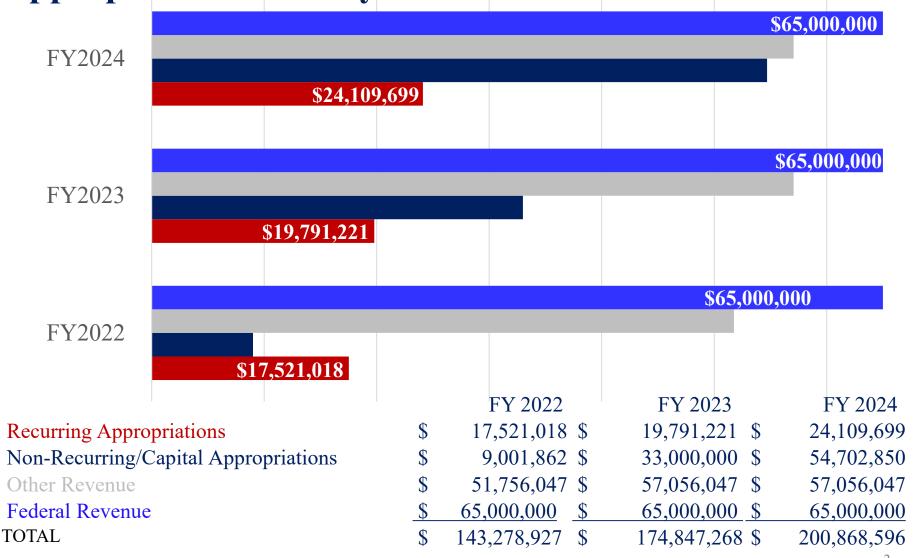

## Overview

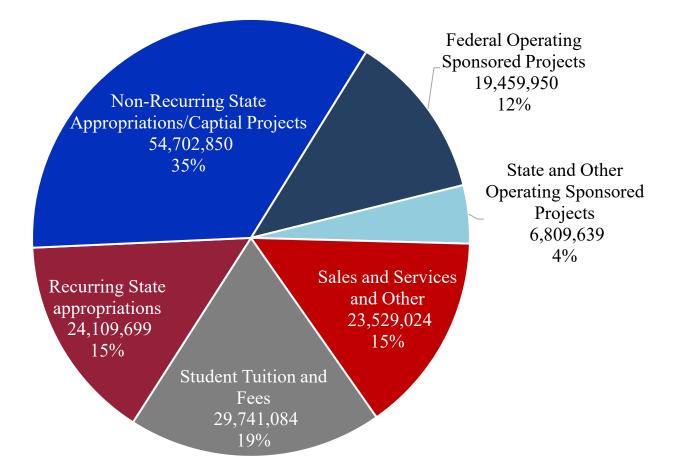
- South Carolina State University enrolled our largest freshmen class in over 15 years
  - 1200 new students in 2023 compared to 371 in 2019
  - Headcount of 3041 in 2023 compared to 2374 in 2021
  - Will cap new student enrollment until additional beds are available
- Agency requests historic investments for infrastructure and capital projects
- The current average age of the buildings is 68 years old
- The current major issues include, ADA compliance, flooding, HVAC, and other health and safety issues
- Current infrastructure severely impacts the ability to recruit and retain students (83% SC) and faculty and staff
- The cost to bring all facilities to an 80% condition is \$91,166,228; The investment to bring the facilities to 100% condition is \$96,424,562.
- The University has a strong balance sheet with a modest debt to asset ratio





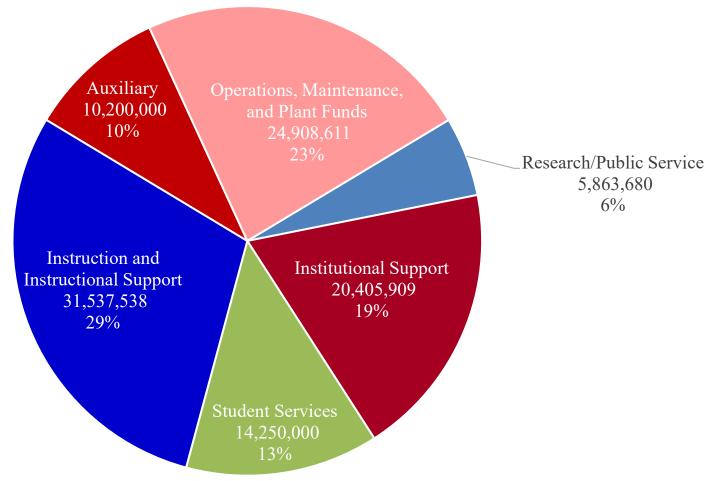
#### **FY2024-2025 Current Year Revenue Projection**

