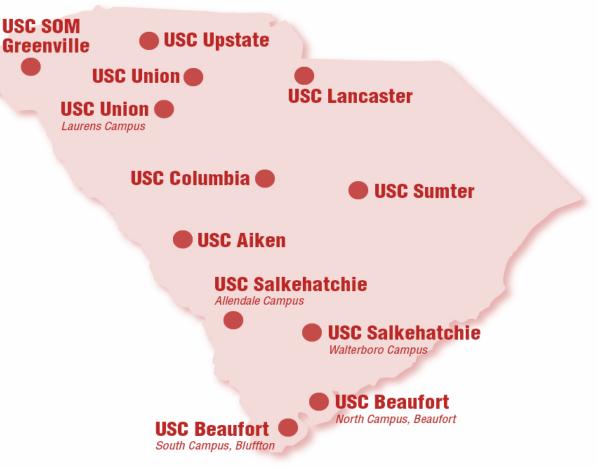

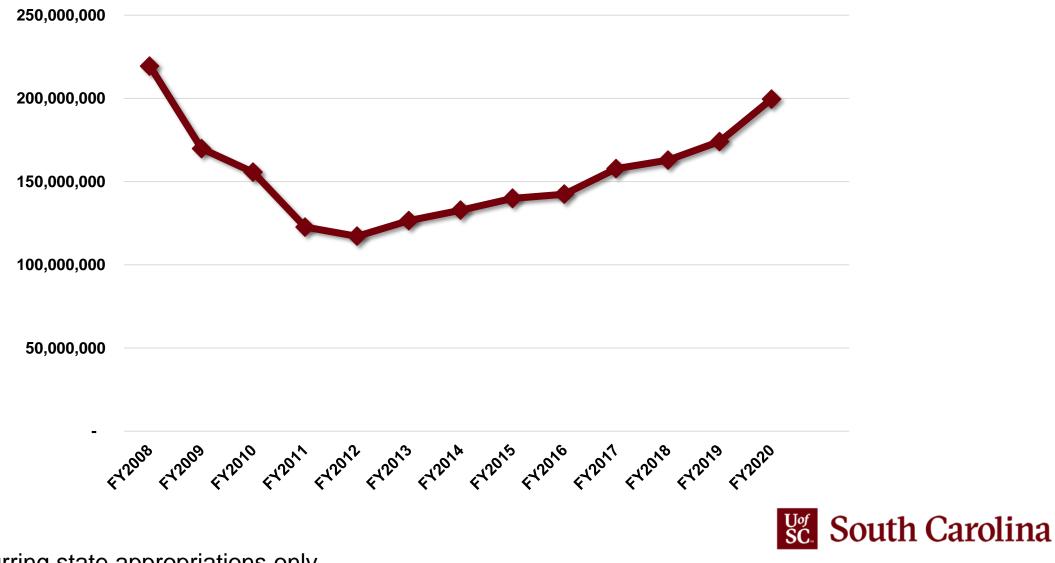

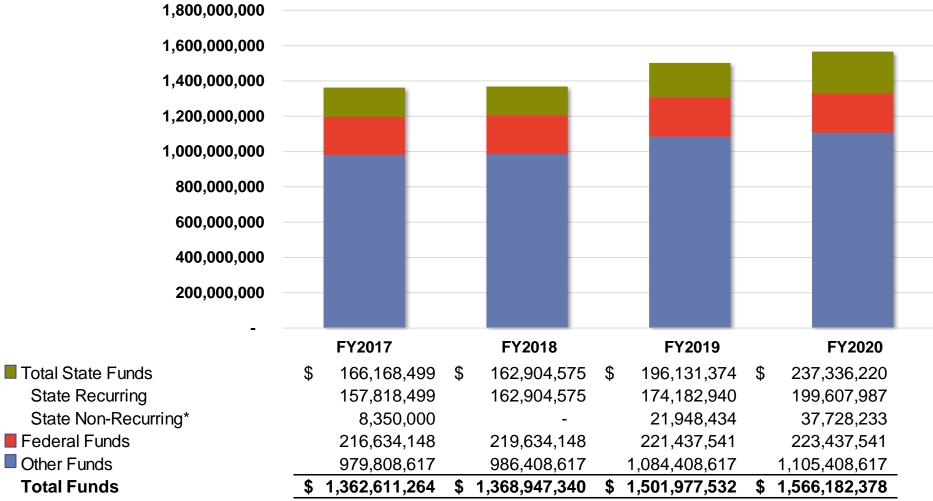


USC SYSTEM STATE APPROPRIATIONS

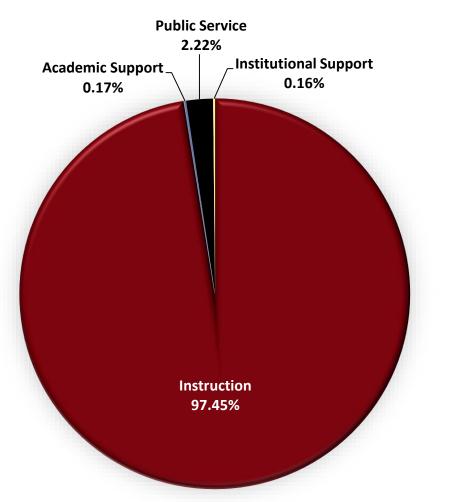
USC SYSTEM STATE BUDGET HISTORY

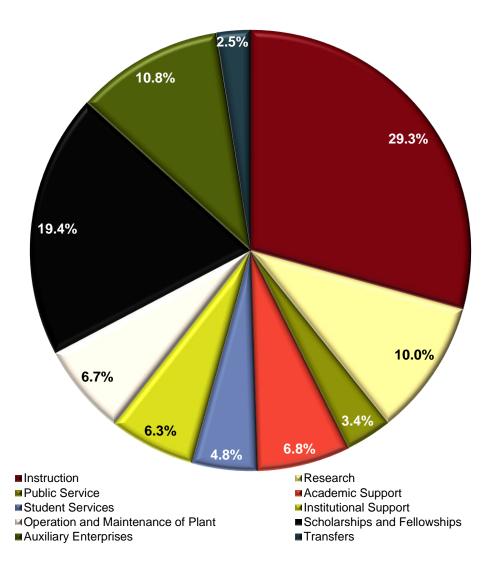

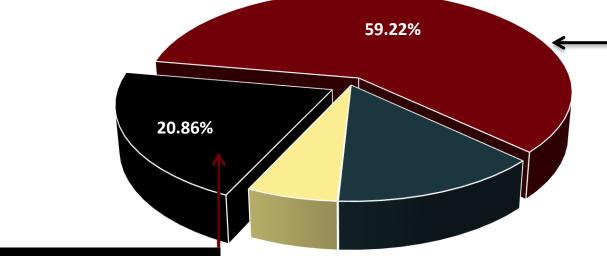

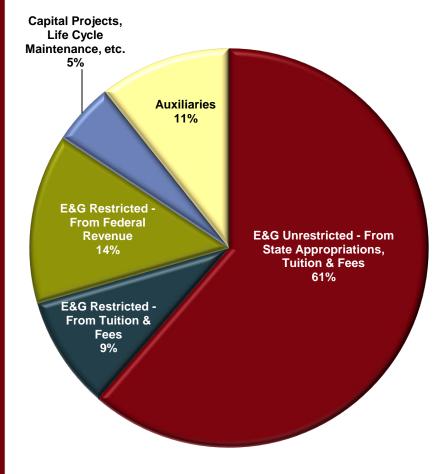

USC SYSTEM FTE REQUEST

□ All FTEs requested correspond to recurring funds requested.

- USC manages its authorized FTEs within the system as a whole and has always been granted latitude to shift FTEs between institutions as long as total and State FTE authorization levels are maintained and not exceeded.
- FTE requests support developing programs needed to meet current workforce demands in the areas of Nursing, Engineering, and Education.
- Enrollment continues to reach record levels at the University of South Carolina system.



USC SYSTEM COST SAVINGS

Columbia (Including Schools of Medicine) - \$4,679,094

Academic Units - \$2,589,581

- □ Forego hiring ten faculty and fifteen staff.
- □ Reduction would negatively impact student / faculty ratio.
- □ May result in fewer course offerings.
- Evening programs would reduce temporary faculty and/or adjuncts and course offerings.

Service Units - \$1,457,154

- □ Reduce student employees and temporary staff.
- □ Campus Safety Officer program likely eliminated.
- □ Transportation services impacted.
- □ Marketing reductions.

Schools of Medicine – \$587,732

REDUCING COST AND BURDEN TO BUSINESS AND CITIZENS

University of South Carolina System

- The University does not have regulations that pertain to business operations. Nor does the University have regulations that pertain to citizens in general. The University has taken steps over the last several years to assist students in obtaining a degree in a timely manner and to minimize the overall cost of obtaining a quality education.
- Providing a quality workforce to the businesses within the State is a vital aspect of continuous economic development. The savings to citizens and business of the state are incalculable.
- □ Highlights of a recent study found that USC has a total economic impact (all 8 institutions statewide) of approximately \$5.5 billion when measured in terms of annual state output. The system supports over 60,000 jobs statewide and returns \$219 million annually to the state in tax revenue.
- Palmetto College Online was designed to make Bachelors completion degrees more accessible and affordable for in-state place bound residents. The number of programs continues to grow each year thereby reducing the need for residents to choose the more expensive "forprofit" online college. Centralizing distance learning efforts for the USC System helps contain costs associated with program startup, marketing and admissions.
