2024 STATE BUDGET REQUEST



The University of South Carolina's SFY2025 budget request prioritizes access and affordability, enhances research, improves health outcomes for South Carolinians and supports the growth of our state's economy.

Our request will allow for no tuition increases for in-state students for a record-setting sixth straight year on the Columbia campus—seventh year for system campuses—while also providing funds for improvements to academic spaces, increased investments in STEM areas and new initiatives that address regional USC system needs.

SELECT SYSTEM PROVISO REQUESTS

Educational Scholarships for In-State Students

This request benefits all South Carolina colleges and universities. Currently, state law caps educational fee waivers at 4% of the undergraduate student body. This request would allow, but not require, institutions to offer fee waivers to an additional 4% of the student body provided it is used exclusively to benefit in-state students.

Permanent Improvement Project Thresholds

This request benefits all South Carolina colleges and universities and increases the state's fixed "permanent improvement project" (PIP) dollar threshold that currently triggers the state's multi-phased, eight- step approval process before a campus project can begin. By increasing the threshold for PIP projects from \$5 million to \$6 million for research universities and from \$2 million to \$3 million for all other public institutions of higher learning including technical colleges, institutions can account for inflationary costs in construction and routine capital projects can be completed more quickly and more efficiently.

State Lottery Investment in USC Internship Pilot

This request allows USC to continue to use \$4.5 million in lottery appropriations for student internships in high demand fields important to the state's economy, including manufacturing, aerospace, health professions and STEM fields. Students receive \$3,000 stipends to support their internship participation, which benefits both to the student and sponsoring employer.

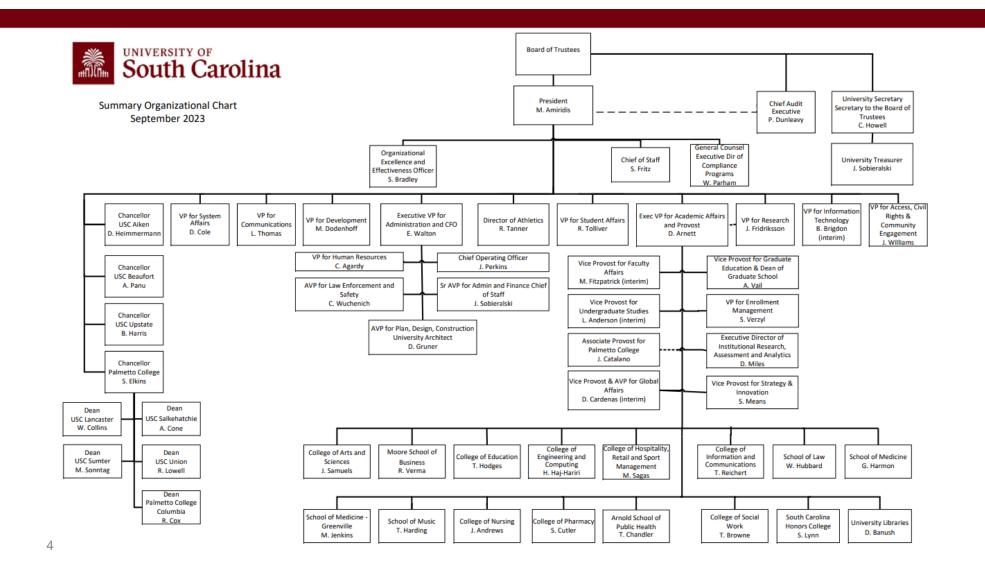

USC offers a **high-quality education at a reasonable cost**; U.S. News named USC a Best Value School (2023).