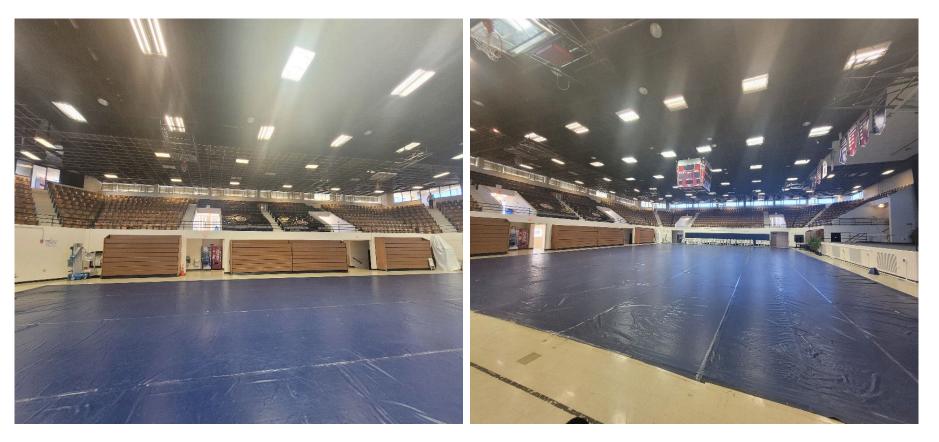

SC State University is requesting an additional 35 FTEs, increasing our approved 374 FTEs to a total of 409 FTEs. The request is for 19 FTEs to be funded through recurring appropriations and the remaining 16 FTEs to be funding through Other university funds.

#### **Proviso Request**

SC State University would like the following two specific proviso for the FY2024-2025:

- Loan forgiveness for the remaining \$2.7 million dollars (remaining balance of the \$12 million-dollar initial loan amount).
- Capital Improvement Investment Initiative Additional \$100 million dollars to provide shortterm capital improvement to the aging University physical plant.
- University Master Plan Initiative Fund: Long-term Infrastructure Revitalization and Academic Enhancement Fund Additional \$150 million dollars to create an endowment structure which will support revitalization of the academic structure of the University (University Master Plan).

