#### **AUTHORITY**

The South Carolina Sea Grant Consortium (<a href="www.scseagrant.org">www.scseagrant.org</a>), created as an independent state agency in 1978 through Act No. 643, Code of Laws of South Carolina, is charged with managing and administering the NOAA National Sea Grant College Program and similar programs for the state of South Carolina and regionally.


#### **PROGRAM PRIORITIES AND IMPACTS**