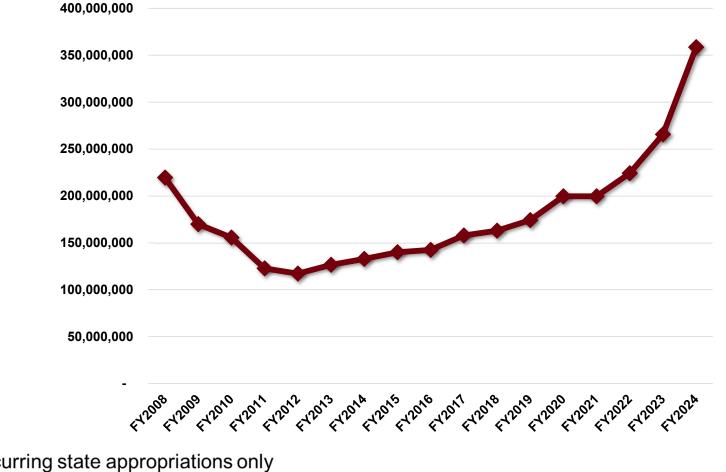




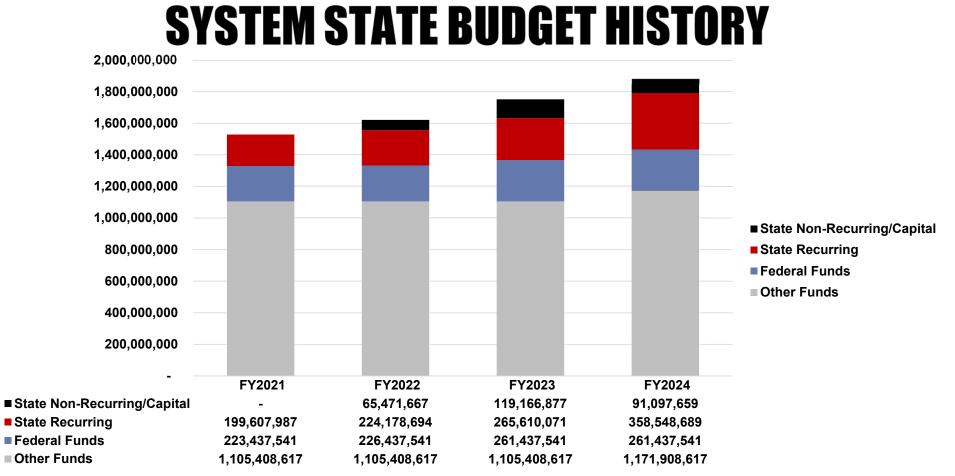

SYSTEM STATE APPROPRIATIONS

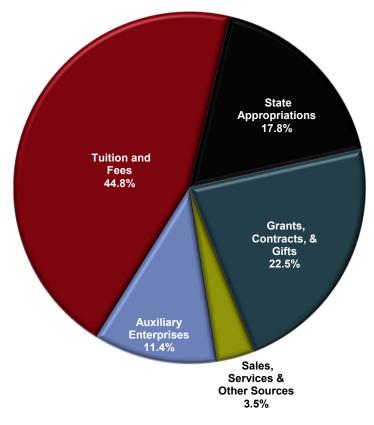

SYSTEM TOTAL CURRENT FUNDS

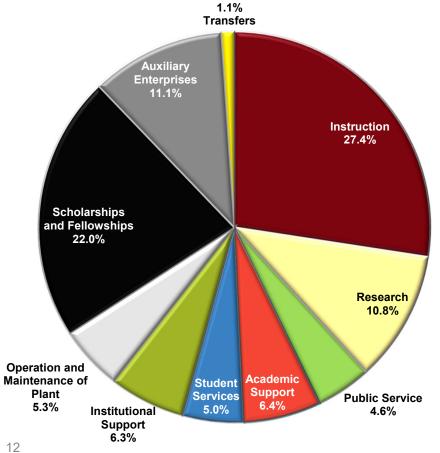


USC System Budget FY 2023-2024 Revenues

If necessary, the institutions could reduce costs in following ways for these major areas:

Academic Units

- Faculty and/or staff positions would go unfilled, adjuncts would be utilized less. Course offerings would be reduced, class sizes would increase.
- Academic programs would be reduced.

Service Units

 Staff positions would go unfilled in facilities, student affairs/success, and other support areas. Programs for student enrichment outside classroom would decrease.

Facilities, capital projects and maintenance

• Projects will be delayed, reduced in scope, or postponed.



REDUCING COST AND BURDEN TO BUSINESS AND CITIZENS

University of South Carolina System

- The University does not have regulations that pertain to business operations. Nor does the University have regulations that pertain to citizens in general. The University has taken steps over the last several years to assist students in obtaining a degree in a timely manner and to minimize the overall cost of obtaining a quality education.
- Providing a quality workforce to the businesses within the State is a vital aspect of continuous economic development. The savings to citizens and business of the state are incalculable.
- Highlights of a recent study found that USC has a total economic impact (all 8 campuses statewide) of approximately \$5.5 billion when measured in terms of annual state output. The system supports over 60,000 jobs statewide and returns \$219 million annually to the state in tax revenue.
- Palmetto College Online was designed to make Bachelors completion degrees more accessible and affordable for in-state place bound residents. The number of programs continues to grow each year thereby reducing the need for residents to choose the more expensive "for-profit" online college. Centralizing distance learning efforts for the USC System helps contain costs associated with program startup, marketing and admissions.
- The "On Your Time" initiative was designed to give students a greater opportunity to complete their degrees in less time and reduce overall tuition costs and loan debt. Research shows that the key driver of student debt is taking longer than 8 semesters to graduate. Since the creation of the "On Your Time" initiative, the four-year graduation rate has increased by 7 percentage points.
- System improvements include recent implementation of Banner which is an enterprise student information system. Key features include integrated admissions, financial aid, registration, and student account system processes. Banner implementation is a major customer service upgrade.



State's Lottery Investment in USC Internship Pilot

 With the legislature's \$4.5M lottery appropriation, USC has created a new innovative internship program designed to partner USC students with SC businesses including manufacturers, aerospace, health and other STEM and high demand fields. Students receive \$3,000 stipends to support their internship participation – a benefit both to the student and sponsoring employer who also benefit from USC student talent, ultimately helping to keep more SC students in-state.

Request: <u>\$0 increase</u>. Instead, please <u>continue</u> the \$4,500,000 in the current lottery proviso in the FY24-25 lottery proviso as well.

State's Lottery Investment in Access and Affordability – State Need-Based Grants

USC supports continuing the state's recent investment in state need-based financial aid which over the last three years has allowed USC Columbia to substantially increase both the number of students receiving state need-based aid (up from just over 2,000 students in 2020 to over 4,100 today) and average award (up from \$2,500 in 2020 to \$3,300 today – an amount just short of the state's maximum award of \$3,500). As such, for a modest additional investment by the state of just \$1M at USC Columbia, we would be able to increase the average need-based aid award to the state maximum of \$3,500, further enhancing access and affordability for many of our lower and middle-income students. Note: USC Columbia students from ALL 46 counties benefit from the state's renewed investment in need-based aid.

Request: <u>\$1,000,000 increase</u> in Lottery state-need based aid to fund the full \$3,500 state maximum need-based award to all eligible USC-Columbia students.



State's Lottery Investment in Addressing the Nursing Shortage – The Statewide Nursing Faculty and Instructor Initiative

The USC system's College of Nursing (CON) programs appreciate two consecutive years of lottery funding (\$10M annually) to address a very real impediment to South Carolina's critical nursing shortage – the nursing faculty and instructor pipeline. At USC Columbia, this lottery investment has assisted the CON in providing an average 7-8% bonus (about \$8,500) to faculty salaries which has aided in retention of faculty, as well as helpful in recruiting star talent. We will need to maintain this, to maintain these outcomes. With higher faculty salaries, the faculty positions become more attractive to CONs statewide since nurses working in health systems typically have higher salaries than those in academia.

Request: <u>\$0 increase</u>. Instead, please <u>continue</u> the existing \$10,000,000 in the current lottery proviso in the FY24-25 proviso as well.