- The "On Your Time" initiative was designed to give students a greater opportunity to complete their degrees in less time and reduce overall tuition costs and loan debt. Research shows that the key driver of student debt is taking longer than 8 semesters to graduate. Since the creation of the "On Your Time" initiative, the four-year graduation rate has increased by 7 percentage points.
- System improvements include recent implementation of Banner which is an enterprise student information system. Key features include integrated admissions, financial aid, registration, and student account system processes. Banner implementation is a major customer service upgrade.
 Upgrade.

USC SYSTEM PROVISO REQUESTS

Higher Education Repair and Renovation Fund

The USC System supports the creation of a statewide dedicated "Higher Education Repair and Renovation Fund" that would provide the state's 33 public colleges and universities a modest but predictable source of recurring state funding to be utilized for the exclusive purpose of maintaining (through repair and renovation – not new construction) college and university education related facilities.

Permanent Improvement Project Thresholds

This proviso would provide colleges and universities meaningful regulatory relief by increasing the state's fixed "permanent improvement project" (PIP) dollar threshold that currently triggers the state's multi-phased, eight-step (BOT, CHE, JBRC, and SFAA x2 (Phases 1 and 2)) approval process before execution of a college or university's project can commence. By increasing the threshold for PIP projects from \$1,000,000 to \$5,000,000 for research universities and from \$1,000,000 to \$2,000,000 for all other public institutions of higher learning including technical colleges, smaller more routine capital and other PIPs can be undertaken in a more timely and cost effective manner, while more costly projects would continue to undergo the state's multi-phased approval process.

Educational Scholarships for In-State students – Access and Affordability

- This request benefits all colleges and universities in the state. It does not require any institution to implement the additional flexibility, so there is no adverse impact.
- Currently, South Carolina code section 59-101-620 stipulates, "A public institution of higher learning may offer educational fee waivers to no more than four percent (4%) of the undergraduate student body." This request is to allow an additional four percent (4%) dedicated to low-income South Carolinians. It will allow greater support for Pell-eligible residents and those residents that just miss Pell eligibility and face growing loan debt. This also will assist in reducing out of pocket costs and aid in recruitment and retention of low-income students. As the state is considering additional investment in South Carolinians with financial need, this request allows, but does not require, institutions to increase their investment and does not directly impact the state's budget.