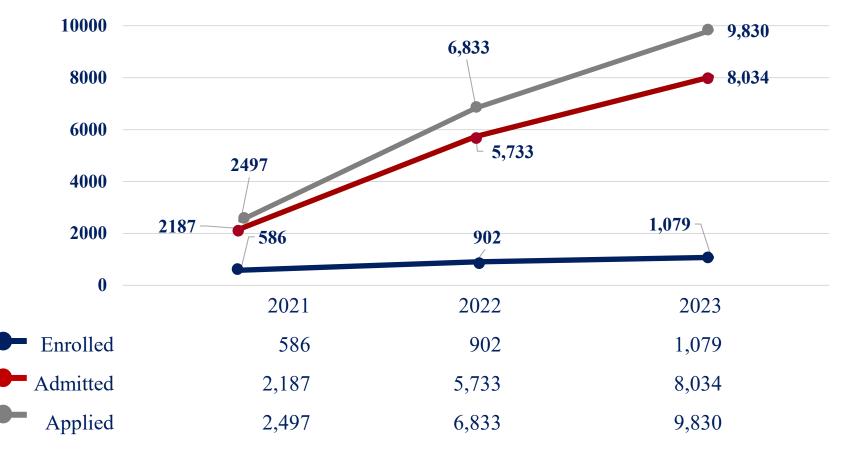

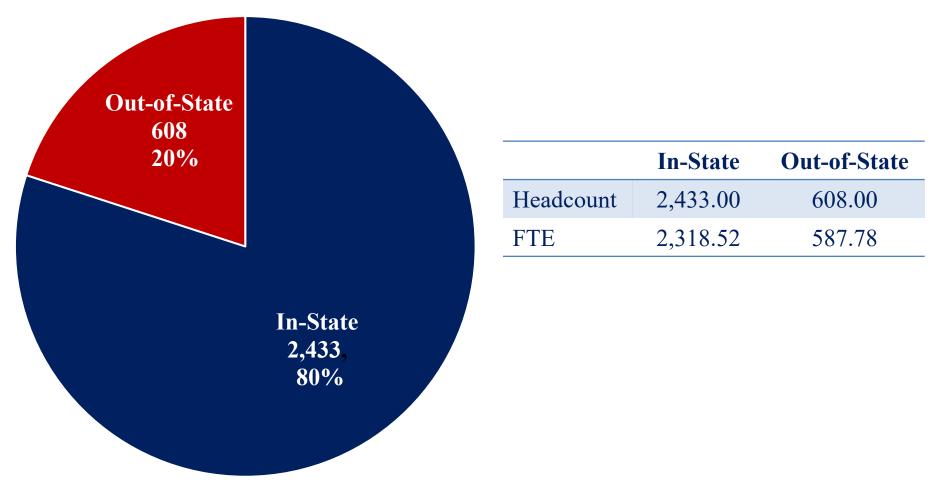

Applied, Admitted and Enrolled - Fall Semesters

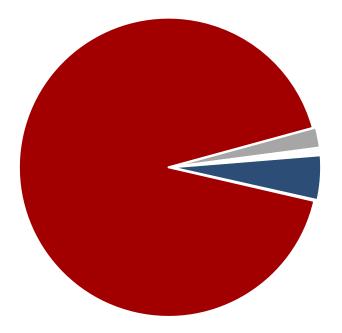


#### **Student Enrollment\* In-State vs Out-of-State Students**



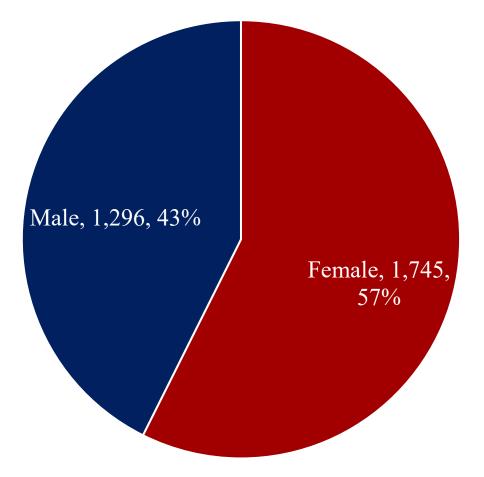

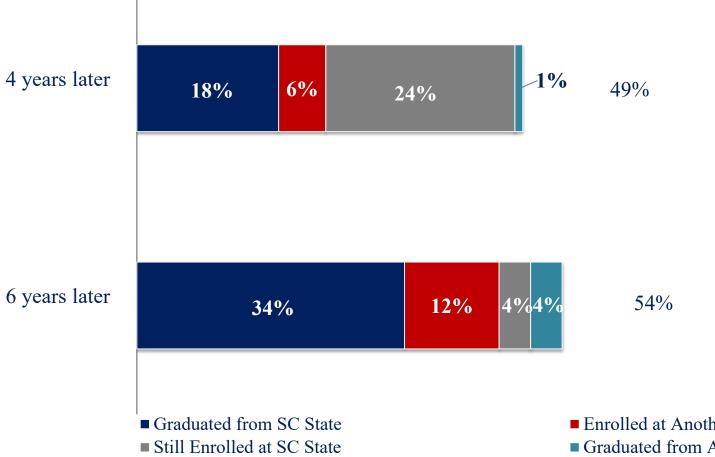
#### **Enrollment by Gender** Fall 2023

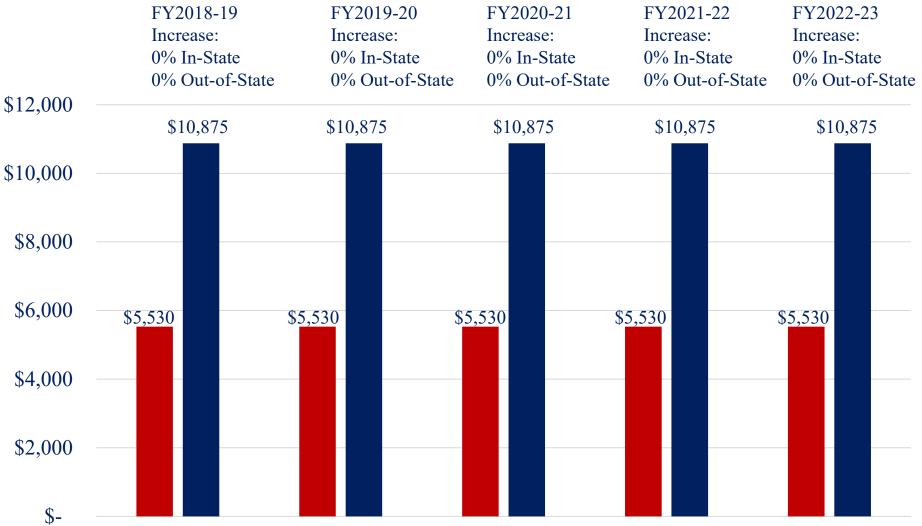
#### **Graduation Data**

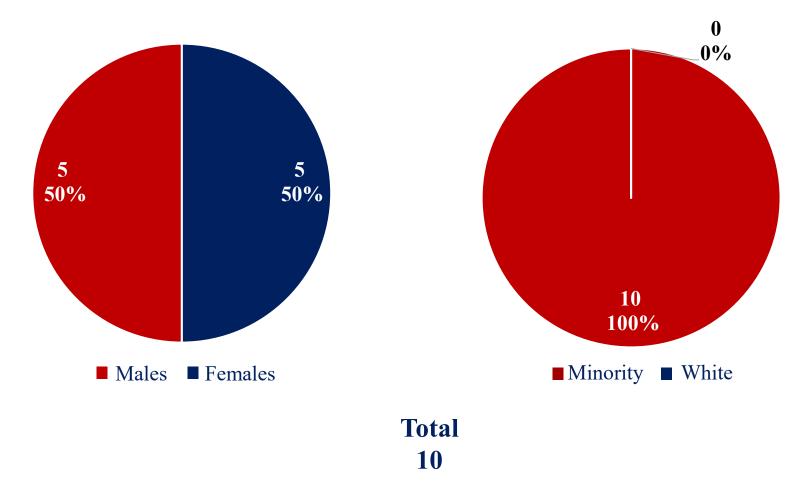

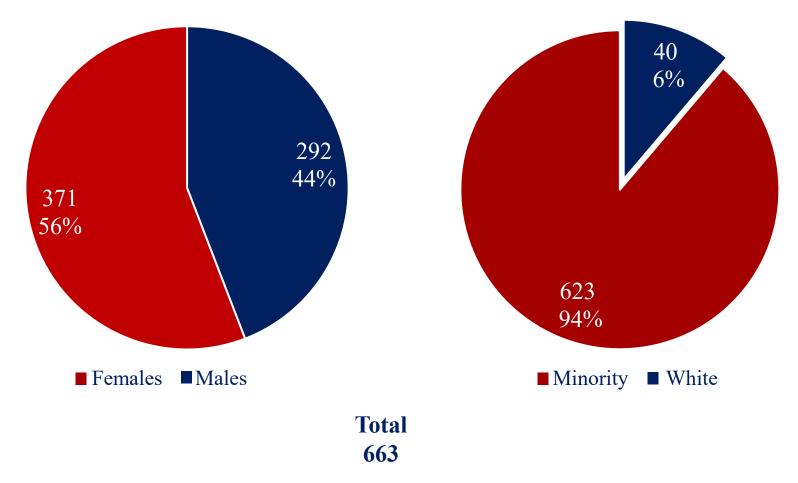

#### **Overall Representation of Administration**



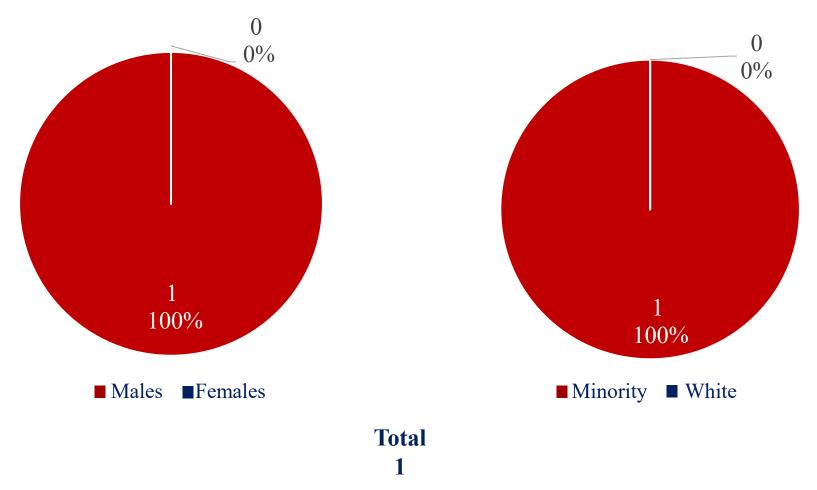