State's Lottery Investment in Access and Affordability – USC Colleges of Medicine – In-State Student Scholarship Support

The USC System proposes scholarship assistance for SC in-state residents wishing to seek a medical degree at USC's medical colleges – Columbia and Greenville - by providing these residents with financial scholarship assistance. To help alleviate the state's physician shortage, these scholarships exclusively for the benefit of South Carolina resident students would enhance recruitment and alleviate the out-migration of high-achieving South Carolina students to out-of-state schools. In doing so, USC can recruit, enroll, and retain qualified residents by providing accessible and affordable medical education opportunities for all, especially in underserved areas of our state. Resident medical students educated in our state are more likely to remain in the state and USC medical graduates are more likely to practice in underserved communities. Note: According to the latest national rankings, both USC's medical schools rank in the Top 10 in placing graduates in underserved areas (Columbia #5 and Greenville #7).

Request: \$3,500,000 allocation to be utilized by USC's colleges of medicine for the exclusive benefit of supporting medical education costs of <u>SC in-state residents.</u>



State's EIA Investment in USC College of Education Teacher Recruitment and Retention Initiatives

USC appreciates the recent EIA investments by the state in the USC College of Education's (COE) impactful teacher recruitment and retention programs; specifically, \$3 million for SC-TEACHER (\$1M recurring and \$2M one-time) and an additional \$450,000 for Carolina Collaborative for Alternative Preparation (CarolinaCAP) for the 2nd consecutive year. SC-TEACHER is a statewide collaborative of multiple institutions and partners whose purpose is to positively impact, through comprehensive research, teacher recruitment, preparation, and retention policies on teacher effectiveness in South Carolina. CarolinaCAP is equally impactful, having already partnered with several dozen school districts to increase the teacher workforce, especially in rural areas. In addition to continuing funding for SC-TEACHER and CarolinaCAP, we are seeking a modest additional investment in the College of Education - \$750,000 – for the Carolina Teacher Induction Program (CarolinaTIP) which has successfully demonstrated service to more than 300 1st through 3rd year teachers with an almost 98% retention rate.

Request: <u>\$0 increase</u>. Instead, please <u>continue</u> the \$1,000,000 in one-time EIA funding for SC-TEACHER provided in the FY23-24 budget in the FY25 EIA budget.

Request: <u>\$0 increase</u>. Instead, please <u>continue</u> the \$450,000 in one-time EIA funding for SC-TEACHER provided in the FY23-24 budget in the FY25 EIA budget.

Request: <u>\$750,000 increase</u> in EIA funds for the USC COE for the CarolinaTIP program.

IDC Threshold Increase for Teaching and Training Grants

• The USC System supports a modest increase to the current exemption level for non-research grants from \$200,000 to the first \$500,000 provided that the grant is used in support of the mission of another state agency of unit of government. The last increase was instituted in 1999. Currently, the state collects IDC earned on teaching and training grants awarded to colleges and universities (a requirement that is largely unique to S.C.).



USC: Health Sciences Campus and Rural Brain Health

 With the funds appropriated in this act, the University of South Carolina is authorized to undertake permanent improvements necessary for the development and construction of the Health Sciences Campus and Rural Brain Health Center. Further, the funds appropriated in Part 1A and 1B of this and prior acts for the Health Sciences Campus and Rural Brain Health Center may be carried forward and expended for the necessary permanent improvements. The funds must be accounted for separately, and the university shall report semiannually to the Chairman of the Joint Bond Review Committee on the amount of funding carried forward, the amount remaining to be expended, the overall status of the project or projects and any other information requested by the committee

Educational Scholarships for In-State Students – Access and Affordability

• This request benefits all colleges and universities in the state. It does not require any institution to implement the additional flexibility, so there is no adverse impact. Currently, South Carolina code section 59-101-620 stipulates, "A public institution of higher learning may offer educational fee waivers to no more than four percent (4%) of the undergraduate student body." This request would allow an additional four percent (4%) dedicated to South Carolinians. As the state is considering additional investment in South Carolinians, this request allows, but does not require, institutions to increase their investment and does not directly impact on the state's budget

Honors College – Existing Fund Reallocation for Necessary Repairs and Renovations

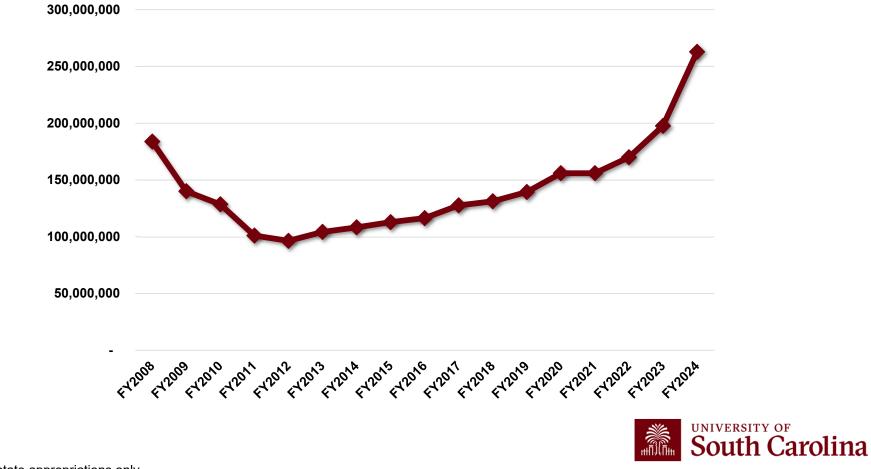

Recurring Appropriations

Access & Affordability for In-State Students: Tuition Mitigation Funding - Recurring \$25,800,000

STEM/High Demand Areas Support – Recurring \$7,000,000

• The University appreciates the State's FY2024 recurring investment in STEM and other High Demand fields. Additional investment would allow South Carolina to continue to attract and retain top instructional faculty and purchase best-in-class instructional tools and student support programs so that students are career ready upon graduation.



