

Tab 3: Summary of Budget Requests

<u>Guardian ad litem Proviso Modification Request.</u> Also included in the FY 2020-21 budget, the FY 2021-22 budget proposes a modification of Proviso 41.2 to authorize a broader use of Guardian ad Litem Program's carryforward funds. Proviso 41.2 was promulgated prior to the Department of Children's Advocacy (DCA)'s effective date of July 1, 2019. In addition to administering the Guardian ad litem, Continuum of Care, and Foster Care Review Board divisions, DCA is charged with receiving, referring, monitoring, and investigating complaints regarding nine child-serving state agencies including DJJ and DSS critical incident notifications; establishing an objective system for reviewing and evaluating services by state agencies; and developing recommendations to the Governor, General Assembly and Children's Committee. The duties associated with investigating complaints, collaborating and coordinating with other agencies, and developing and promoting a broad vision of reform are associated with the goals of the Guardian ad litem Program, support the Program, and, like the GAL Program, provide advocacy, accountability and service for children. *See Tabs 5, 7 and 8*.

Continuum of Care. Based upon the July 29, 2020 approval of a Medicaid 1915(c) waiver regarding reimbursement for High Fidelity Wraparound, the FY 2021-22 budget *does not* propose a request for a budget increase for Continuum of Care. The FY 2020-21 budget proposed an increase of \$2,600,000 in recurring operating funding for Continuum of Care.



Tab 4: Accountability Report Highlights

<u>Guardian ad litem Program</u>: To recruit and retain staff to support Guardians ad Litem who advocate for abused and neglected children

<u>Continuum of Care</u>: To reduce youths' baseline crisis scores through intensive care coordination using the High Fidelity Wraparound model to support youth safely remaining and functioning in their homes, schools and communities

Foster Care Review Board: To provide legal advocacy for permanency for foster care children

Investigations Unit: To create and promote a coordinated online resource library for children and families

Broad Vision for Reform: To establish an objective system for reviewing and evaluating services provided by state agencies

Tab 6: Continuing Resolution Expense Mitigation

<u>Coordination with Other Agencies</u>: DSS's creation of a web-based portal and credentials for Investigations Unit to access DSS's records remotely without additional hardware or maintenance costs; Renegotiation with DSS regarding a Title IV(b) contract to avoid a request for additional state-allocated recurring funding to pay attorneys for Guardians ad Litem; Modification of a Title IV(b)/IV(e) contract with DSS concerning service delivery by Foster Care Review Board and Heart Gallery; Submission by HHS and approval by Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) of a 1915(c) Medicaid Waiver on July 29, 2020 provided a sustainable reimbursement rate for Continuum of Care's intensive care coordination; Admin's coordinated procurement of PPE

<u>Grants</u>: Partnered with S.C. Infant Mental Health (SCIMHA) for Safe Baby Courts grant; currently partnering with DMH and other agencies for submission of a SAMHSA grant regarding expansion and sustainability of children's mental health services

<u>**Travel**</u>: Reduced spending related to travel including continuing education seminars, per diem, hotel, mileage, and gasoline

Equipment and Technology: Modifications instead of replacement of Investigations Unit's case management system; Negotiation for WebEx subscription plan

Personnel: Intentionality regarding creating and filling positions

Leases: Review and assessment of consolidation and/or re-negotiation of leases for county office space

Supplies: Review of overall agency expenses to consider overlap and current/ongoing necessity

<u>Reimbursement</u>: CARES Act reimbursement requests



Tab 7: Proviso Modification Request

Proviso 41.2. (DCA: Guardian Ad Litem Program) Both the program and the funds appropriated to the Department of Children's Advocacy, Guardian ad Litem Program must be administered separately from other programs within the Department of Children's Advocacy and must be expended for the exclusive use of the Guardian ad Litem Program. For the current fiscal year, the Department of Revenue is directed to reduce the rate of interest paid on eligible refunds by two percentage points. The revenue resulting from this reduction must be used exclusively for operations of the Guardian ad Litem program and be deposited in the State Treasury in a separate and distinct fund known as the "South Carolina Guardian ad Litem Trust Fund." Unexpended revenues in this fund carry forward to succeeding fiscal years, and earnings in this fund must be credited to it. The Guardian ad Litem program may carry forward the other funds authorized herein for its operations from the prior fiscal year into the current fiscal year.

Fiscal Impact: Additional budget requests could be avoided if carry forward money is used in a less narrow sense. DCA requests authorization to pursue cost-sharing or cost-saving improvements to avoid duplication and to promote fiscal efficiency. DCA seeks authority to use the funds in a broader sense while maintaining the integrity of the funding to ensure that representation through court-appointed special advocates is not compromised.
