ORGANIZATION SUMMARY

- Palmetto Poison Center (PPC) is the only poison control center for all of SC
- Nationally accredited by the American Association of Poison Control Centers
- Operates 24 hours a day, 7 days a week
- Pharmacists and nurses trained as specialists in poison information
- ∼31,000 human exposure incoming calls managed in 2022
- 53% of cases are exposures in children ≤ 18 years of age
- Poison Prevention Education
- Professional education in medical toxicology
- Public Health Surveillance
- Pharmacy student and medical resident education

SERVICES

Services are free of charge to all SC residents and health professionals 24/7/365

Provide treatment information via a toll-free hotline, 1-800-222-1222:

- Accidental and intentional ingestions of poisonous substances and medications
- Management of snake, spider, and marine envenomations
- Substance abuse and withdrawal
- Plant and mushroom ingestions
- Adverse drug effects
- Occupational exposures and biochemical disasters

Three board-certified medical toxicologists provide on call toxicology consults

Poison Prevention Education for the public

- Pediatric and Adult-Based Programs offered at the community level to include schools, daycare centers, head start programs, low-income housing developments, senior facilities, and neighborhood centers
- Partnerships with Safe Kids, DSS, Head Start, SC DHEC, SC School Nurse Association, and various faith-based organizations
- Pediatric population is targeted via direct programming initiatives and material distribution through pediatricians
- Media interviews, public service announcements, and social media campaigns

53% of calls involve poison exposures to children ≤ 18 years old


Total incoming call volume: 30,747 with an average of 2500 follow up calls/month

Toxicologists were consulted on over 500 cases


Total calls including follow-up calls: 60,747

COST SAVINGS

US PCCs save more than \$1.8 billion in medical costs and lost productivity annually

- Every \$1 of funding to PCCs saves an estimated \$13 in unnecessary health care costs
- Poison center usage decreases the hospital length of stay for patients requiring hospital admission by 10% for Medicaid beneficiaries
- ~14% decrease in likelihood of hospital admission if PCC contacted
- Over 90% of callers to the Palmetto Poison Center do not require referral to a health facility