Recurring Appropriations

School of Medicine – Recurring \$6,500,000

- Access & Affordability for In-State Students (\$1,500,000): The top budget priority for the University of South Carolina Professional Schools remains continuing to partner with the state to invest in predictable funding to mitigate against annual resident tuition increases.
- Student Program Enhancement (\$5,000,000): The University requests support to retain and attract top quality faculty in a competitive environment. Funding would also maintain technology and teaching tools related to simulations of healthcare delivery environments and patient simulations (e.g., active learning classrooms, ultrasound labs, simulated hospital environments, standardized patients).

School of Law Student Support for New Programs - Recurring \$6,710,000

The University requests support for the Law School to retain and provide for success of South Carolina law students and provide support for emerging programs of study: Access & Affordability for In-State Students (\$700,000); Rural Access to Justice Program (\$1,800,000); State Lands Initiative (\$510,000); Academic Success & Advising Program (\$700,000); Excellence in Policing and Public Safety Program (\$1,800,000); Two Master Programs in Legal Studies (\$1,200,000) - Health Systems Law and Compliance, Environmental Law and Sustainability.



Capital Appropriations

Health Sciences Campus - \$50,000,000

• With this \$300 million project, the University recognizes its role in supporting the healthcare needs in the State of South Carolina where more than half its medical graduates remain in the Palmetto state and serve rural and underserved areas more than any school in the country. With full state funding, USC will be able to alleviate the need for borrowing (and associated borrowing costs which ultimately impacts students) while allowing the university to reprioritize substantial strategic savings prudently set aside for this project to other long-term university priorities of importance to the institution, our students, the state and economy.

Science and Technology Center – New Building for Academic and Research Space – \$90,000,000

• To fulfill the need for more classrooms in the western district of the campus, the University requests 100% of the cost of a new building for classrooms. Well-equipped with the most modern AV/IT infrastructure, additional general classrooms will benefit numerous academic programs.



Capital Appropriations

Jones Research Center Renovation - \$6,000,000

• The project will renovate the vacated third floor of the Jones PSC building to become a center for inter-disciplinary research. The 50-year-old space is vacated and desperately needs to be modernized to serve the academic and research mission of the university. Research space is limited on the campus and is preventing the recruitment of faculty that would not only teach but would also pursue federal research grants.

Coker College Maintenance Renovation - \$35,000,000

• The project will provide a comprehensive renovation of the 186,000 gross square foot structure that was constructed in 1975. The building houses academic and research programs within the College of Pharmacy and departments within the College of Arts and Sciences

Utility Infrastructure - \$104,900,000

- Establish a new dedicated electrical substation and replace approximately half of the outdated 8320-volt underground electrical infrastructure and pad-mounted transformers that provide electricity to most of the campus buildings.
- In 2020 and 2021, the campus commissioned an engineering firm to identify, master plan, and prioritize utility priorities. There is a list of over 100 priorities totaling \$151 million.

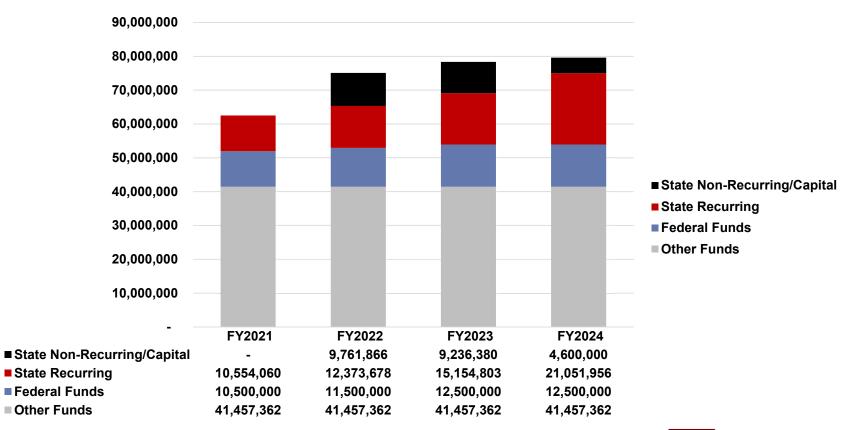






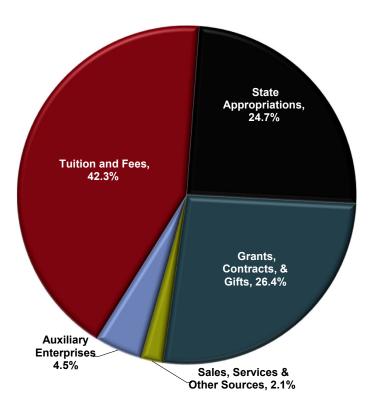

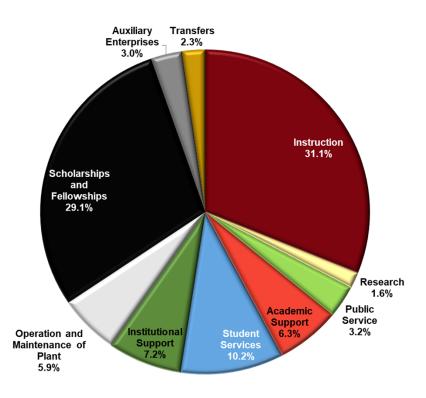

Recurring Appropriations

Access & Affordability for In-State Students: Tuition Mitigation Funding – Recurring \$4,900,000

• These funds would enable the System 1) to offset the tremendous rise in current inflationary costs expected to remain higher than historic norms for the foreseeable future, 2) to cover the customarily unfunded portion of state funding requirements for pension, health insurance, and cost of living adjustments, and 3) to continue to make strategic investments improving access to higher education for students across South Carolina.