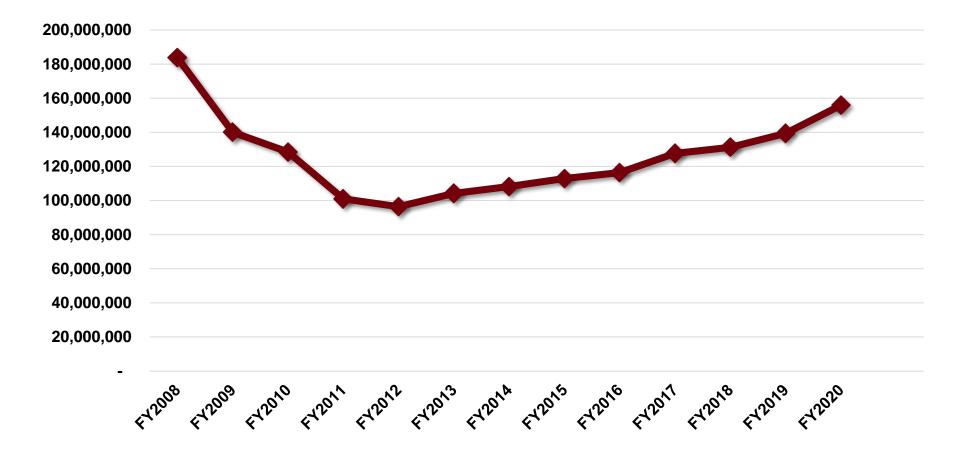






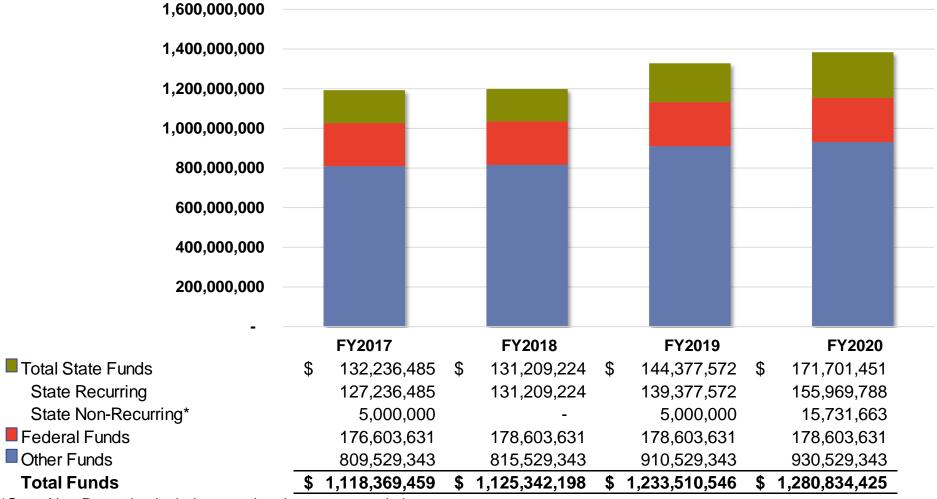

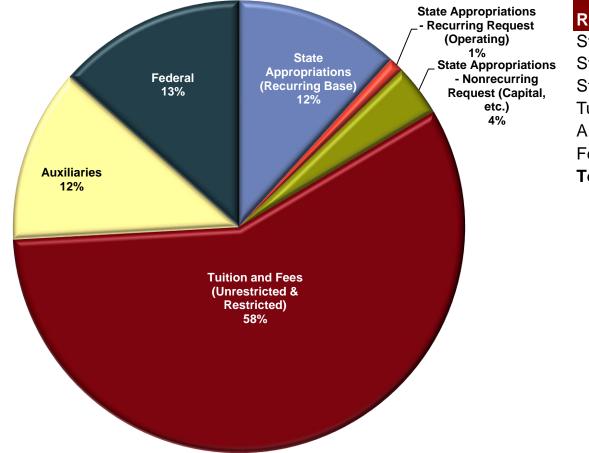

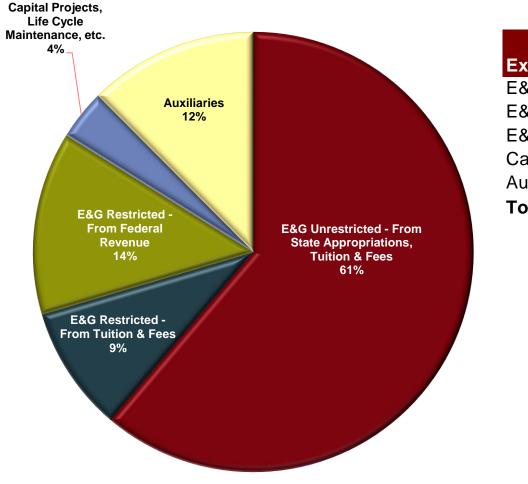

Recurring Appropriations

Access and Affordability for In-State Students: Tuition Mitigation Funding - \$9,358,187

- In the spirit of the South Carolina Higher Education Opportunity Act (HEOA), and out of a desire to partner with the state to freeze tuition and fees for in-state students next year, the USC System is requesting a modest increase in recurring funding of at least 6.0% for FY2021, which is equivalent to early projections of growth in state appropriation actual revenue next year according to internal estimates informed by legislative budget experts and other analyses.
- These funds would enable the System to offset a portion of the rise in basic inflationary costs it faces, state mandates such as pension, health insurance, cost of living adjustments, and strategic initiatives to improve access to higher education for students across South Carolina.

School of Medicine: Rural Health Initiative - \$2,000,000

The School of Medicine requests funds for the continued development of partnerships designed to increase quality and improve access to needed primary care in rural areas across the state.

School of Law: School of Law Library - \$826,000

The School of Law supports the state's only public research law library. This request will help address a shortfall in annual funds needed to operate and maintain the library.

Palmetto College - Columbia: Increase Bachelor's Degrees for South Carolinians And Active Duty Military - \$2,000,000

- Funding will expand the presence of USC Palmetto College at installations across the state to attract active-duty military personnel to start and finish their degree at a reduced tuition rate.
- **u** Funding will expand pool of Palmetto College students by allowing them to complete a fully online degree program in a wide variety of fields.



