

South Carolina Judicial Branch FY25-26 Budget Request Summary

Recurring Funds:

Priority 1: Judicial Systems Enhancements

Recurring - \$4,225,000

The Judicial Branch proposes the following series of enhancements to improve the State's justice system.

- Family Court Judges and staff: Due to dramatic increases in population and filings in Family Court in the ninth, eleventh and fourteen circuits, SCJB is requesting three new family court judge positions. The Branch is requesting nine (9) FTEs for the additional judges and staff.
- Change to Reactivated Judges compensation: Reactivated Judges are used to keep pace with increased filings and number of terms of courts. Currently, the law mandates a retired judge work three consecutive months in order to receive compensation, and then the retired judge only receives the differential between retirement pay and active pay. SCJB proposes \$400 a day for retired experienced judges (equates to \$50 per hour). Rather than a change to the current statute, we propose a proviso that would allow SCJB to pilot this change in order to gather data regarding court terms and case dispositions.
- Chief Administrative Judge Allowance: The assignment by the Chief Justice to circuit and family court judges to serve as a "Chief Administrative Judge" (CAJ) carries substantial responsibilities, far beyond the traditional judicial function of adjudicating cases and controversies. SCJB requests a \$1,000 monthly allowance for each Chief Administrative Circuit Court and Family Court Judge in recognition of the increased duties, such managing increasingly complex dockets and caseloads; as holding status conferences with SCDJJ, SCDSS and solicitors in order to develop trial rosters; work with county clerks of court to, resolve any administrative problems; and to do any additional work that may be required by the Chief Justice.
- Increase of \$500 per month for judicial expenses: The last increase for judicial expenses was in 2018. Due to inflation and other cost increases, SCJB is asking for an increase of \$500 per month bringing the total judicial expense provided to each judge to \$1,500 per month (reduced once taxes are taken out).

Priority 2: Attorney and Staff Retention

Recurring - \$1,000,000

SCJB requests additional recurring funds to increase the starting salary for law clerks and staff attorneys in
order to reduce turnover and remain competitive with other state agencies, public defenders', and solicitors'
offices.

Priority 3: Office of Disciplinary Counsel Staff (ODC)

Recurring - \$725,000

• Case filings for judicial misconduct have increased from 1,300 prior to 2020 to 2,055 in 2024. ODC is seeking an additional seven (7) FTEs in order to keep up with the increased caseload and complex investigations.

Priority 4: Family Court Case Management System

Recurring - \$3,000,000

- Effective 2025, SCJB is required to assume operational and financial responsibility for the current South Carolina Family Court Case Management System currently operated by SCDSS pursuant to the timeline set forth under <u>South Carolina Department of Services</u>, <u>South Carolina Judicial Department</u>, and <u>County Clerks</u> of <u>Court v. Hewlett-Packard Company et.al.</u>
- SCJB estimates this is the approximate cost currently incurred by SCDSS to maintain and upgrade the system each year.

Priority 6: Court Staff Interpreters

Recurring - \$0.00

- The Judicial Branch is requesting that five (5) interim FTE positions be made permanent for Court Staff Interpreters.
- Many courts have difficulty in securing Spanish interpreters. The Staff Court Interpreters are assigned throughout the state as needed for extended trials, and where local courts are able to schedule multiple hearings requiring a Spanish interpreter.
- These new resources have been instrumental in reducing backlog, and providing meaningful access to SC Courts for the Spanish population.

Non-Recurring Funds

Priority 5: Case Management System Modernization

Non- Recurring - \$45,000,000

• The SCJB is asking for \$45 million to accomplish a unified case management system modernization.

Proviso Requests

- Amend 57.3 Judicial Expense Allowance to increase allowance s from \$1,000 to \$1,500. See Priority 1 for justification.
- Add new Chief Administrative Judge Allowance to establish allowance of \$1,000 for CAJs. See Priority 1 for justification.
- Add new Reactive Judge Program to establish pay daily rate for Reactivated Judges. See Priority 1 for justification.
- Add new Across the Board Budget Reductions. Exempting the Judicial Branch from across the board reductions will allow the courts to meet South Carolina Constitutional mandates during budget downturns.
- Add new Judicial Branch Office Space Renovation. Previously, the Judicial Branch received Non-Recurring Appropriations for a new Court of Appeals Courtroom and to renovate office space. This proviso will allow the Judicial Branch to use the funds to renovate space in the Calhoun and Supreme Court buildings.
- Add new Travel Court. Allows the Chief Justice to provide reimbursement for actual expenses incurred for traveling terms of court of the Supreme Court and Court of Appeals.
- Delete 57.19 Circuit Court Judge. Requirement of S.C. Code of Law 14-5-130 was repealed by H.3776 causing Proviso 57.19 to become unnecessary.