Cyber/Engineering Program Enhancement – Recurring \$1,800,000

- USC Aiken is located at the center of academic and government partnerships critical to the nation's cyber security and technology enterprise, including Savannah River Site, the Department of Energy, U.S. Army Cyber Center of Excellence, and the U.S. Army Cyber Command. The institution must invest in additional programs that enhance student preparedness and meet regional workforce needs.
- USC Aiken would have the ability to build programs to support the career and skill needs of our partners, as well as purchase the necessary lab and specialized computer and diagnostics equipment to ensure USC Aiken graduates are contenders for the state's fastest growing and highest paying careers.
- With approximately 60% of incoming University of South Carolina Aiken students choosing to major in STEM fields including cybersecurity and engineering, the University of South Carolina Aiken requests \$1.8 million in recurring funds for cyber and engineering program enhancements.



Non-Recurring Appropriations

Strategic Marketing Campaign – Student Recruitment – Non-Recurring \$1,000,000

- The non-recurring funds would be used to launch this campaign, which we firmly believe will yield substantial returns on investment and enhance our institution's reputation as a leading educational institution in the region.
- The funds will be allocated to the following strategic endeavors: sustaining enrollment and revenue generation, enhancing institutional visibility and reputation, targeted outreach, and customization, leveraging multi-channel marketing strategies, measuring results and ROI, positioning for long-term growth, and timing and competitive edge.

Pacer Collaborative Research Center – Laboratory Equipment – Non-Recurring \$500,000

• This funding would be utilized to purchase equipment for the proposed Pacer Collaborative Research Center. Two large laboratories would adjoin to the north external wall of the existing science building. The space would allow for two large chemical laboratories of approximately 30'x60' for collaborative work with industry and regional partners. The external scientists and companies would work collaboratively with the USCA faculty and students under the auspices of the university.



Capital Appropriations

Nursing/ Health Sciences Building - \$20,000,000

- Additional classroom space is needed because our program has expanded to two additional campuses and includes telestreaming to students. The addition of MSN and DNP programs within the next couple of years will also require additional space.
- The current Exercise and Sports Science programs are scattered in the Business and Education building and would be moved to this space to take advantage of the enlarged lab and classroom spaces.
- The university is planning to expand, adding other health science majors to be housed in this building. The current simulation labs need expansion and could be utilized by other health science majors in this shared space.

Pacer Collaborative Research Center - \$2,850,000

- Current facilities on campus are not adequate to expand the number of collaborative projects and provide dedicated space for industry in a chemical environment. A dedicated wet laboratory innovation space is required to facilitate productive day to day extensive collaboration between USCA students/faculty and regional stakeholders. The facility will host joint appointments and adjunct research professors from regional industry facilities.
- Two large laboratories would adjoin to the north external wall of the existing science building. The space would allow for two large chemical laboratories of approximately 30'x60' for collaborative work with industry and regional partners. The external scientists and companies would work collaboratively with the USCA faculty and students under the auspices of the university.



Capital Appropriations

Penland Building Welcome Center/One Stop Shop Renovation - \$2,000,000

- The Welcome Center will serve as the starting point for recruitment of new students, family, and community members. By providing The Pacer Welcome Center, the university's recruitment presence and efforts will be greatly expanded and will allow USC Aiken to compete more effectively for outstanding South Carolina students.
- The One-Stop will provide excellent, high-level student service in an environment staffed by experts from across the Division of Enrollment Management. As an aid to both recruitment and especially retention efforts, the One-Stop staff will be able to solve problems, answer questions, provide intake for paperwork, and walk students through any process at the university.

Student Activities Center Renovation & Expansion - \$20,000,000

- The proposed renovation and expansion of the Student Activities Center would expand the number of large multipurpose spaces available to stakeholders (currently, there is only one heavily used space) to allow for more events to be held on campus. One of the most consistent complaints the university receives from students is the lack of gathering spaces on campus for students to relax and interact.
- The additional spaces are important for a campus that is 75% commuter. Renovated and expanded space would allow the Office of Career Services as well as the Student Media Center to relocate into the facility, creating free space in two academic buildings.

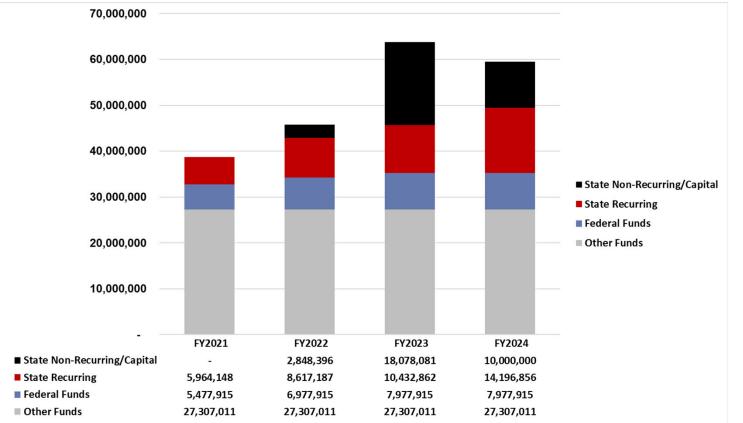






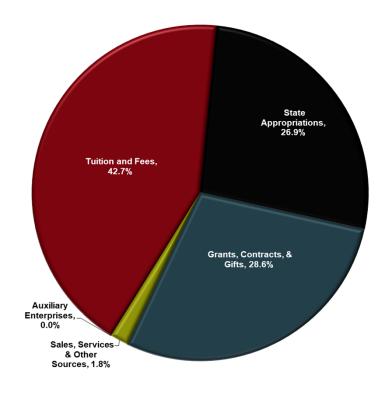

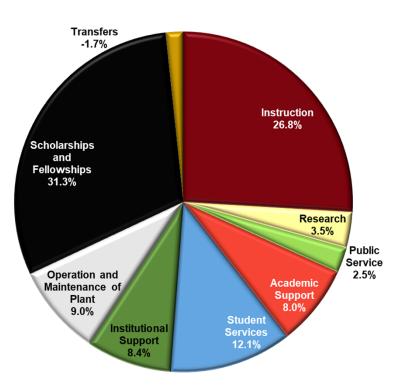

Recurring Appropriations

Access & Affordability for In-State Students: Tuition Mitigation Funding – Recurring \$1,000,000

- The top budget priority for the University of South Carolina System remains continuing to partner with the state to invest in predictable funding to mitigate against annual resident tuition increases.
- These funds would enable the System 1) to offset the tremendous rise in current inflationary costs expected to remain higher than historic norms for the foreseeable future, 2) to cover the customarily unfunded portion of state funding requirements for pension, health insurance, and cost of living adjustments, and 3) to continue to make strategic investments improving access to higher education for students across South Carolina.