Non-Recurring Appropriations

School of Medicine Relocation - \$35,000,000

- The School of Medicine will be relocated to modern facilities adjacent to Palmetto Richland hospital, bringing new research opportunities and establishing the region as a hub of biomedical technology development.
- The relocation will allow the School of Medicine to replace aging facilities that will limit the school's ability to attract and serve future students.
- The health care industry is rapidly growing in South Carolina with high demand for college-educated workers in the next 15 years. A health sciences campus offers significant opportunity for economic impact through private sector partnerships, increased research funding, start-ups and other commercialization of the complex while improving health care delivery and outcomes for South Carolinians.
- A modern, efficient facility, located closer to the University's clinical partners in Columbia, is a more effective long-term teaching and research location and a more cost-effective facility to own and operate. The current medical school facility requires significant capital investment to remain suitable through the current lease and faces market rate rent upon renewal.
- Multi-year, two-phase project to relocate the School of Medicine-Columbia and create a health sciences research complex.
 Phase 1: 144,000 SF medical teaching facility, \$125 million. Phase 2: 162,000 SF science and lab building, \$160 million.



Non-Recurring Appropriations

USC Columbia Deferred Maintenance: Critical Care and Repair Match (1:1) - \$14,000,000

- □ USC currently expends at least \$14,000,000 on an annualized average basis for institutional maintenance for critical care and repairs of its facilities. When matched, these funds would be used to reduce maintenance and capital needs that are deferred due to resource constraints.
- Maintenance is a required cost for ensuring appropriate learning environments and maintaining state assets. USC proposes a 1:1 match whereby USC Columbia would use funds to address a variety of deferred or appropriate critical repair and related maintenance, and address any other critical equipment, and systems repair. Funds would be targeted for critical life and safety maintenance issues and those that ensure educational mission.
- Funds would also establish the School of Law Veteran's Clinic in the Horry-Guignard House to provide legal services to indigent veterans, especially in the areas of housing, employment, disability claims and family law.

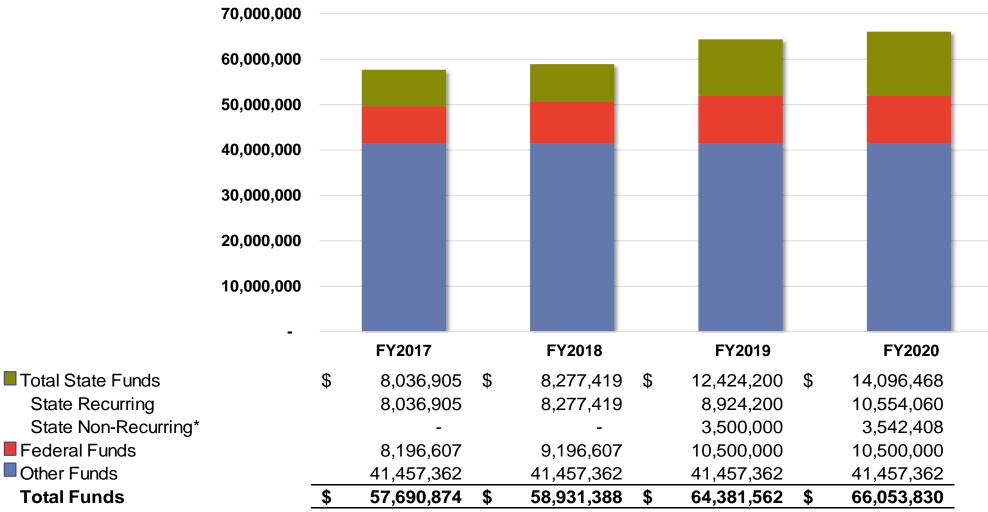

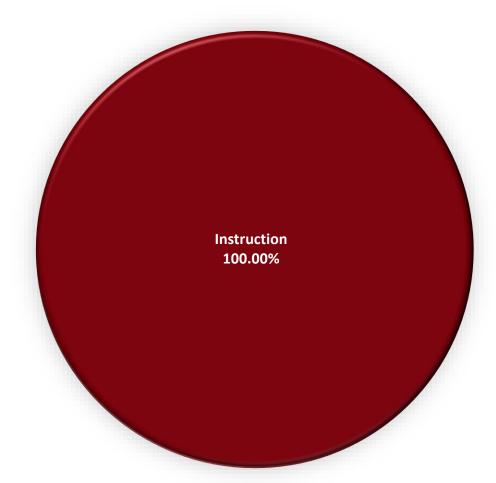

USC AIKEN FY2020 STATE APPROPRIATION DETAIL

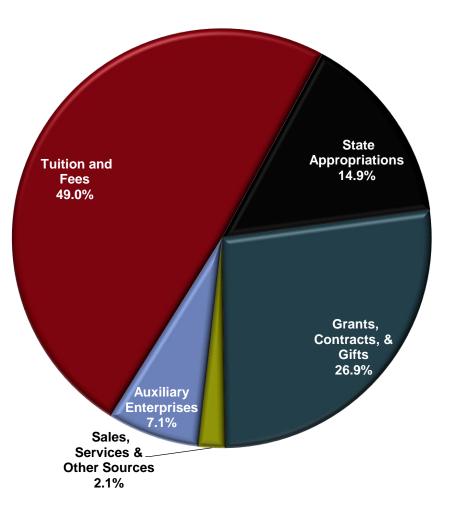

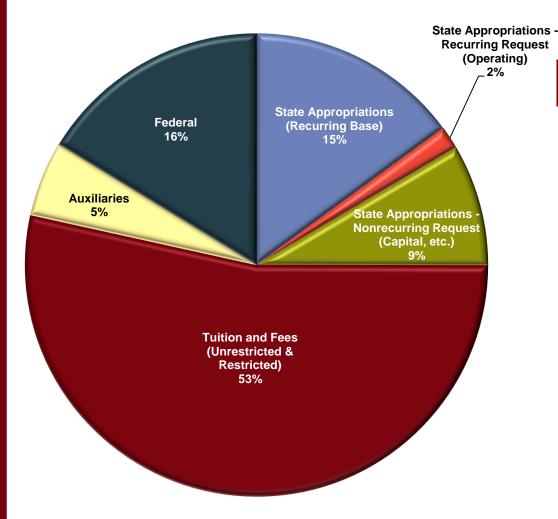

Federal & Other Funds Authorization

Federal Funds Authorization - \$1,000,000

- □ With a number of Department of Energy related facilities proximate to USC Aiken and renewed interest in collaboration, the University believes that prospects continue to be good for increased Federal grant activity.
- □ Total Federal Funds expenditures for FY20 are estimated to remain at \$10,500,000 based on recent experience and anticipated stable enrollment and grant activity.
- □ Pending grant applications could yield an additional \$1.0 million by FY21.



