 157 of those complaints were submitted online through the agency's website.
- The agency processed over 597,300 total filings in FY 2022-23.
- Over 507,000 corporate and UCC filings were filed with the agency.
- In FY 2022-23, the Secretary of State commissioned 17,114 notaries public. As of June 30, 2023, there were over 155,000 commissioned notaries public in South Carolina. Notaries public play an important role in the prevention of fraud.
- In FY 2022-23, the Secretary of State's IT Division developed and launched a system to allow for the registration of electronic notaries public pursuant to the South Carolina Electronic Notary Public Act. In FY 2022-23, the Secretary of State registered 65 electronic notaries public.
- In FY 2022-23, the Secretary of State's Office opened 35 counterfeit investigations, and participated in investigations which led to 8 arrests, 17 cease-and-desist orders, and the seizure of \$20,762,060 in counterfeit merchandise. As a result of the efforts from the Secretary of State's Office working with the US Department of Homeland Security, the Investigations Division was able to assist with the interception of \$884,560 in counterfeit goods before they were circulated in South Carolina.
- In FY 2022-23, the Secretary of State's Information Technology Division developed and launched the Online Electronic Notary Portal. The portal's API (application programming interface) allows electronic notary solutions providers to systematically send images of seals and signatures through the API. This process reduces 95% of the internal staff manual processing time, and eliminates 100% of the manual processing time for online solution providers.

The agency is requesting an increase in the amount of \$100,000.00 in State appropriations in order to fully fund the 18 FTE's appropriated by the General Fund.</p>

ACCOUNTABILITY OF FUNDS	<p>The requested funding from other funds will assist in mitigating the rising operating expenses. In the previous fiscal year, the Secretary of State's Office incurred an expenditure of approximately \$143,000 on postage alone. The postage expense applies to all divisions within the agency. The cost of postage rates has been consistently increasing, along with the expenses associated with running the agency. To enhance customer service for walk-in customers, the Secretary of State's Office is looking to provide a point-of-sale system. An increase in other operating funds would also provide funding for agency projects throughout the agency.</p> <p>Multiple divisions in the agency would be impacted with this funding and would assist the agency in meeting all of its strategic goals.</p>

JUSTIFICATION OF REQUEST	The Secretary of State's Office returned \$13.6 million to the State General Fund last year. However, the agency continues to have increases in general operating expenses that are beyond its control. As a result, the office is requesting an increase in spending authority to help with those costs, including postage expenses. In addition, an increase in spending authority would assist with providing a point-of-sale system for customers that prefer to conduct business in person at the office. Currently those customers are required to pay for services either by check, money order, or cash. An increase of \$95,000.00 in operating would also provide funding for other agency projects.

The 3% possible future cut would require moving a State-funded position to an other-funded position. It would also prevent the office from filling any positions that become vacant. This reduction in staff would impact the agency's ability to serve customers.

The Secretary of State's Office continues to reduce costs to taxpayers by working with the state portal, Tyler Technology, to provide online filing applications to our customers, such as the Uniform Commercial Code (UCC) and Business Filings Online applications. No multi-million dollar capital requests were made for either projects; thus, the services were provided at no cost to the taxpayers. During FY 2024-25, the office will continue to work with Tyler Technologies to expand the online filing options on the Business Filings, Search and Document Retrieval application and make necessary upgrades to the UCC Online Search and Filing application. The Secretary of State's Office is an integral part of conducting business in the State and constantly works to provide customers the best possible online solutions while saving taxpayers money.

SUMMARY	<p>The Secretary of State no longer administers the Securities Division; therefore the office formally began the process of repealing regulations 113-1 through 113-26 in March of 2016. The regulations were repealed effective May 26, 2017. There are no other regulations needing to be repealed at this time.</p> <p>The Secretary of State's Office filing fees are set by the General Assembly and cannot be reduced by the office. Additionally, most fees collected by the agency have not been increased for several decades and therefore have not maintained pace with inflation. The Secretary of State's Office returned just over \$13.6 million to the General Fund in FY 2022-23 for fees collected through providing services mandated by statute.</p>
