- Grew from grants from DHHS (ICARED grant)


#### Mission



#### Workforce Assistance

Statewide Loan Forgiveness Program:

- Includes all state-affiliated health professions schools:
  - MUSC
  - UofSC School of Medicine Columbia
  - UofSC School of Medicine Greenville
- Requires one year of practice for each year of support
  - 4 years for MD, 3 years for APRN and PA
- Primary care and critical need specialties

#### Rural Libraries and Health

**Purpose:** Support programs that build on the role of libraries as community hubs to connect people to healthcare and other supportive social services

#### Goals

- Expand access to healthcare and social services
- Improve health outcomes
- Build evidence to inform models of library engagement in health

Uses Community Health Workers, Social Workers, Telehealth

Close to 15,000 mesidents meached through Lee, Union, Kershaw, Orangeburg, and Charleston counties (remote locations) with screenings, meferrals to services, health education, and healthy food initiatives.

## Delivery System s

  - iCARE RFP

- Continued focus on behavioral health
  - Expand Tele-Psychiatry capabilities and reach
  - State Partnerships (HHS, DMH) to expand access and outcomes
- Expanded Mobile Health Unit Assistance
  - Inventory of Units, Services, and Scope
  - Technical Assistance and Enhancement (HHS)



## Workforce & Educational Support

- Flexibility in loan, scholarship, and inventive programs
  - Short, medium, and long-term plans for rural placements
  - Improved diversity in, opportunities for health professions education
- Partnerships with HBCUs, Technical College systems, USC Regional Colleges
  - Denmark Technical, USC-Salkehatchie, Claflin, SC State
- Developing programs for the next iteration of our health care workforce
  - Nurse midwives
  - Telehealth navigators
  - Mobile Unit certificates



## Com m unity Engagement

- Expand delivery of healthcare services via non-traditional access points

#### Rural Investment and Revitalization

#### Additional Funds Request

- \$1.25 Million in additional recurring funds
  - Rural Practice Support (iCARE), specifically Maternal/Child Health and Behavioral Health (\$1,000,000)
  - Mobile Health Unit Technical Assistance and Enhancement (250,000)

#### • One-time request -\$ 10 Million

- Statewide rural network enhancement and revitalization
- Support models of network development
  - Accountable Health Communities, AccessHealth, Others.
  - New reimbursement models
  - Delivery System coordination
  - Integration of public and community health
  - Population focused (SDoH)
- Provide administrative, practice support (and expansion)
- Integrate, coordinate existing programs
  - Telehealth implementation
  - Mobile Health Unit Deployment

- Previously passed by the House in 2021
- Continue the dedicated funding for our center, programs, communities
- Support the additions, edit made in 2021