Non-Recurring Appropriations

Humanities and Social Sciences Building HVAC Upgrades - \$2,500,000

The current HVAC system has reached the end of its serviceable life and longer provides adequate heating and cooling needed for a building of its type.

Renovation to the Library and Learning Commons - \$2,500,000

- In addition to needed renovations to the main campus' library, this project would create an Engineering and Innovation Lab complete with 3-D printers and virtual reality technology.
- □ Create "learning commons" space that brings together library, technology, advising, student support, career services, Veteran's services and other offices to support student success and improve retention and graduation.
- □ Total project is expected to be \$10M, funded as follows: \$8.5M State, \$1M Private Gifts, and \$500K Institutional Funds.

Deferred Maintenance Match (1:1) - \$1,000,000

Maintenance is a required cost for ensuring appropriate learning environments and maintaining state assets. USC proposes a 1:1 match whereby USC Aiken would use funds to address a variety of deferred or appropriate critical repair and related maintenance, and address any other critical equipment, and systems repair. Funds would be targeted for critical life and safety maintenance issues and those that ensure educational mission.

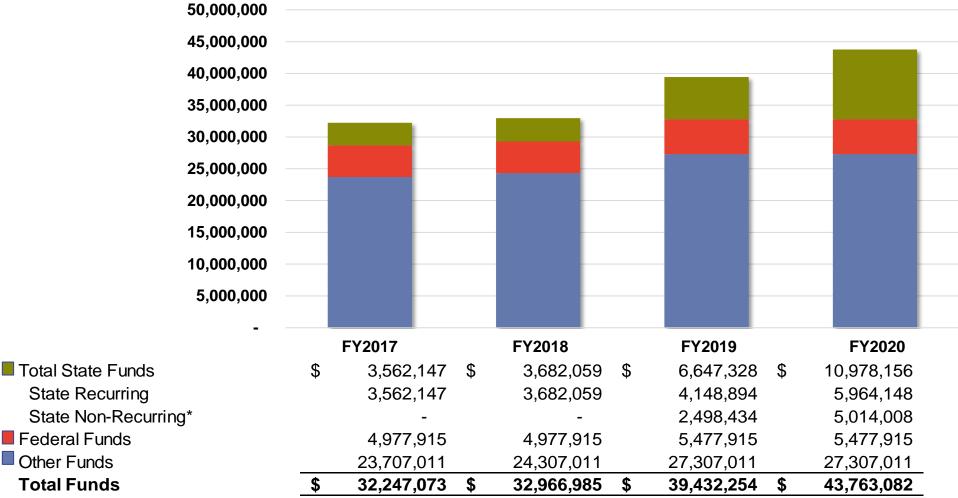








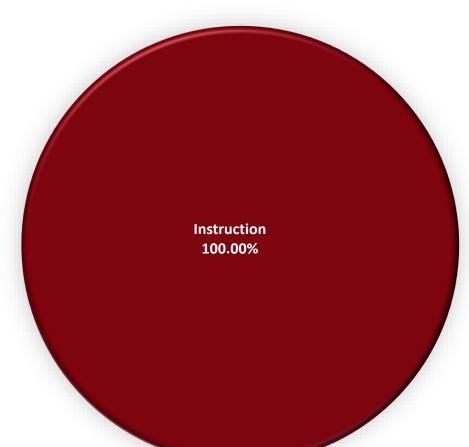
USC BEAUFORT STATE BUDGET HISTORY

Access and Affordability for In-State Students: Tuition Mitigation Funding - \$692,218

Allocations per campus are: USC Lancaster - \$214,196, USC Salkehatchie - \$148,749, USC Sumter - \$235,099, and USC Union -\$94,174. Requests cover only a portion of the operating increases for anticipated inflationary costs and mandated increases such as pension, health insurance, and cost of living adjustments, but would help mitigate future tuition increases.

USC Sumter - Student Recruiting, Retention, and Graduation Center - \$970,000

□ The Student Recruiting, Retention, and Graduation Center will enhance retention and graduation rates by assisting students with STEM coursework and writing, which have been identified by employers as critical needs.

USC Sumter – Nursing, Engineering, Education and Applied Computer Science Programs - \$1,034,500

Request will allow USC Sumter to offer four new academic programs: B.S. in Nursing; B.A. in Early Childhood Education and B.A. in Elementary Education; a B.S. degree in Industrial Process Engineering program, and a B.S. degree in Applied Computer Science. The programs will be offered in partnership with USC Aiken.

USC Salkehatchie and USC Lancaster – Campus Safety - \$550,000

This effort will help Palmetto College campuses bolster emergency planning efforts and develop a comprehensive Emergency Operations Plan. USC Salkehatchie - \$300,000, USC Lancaster - \$250,000.



Federal & Other Funds Authorization

Federal Funds Authorization USC Sumter - \$500,000

- Enrollment is currently tracking for 23.49% growth in FY20. Continued enrollment growth has increased the need for Federal Student Financial aid.
- □ Federal expenditures have increased 8.5% over the last 5 years.
- □ Slight increase in Federal Research dollars.



Non-Recurring Appropriations

Palmetto College Campus Facility Renovations and Upgrades (CPIP) - \$7,750,000

- □ USC Sumter \$7,000,000 The USC Sumter Fire Ants athletics teams have expanded in recent years and it has outgrown the current athletic facilities both for practice and competition. The indoor basketball court is unsafe for competitive basketball. This project will replace the current facilities with an updated facility that will meet the current needs and allow programs to expand.
- □ USC Sumter \$750,000 The USC Sumter Fire Ants Softball team has expanded in recent years and the team does not have a competition quality playing field. The practice field is inadequate and unsafe. This project will replace the current practice field.