Inflationary Small School Adjustment – Recurring \$3,000,000

 USCB continues to experience inflationary challenges associated with being in a high-cost-of-living area with intense challenges related to affordable housing. As a small school of 2,100 students and the tuition limitations serving a predominately low-income, first-generation-college population, USCB has been unable to sustain existing program cost increases and has depended on fund balance to maintain existing programs and services.



BEAUFORT FY2025 STATE BUDGET REQUEST

Capital Appropriations

New Convocation Center – \$11,500,000

- The multiuse event space with seating for up to 4,000 persons in a concert or graduation configuration and its support spaces will serve as a resource to both the University and Beaufort County. When completed in two phases, the facility will accommodate a wide range of academic courses, HPE athletic courses, student activities and assemblies, and special events.
- As an academic venue it will primarily serve the needs and function of the student body. Phase I will build approximately 87,500 square feet of floor space and include and a multi-functional floor area, fixed and retractable seating for approximately 3,600 spectators, dressing/locker rooms, event equipment storage rooms, concessions stand, several building support spaces and approximately 300 additional parking spaces.

Center for the Arts Renovation - \$12,000,000

• The project will enable USCB to expand its Community Arts, Education and Outreach Programs and to facilitate the future utilization of space within the building that has been designated as the site of the Jonathan Green Center, as well as enable a much higher utilization of our Beaufort academic space by greatly consolidating classrooms and laboratories within core academic campus.

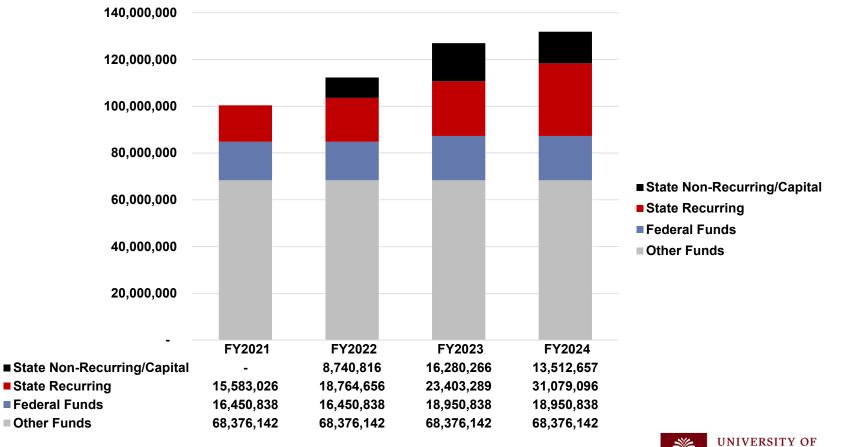






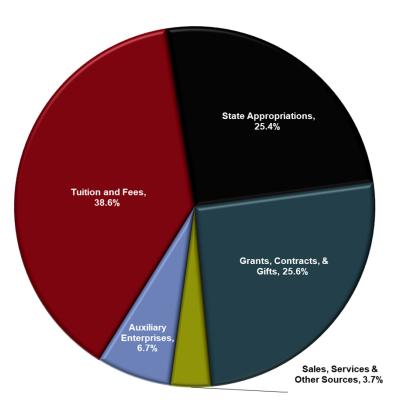

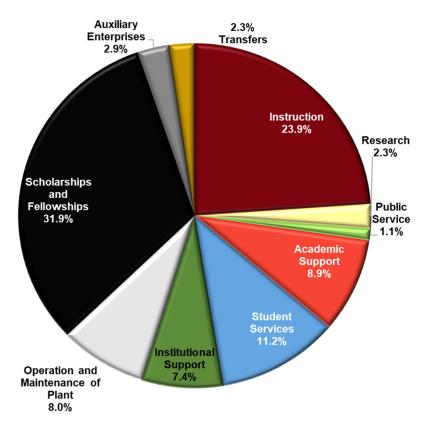

Digital Innovation Commons – Non-recurring \$1,650,000

 Funding would support the digital work of academic disciplines across the Upstate campus. A collection of 6 computer labs, the Commons will serve as a center that inspires intellectual curiosity and innovation at the intersection of technology, scholarship, and creativity. The Commons will house 6 digital lab spaces, with various technologies for student and faculty learning and teaching.

Center for Justice and Society - Non-recurring \$1,330,237

 The Center's purpose is to provide co-curricular activities and support for students pursuing legal and justice-related careers. Effort would include scholarships, fellowships, internships, study abroad experiences, LSAT and graduate school application preparation. Because funds will be limited, a competitive process will be necessary with supports and activities allocated using predetermined eligibility criteria.



Capital Appropriations

New Convocation Center - \$85,000,000

- Provide a new 135,000 GSF Convocation Center to support the academic function for larger assembly spaces to house convocations and other meeting venues affiliated with the University.
- Provide an athletic facility for major NCAA Division 1 athletics with an approximate seating capacity of 6,000-7,000 fixed seats with ability for additional floor seating areas.
- Provide a large facility for large venues in the Upstate region for use by community functions affiliated with entertainment, local business, Spartanburg Regional Heath System, and other regional meeting space functions.

