To ensure the availability and quality of a continuum of substance use services, thereby improving the health status, safety, and quality of life of individuals, families, and communities across South Carolina.




State Opioid Response Indicators – FFY 2020

- 1 48% of South Carolinians recall one or more messages of the Just Plain Killers campaign
- ↑ More than **25,000 lbs.** of unused prescription drugs disposed safely
- 1,820 **overdose reversals** by law enforcement or firefighters
- 13,481 **overdose prevention kits** distributed locally
- 1 4,529 patients receiving medical and clinical **treatment** for opioid use disorder
- 13,482 clients receiving **recovery**-support services




The year-over-year increase in all drug mortality slowed over the past two years; total drug overdose deaths increased 3% from 2018 to 2019, down from a 10% increase between 2017 and 2018



2020 Response to Suspected Opioid Overdose