Deferred Maintenance - \$6,438,000

- □ USC Lancaster \$2,350,000 Renovations for Bradley Building, Dowling Building, and Bradley and Gregory Wellness Center HVAC upgrades; Parking lot repaving; Athletic field upgrades; landscape improvements.
- □ USC Salkehatchie \$2,413,000 Roof repairs and HVAC replacements at several academic building; repainting where warranted and demolition of certain buildings such as Faculty House, Art House, and Athletic Information buildings (Allendale).
- □ USC Union \$1,675,000 renovations to admissions/financial aid center, Fine Arts Education Center, Central Building and campus-wide restroom updates for ADA compliance and modernization.

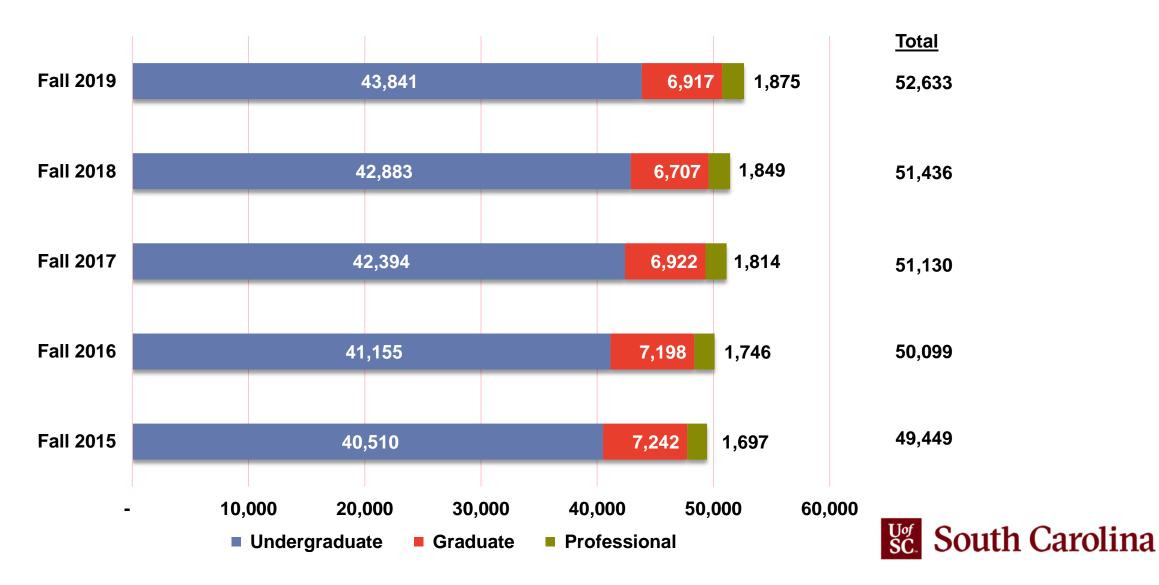




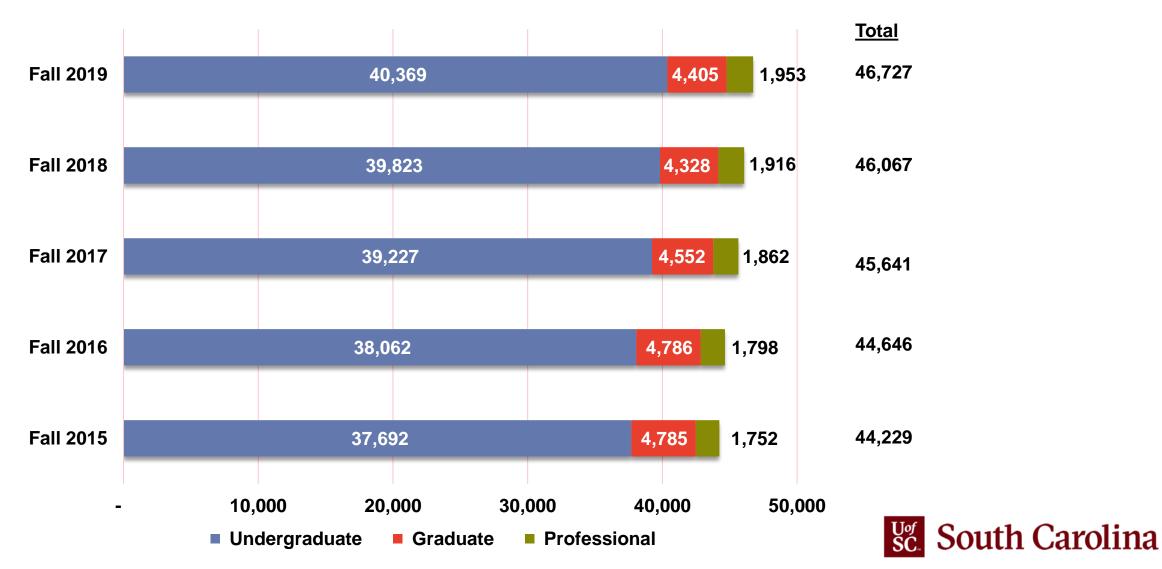

USC SYSTEM 4% FEE WAIVER

I. Governing Legislation/USC System Policy

South Carolina Code of Laws: Section 59-101-620 USC System Policy: FINA 4.04

II. Summary

Legislation/policy allows institutions of higher education to offer educational fee waivers of up to 4% of the undergraduate students or in an amount based on 4% of the prior year's tuition revenue.

III. Purpose

The use of tuition awards is for the following purposes: to enable the campus to have a more direct influence of the diversity of the student body profile; to enroll academically talented students and students with special talents; and/or to meet student's financial need or to recognize student's contributions to the University.

IV. Special Treatment for USC System Comprehensive and Regional Colleges

Recipients of the 4% fee waiver at Comprehensive Institutions may include non-resident students and high school concurrent students. The combination of tuition award plus waived fees may not be greater than the differential between tuition rates for residents and non-residents. No more than one-half of the 4% calculation may be awarded to non-resident students.

V. Threshold Calculation (Equivalent Method - Per Policy FINA 4.04)



USC SYSTEM ABATEMENTS

Abatements provide an avenue, through strategic leveraging of discount rates, to recruit and retain high caliber non-resident undergraduate students to the University of South Carolina.

The State of South Carolina requires or allows several abatements through state law. This includes

- Active Duty Military
- Certain Military Dependents
- Academic Common Market
- Sister-State

- □ International Agreements
- □ American Legion Scholars
- □ Reciprocal Exchanges

Students who receive institutional abatements possess academic, athletic, or musical talents to enhance the campus and community.