Construct New School of Nursing Building - \$61,000,000

- Construct new 76,000 GSF facility to include classrooms, labs, faculty-staff offices, and affiliated meeting spaces.
- This will double the size of the existing Mary Black School of Nursing academic facility.



Capital Appropriations

Smith Science Building Renovation/Expansion - \$26,450,000

- Construct new 20,000 GSF addition for Active Learning Lab, Greenhouse, Herbarium, Computer Lab, Chemistry Nursing Lab, Student Study Rooms, Chemistry Laser Lab, Climate Chambers, Animal Research space, Chemistry Instrumentation space, Chemist and Biology Research labs, Office suites for the Chair Natural Sciences and Engineering and the Dean of College of Science and Technology, Faculty and Staff offices, department support/storage spaces, and associated new mechanical systems.
- Interior upgrades to existing building at select lab and support spaces, replace select lab benches, equipment, fume hoods and interior finishes.
- Temporary repairs in 2020 and 2022 removed small sections of suspect CW pipe sections and observed as much as 85% of the pipe area was clogged with dirt/sludge and metal shavings/particles.
- This building provides Nursing and Education Classrooms, Enrollment Services, Registrar's Office, Bookstore, Recreation Center, Food Court, and Dean/Faculty Offices.

Deferred maintenance - \$22,000,000

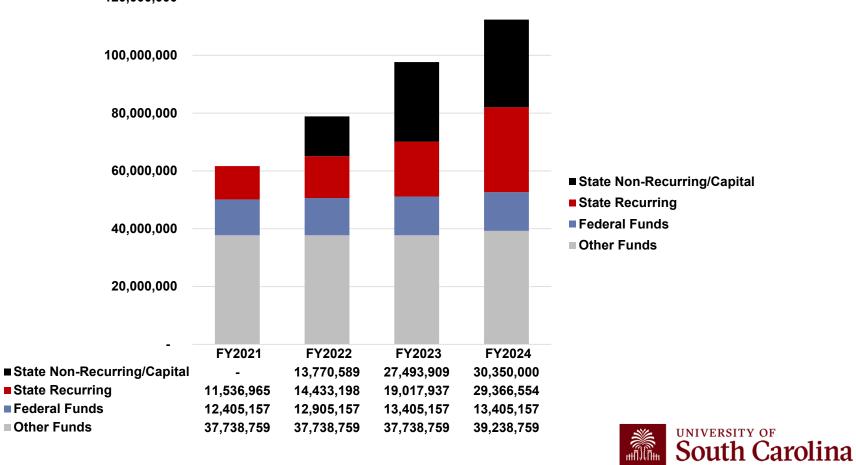
 Maintenance is a required cost for ensuring appropriate learning environments and maintaining state assets. USC Upstate would use funds to address a variety of deferred or appropriate critical repair and related maintenance, and address any other critical equipment, and systems repair. Funds would be targeted for critical life and safety maintenance issues and those that ensure educational mission.





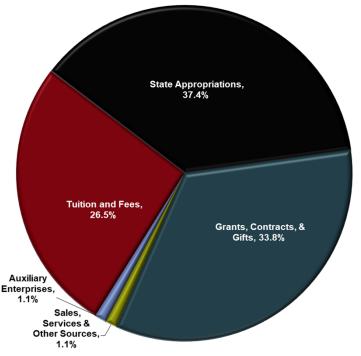


PALMETTO COLLEGE STATE BUDGET HISTORY

PALMETTO COLLEGE TOTAL CURRENT FUNDS

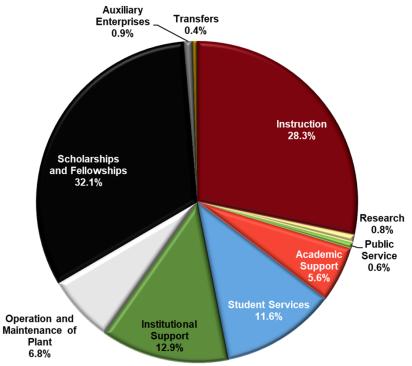

Recurring Appropriations

Access & Affordability for In-State Students: Tuition Mitigation Funding - Recurring \$2,442,249

- The top budget priority for the University of South Carolina System remains continuing to partner with the state to invest in predictable funding to mitigate against annual resident tuition increases.
- Allocations per campus: Lancaster \$400,000; Sumter \$400,000; Salkehatchie \$800,000; and Union \$842,249. Requests would help mitigate future tuition increases by covering anticipated operating increases for inflationary costs and mandated increases such as pension, health insurance, and cost of living adjustments.

• Salkehatchie \$150,000; Sumter \$150,000; Union \$300,000.

Faculty Staffing – Recurring \$530,000

- Instructional materials, supplies, and equipment to support nursing, student success, and disability services. \$400,000
- Equipment, supplies, and consulting to support marketing and public relations to enhance recruitment and retention efforts. \$100,000

- Enhance services for Student Support Services/Academic Support Center Student Tutoring. \$25,000



Capital Appropriations

Facility Deferred Maintenance, Renovations and Upgrades - \$33,830,000

• Lancaster \$6,700,000; Salkehatchie \$6,700,000; Sumter \$10,030,000; Union \$10,400,000.

USC Salkehatchie Remodel or Replace of Salk Arena - \$15,000,000

• The current Salk Arena in Walterboro is home to the Salkehatchie volleyball and men's and women's basketball. The court is not regulation size which means that the campus is not able to host any tournaments. The building was built in 1925 and acquired by Salkehatchie in 1990. Many improvements have been made to the building over the years; however, to expand the court to regulation size, the building would have to be extended as there is not currently enough space to enlarge the court. Once the building wall is removed, it is likely that the building will need to be brought up to today's codes, which it has previously been grandfathered. This will involve upgrades to the building including, but not limited to, fire/sprinkler systems, plumbing, electrical, etc. We are requesting funds to do an evaluation of the building and then to proceed based on recommendations from that evaluation.