## **Calculation Method to Determine Abatement Amount**

South Carolina State University tuition abatements are only awarded to out-of-state students and represent a maximum amount equal to the difference between in-state and out-of-state tuition. Students awarded an abatement must have at minimum a qualifying \$500 institutional scholarship. Scholarship managers do reserve the right to determine the amount of the abatement and determine if an abatement is to be awarded.

FY22-23, there were 215 students that received an education fee waiver pursuant to SC Code of Laws 59-101-620, which applies to Undergraduate Students.

## **Deferred Maintenance**

- SC State University has a Deferred Maintenance plan. The plan includes a review of the facilities portfolio identifying all facility related renewal needs (deferred, capital renewal and capital improvements)
  - Over a pre-defined period.
  - Based on State required State Building Condition Survey
- Third-party contracted services team completed the facilities assessment. This assessment is updated annually.
  - As projects are completed
  - As new needs are identified
- In FY 23, SC State University spent \$4,780,200 on Deferred Capital needs.
- SC State University has over \$35M projects in design and under contract
- Current FCA identifies current assessment of \$55M in deferred capital maintenance needs.

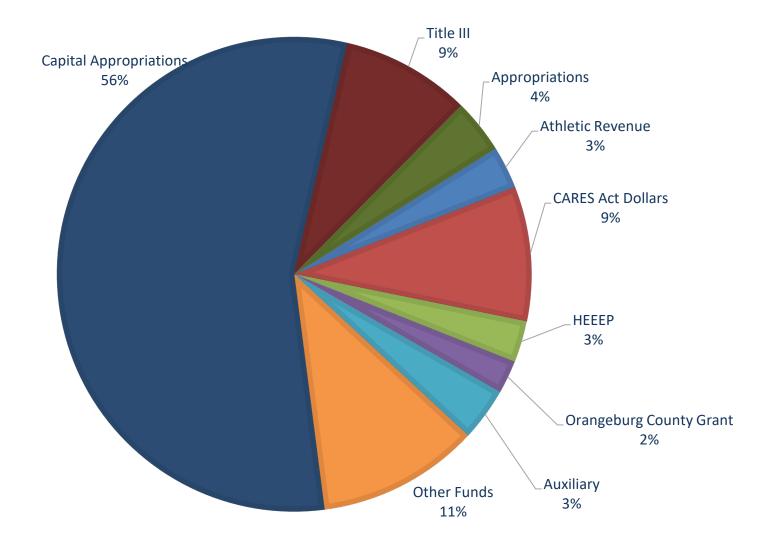

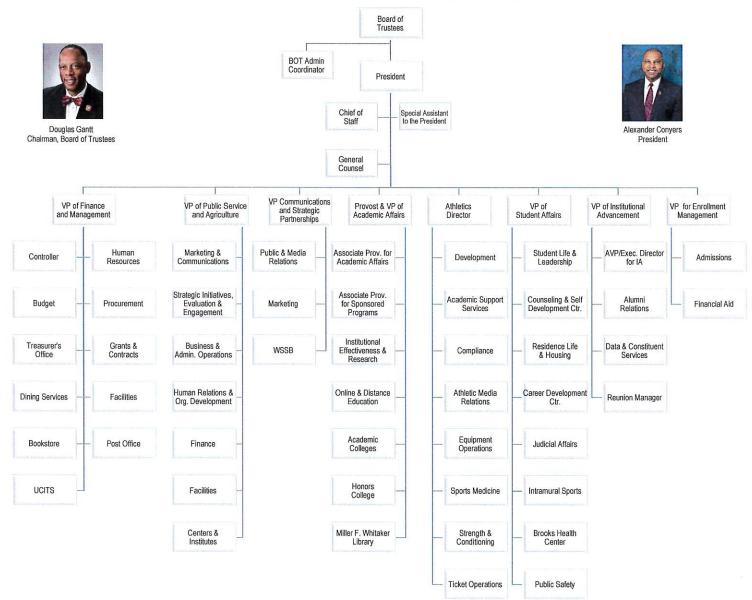