USC Columbia uses a tiered tuition structure for non-resident scholarship students with different discount rates. This has been intentionally developed over time to compete for high caliber students while maximizing net tuition revenue.

At USC Columbia, the non-resident student population subsidizes the cost of education for South Carolina residents.

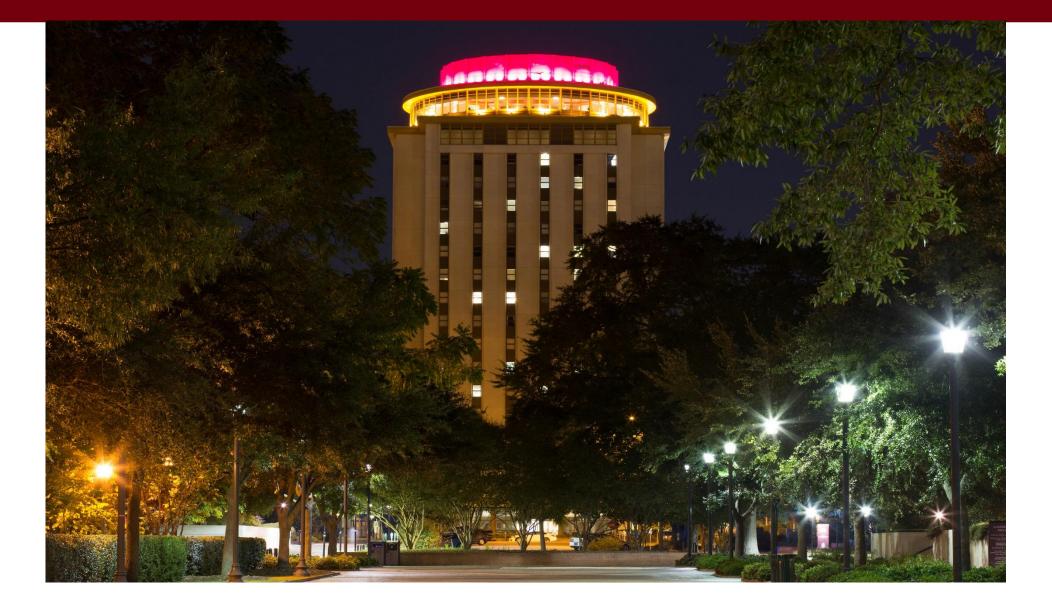

