


WIOA Performance & State Plan Progress

PY 2020 Credential Attainment Rate








Budget Requests

Recurring Budget Request

Outreach/Referral Marketing

\$125,000

- Too many people not returning to the workplace:
 - Fear of catching COVID
 - Suffering effects of Long COVID
 - Burnout of medical staff
- Businesses are struggling to find and/or keep employees.
- National trend in decline in referrals for services. By regulation, federal funds cannot be used to promote the Agency, precluding the use of matching funds.
- Funds would be used in a multi-pronged awareness campaign to get citizens the help they need to either find or keep their job.



Non-recurring Budget Request

ADA Compliant Vehicle Replacement

\$520,000

- Current lift-equipped vans are 12 or more years old.
- Vans are used to transport consumers with disabilities.
- Vans are also part of the State Emergency Operations Plan to assist with the transportation of South Carolinians during a disaster or other emergency.
- Funds would be used to purchase 8 new ADA-compliant, wheelchair lift-equipped vans.
- Would ensure reliable transportation is available when needed.



Recurring Budget Request

Upgrade Data Circuits Services for All Offices

\$226,073

- Data circuits are currently configured for non-video intensive traffic.
 - Circuits get saturated resulting in dropped connections.
 - Video freezes during Zoom/Teams meetings.
- Slower circuits increases remote response time potentially opening up the Agency to cyber attacks.
- Zoom and other video-conferencing represents an overall cost savings for connecting with our 31 state-wide offices.
- Upgrading the circuits eliminates the need to replace 30+ aging servers.
- Amount requested represents the yearly charge from AT&T for data circuits services.



Non-recurring Budget Request

Replace Data Backup/Protection System

\$195,000

- Current data protection and backup system is almost 5 years old.
- Already starting to run low on storage space.
- Technology with the newer system is more efficient and allows for growth.
- Funding would replace both hardware and software and includes 3 years of support.



Non-recurring Budget Request

Replace Network Switches

\$74,250

- Current network switches run at a slower speed.
- Current network switches are at end of support from HP and security updates are no longer available.
- New switches run at a higher speed.
- Replacing the switches eliminates the need to replace 27 routers.
- New switches will enhance the ability to upgrade outdated phone systems at 27 of the Agency's offices



Non-recurring Budget Request – Capital Request Re-roof Berkeley Dorchester VR Center \$494,000

- Current roof is 29 years old and has exceeded life expectancy.
- Project was included in the 2021 CPIP submitted earlier this year for SFY 2023.
- New roof would cover approximately 21,450 square feet of roof deck with a new roofing system.
 - May require removal and disposal of asbestos-containing roofing and flashing materials.
 - Typically seek a 20 year warranty on roofing projects.



Non-recurring Budget Request – Capital Request

Re-roof Conway VR Center

\$540,000

- Current roof is 31 years old and has exceeded life expectancy.
- Project was included in the 2021 CPIP submitted earlier this year for SFY 2023.
- New roof would cover approximately 23,500 square feet of roof deck with a new roofing system.
 - May require removal and disposal of asbestos-containing roofing and flashing materials.
 - Typically seek a 20 year warranty on roofing projects.



Non-recurring Budget Request – Capital Request

Re-roof Rock Hill VR Center

\$604,000

- Current roof is 34 years old and has exceeded life expectancy.
- Project was included in the 2021 CPIP submitted earlier this year for SFY 2023.
- New roof would cover approximately 26,700 square feet of roof deck with a new roofing system.
 - May require removal and disposal of asbestos-containing roofing and flashing materials.
 - Typically seek a 20 year warranty on roofing projects.