Capital Appropriations

USC Sumter Multipurpose Conference Facility - \$17,160,000

• The Facility will serve as a general-purpose conference center for community and campus group meetings. The venue will be large enough for conferences and will provide adjoining break rooms, and technical installations such as smartboards, digital video projectors, Wi-Fi, and video conferencing. Sumter city and county managers have encouraged a USC Sumter Conference facility since there are few, if any, multi-purpose facilities of this type in Sumter.

USC Sumter Health, Wellness, and Athletics Center - \$26,266,000

• The Health and Athletics Center will include an updated facility that will meet the current and future needs and will allow athletics programs to expand and to increase student enrollment. The current facility is in great demand for numerous community activities, but these events compete with athletics for space.

USC Sumter Student Success Center - \$6,400,000

• This project will provide a Campus Tutoring Center, Trio Office, OSP Scholars Office and lab, Veterans service, Student Assistance, and administrative offices.

USC Sumter Facilities Management Center - \$5,850,000

• Facilities Management and the Student Union Center share valuable campus space in the Student Center Union building. By relocating the Facilities Management facility to the periphery of the campus, the existing space can be repurposed for much needed student union space

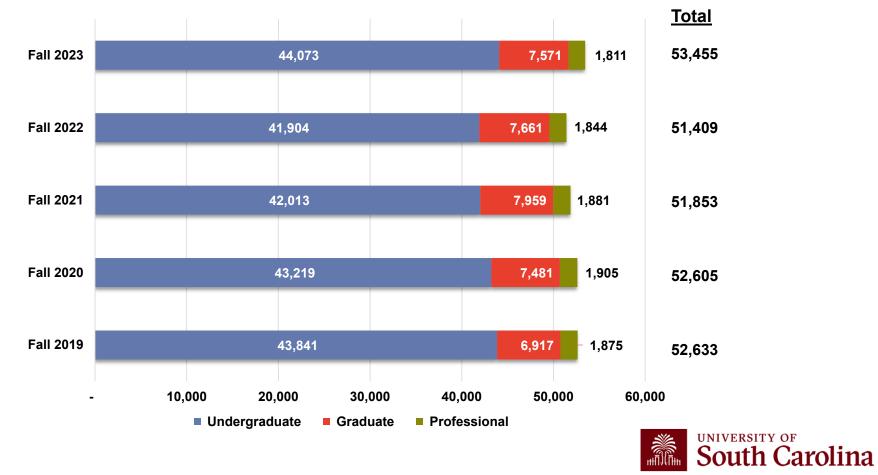


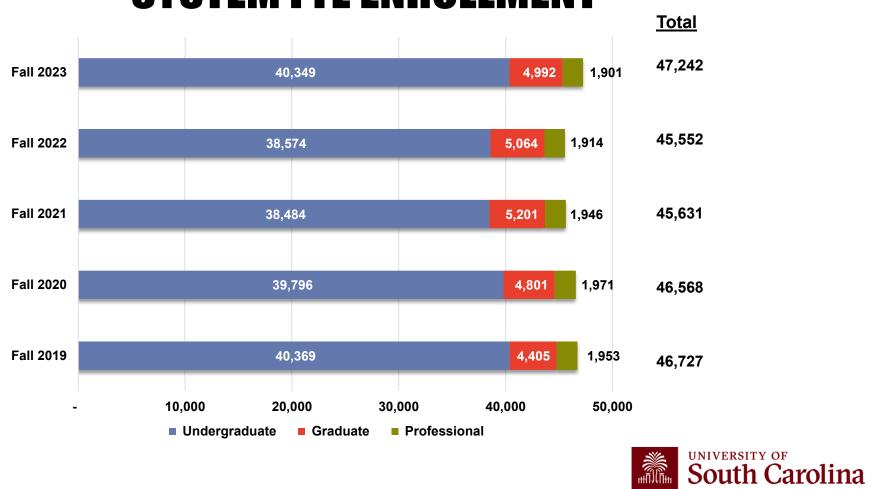

SYSTEM 4% FEE WAIVER

I. Governing Legislation/USC System Policy

South Carolina Code of Laws: Section 59-101-620 USC System Policy: FINA 4.04

II. Summary

Legislation/policy allows institutions of higher education to offer educational fee waivers of up to 4% of the undergraduate students or in an amount based on 4% of the prior year's tuition revenue.

III. Purpose

The use of tuition awards is for the following purposes: to enable the campus to have a more direct influence of the diversity of the student body profile; to enroll academically talented students and students with special talents; and/or to meet student's financial need or to recognize student's contributions to the University.

IV. Special Treatment for USC System Comprehensive and Regional Colleges

Recipients of the 4% fee waiver at Comprehensive Institutions may include non-resident students and high school concurrent students. The combination of tuition award plus waived fees may not be greater than the differential between tuition rates for residents and non-residents. No more than one-half of the 4% calculation may be awarded to non-resident students.

V. Threshold Calculation (Equivalent Method - Per Policy FINA 4.04)



SYSTEM ABATEMENTS

Abatements provide an avenue, through strategic leveraging of discount rates, to recruit and retain high caliber non-resident undergraduate students to the University of South Carolina.

The State of South Carolina requires or allows several abatements through state law. **This includes**

- □ Active Duty Military
- Certain Military Dependents
- □ Academic Common Market
- □ Sister-State

- □ International Agreements
- American Legion Scholars
- Reciprocal Exchanges

Students who receive institutional abatements possess academic, athletic, or musical talents to enhance the campus and community.

USC Columbia uses a tiered tuition structure for non-resident scholarship students with different discount rates. This has been intentionally developed over time to compete for high caliber students while maximizing net tuition revenue.

At USC Columbia, the non-resident student population subsidizes the cost of education for South Carolina residents.