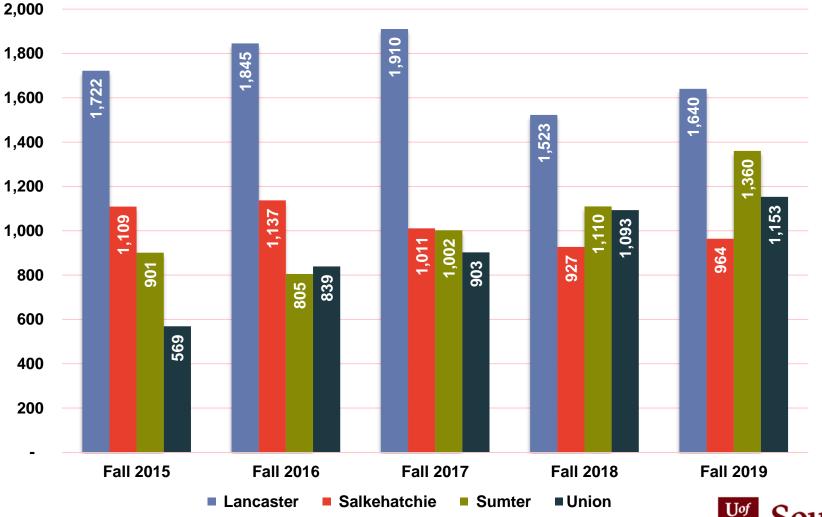






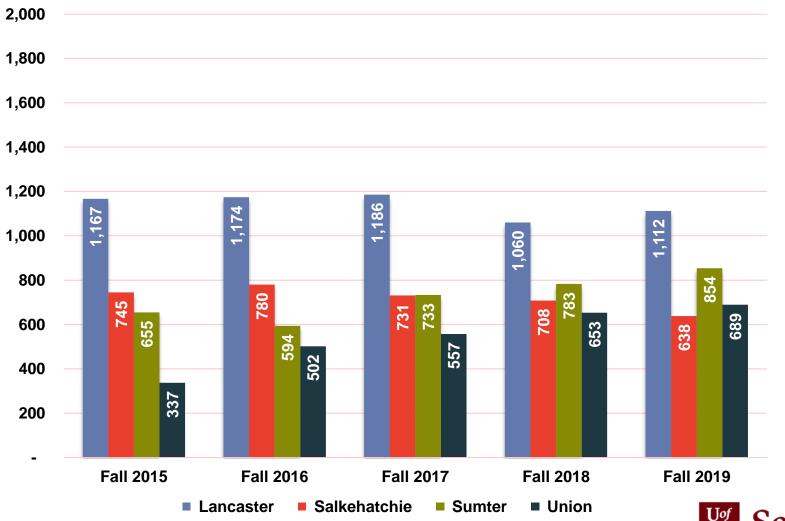


USC PALMETTO COLLEGE HEADCOUNT ENROLLMENT



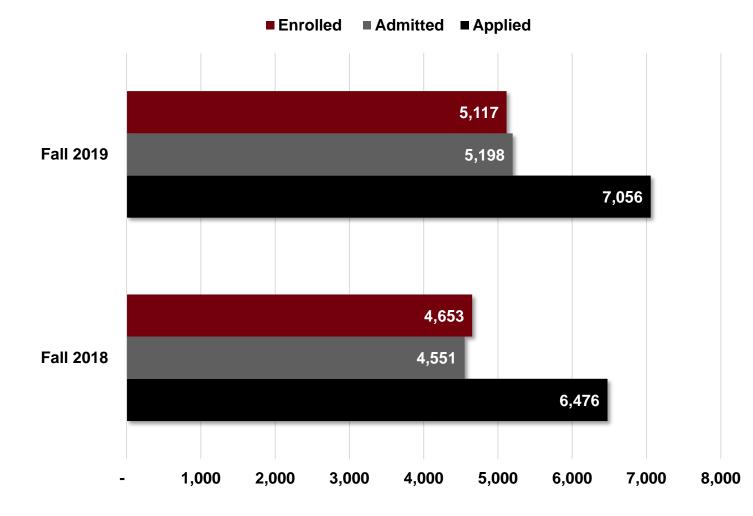


USC PALMETTO COLLEGE FTE ENROLLMENT



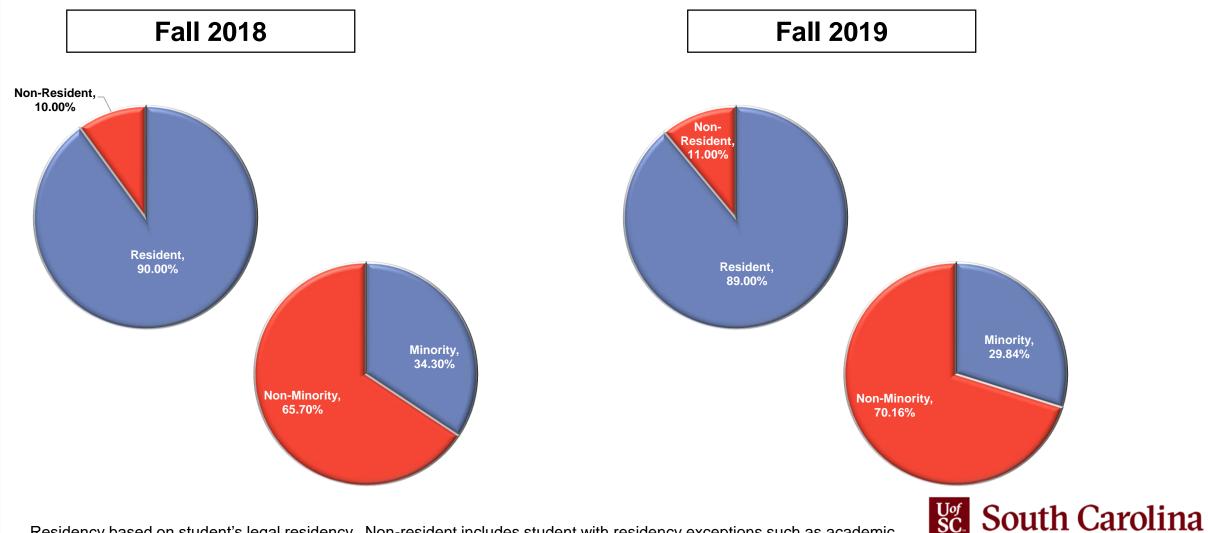


USC PALMETTO COLLEGE ENROLLMENT SUMMARY



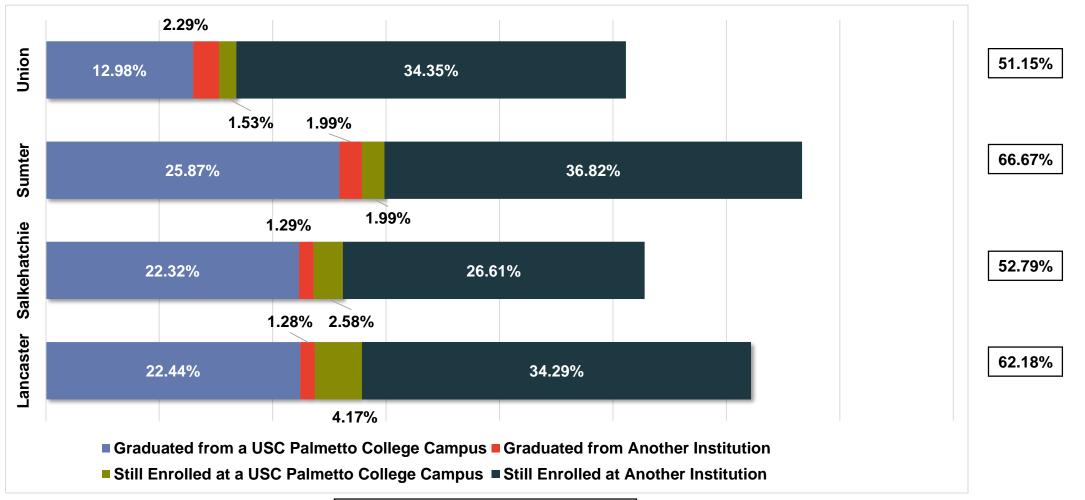

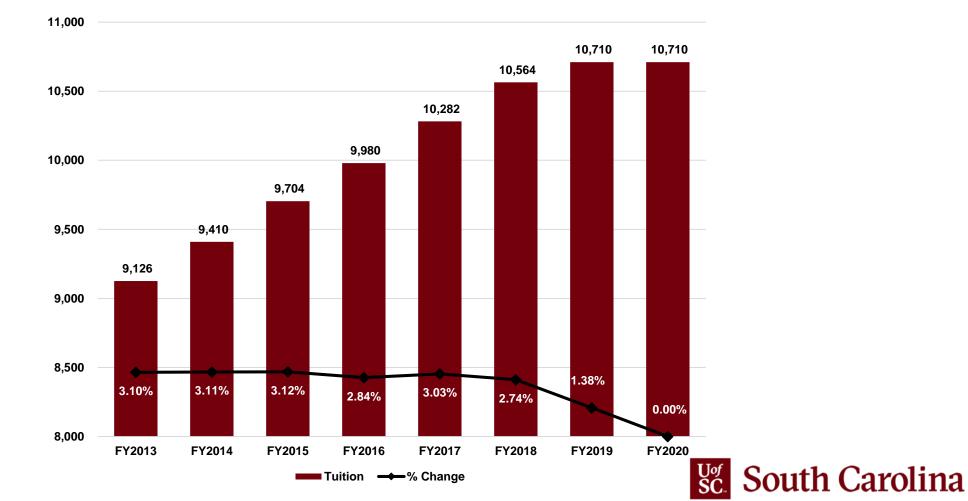
