Access & Affordability for In-State Students: Tuition Mitigation Funding	Recurring \$29,500,000
<ul style="list-style-type: none">The top budget priority for the University of South Carolina System remains continuing to partner with the state to invest in predictable funding to mitigate against annual tuition increases.These funds would enable the System 1) to offset the tremendous rise in current inflationary costs expected to remain higher than historic norms for the foreseeable future, 2) to cover the customarily unfunded portion of state funding requirements for pension, health insurance, and cost of living adjustments, and 3) to continue to make strategic investments improving access to higher education for students across South Carolina.	

Rural Brain Health Network

Recurring \$10,000,000

- The Rural Brain Health Network is a collaboration between the University and Prisma Health to improve the appropriate diagnoses and care for rural South Carolinians with Alzheimer and other dementia-related conditions. The creation of local care practices in rural areas will serve those populations. With a hub and spoke system, these centers will be supported by specialists based in Greenville and Columbia. Recurring dollars will fund three physicians (neurologists and/or gerontologists), social workers, and two support staff as well as rent for five centers located throughout the state.

School of Law Student Support and New Programs

Recurring \$5,700,000

- The University requests support for the Law School to retain and provide for success of South Carolina law students and provide support for emerging programs of study:
 - Cybersecurity Program (\$500,000):** Funds would support the study and enhanced understanding of the legal aspects of cybersecurity activities in the state of South Carolina.
 - International Law Scholar (\$500,000):** A number of global corporations have facilities in South Carolina. Our country is dependent upon a global supply chain affecting all South Carolinians. Rising authoritarianism around the world puts the rule of law and democracies in peril. To prepare our students for this global world of commerce and the inherent challenges to the rule of law, we must add depth to our offerings in both public and private international law.
 - South Carolina Student Scholarship Program (\$3,000,000):** Within authorized state guidelines, scholarships for South Carolina students will enhance recruitment of South Carolina students and alleviate the out-migration of high-achieving South Carolina students to out-of-state law schools.
 - South Carolina Resident Graduate Assistantship Program (\$1,250,000):** Exclusively for South Carolina residents, the graduate assistantship program will develop skills in South Carolina law students in legal research and writing to enhance their success in the profession and strengthen their relationship with South Carolina practicing attorneys.
 - Advanced Legal Writing and Academic Success Bar Preparation Programs (\$450,000):** In anticipation of significant revisions in the Bar exam in 2026, the School of Law must offer more robust advanced legal writing, analysis of complex fact patterns, and skills classes. One additional professional-track faculty member, several adjunct faculty, and one academic success/Bar preparation instructor are required to provide the necessary skills.

Non-recurring \$2,000,000

- Funds would support increased accessibility of SC Supreme Court Records and Briefs for the period 1918 through 2013. The collection provides an unparalleled window into the law and its development in this state over nearly a century, and through the law, in the development and evolution of South Carolina's society and culture over the same period.
- Funds would also allow for the subscription to an Online Student Study Aids Collection to students that is not currently available. This initiative would require recurring funds for future years.

This includes efforts to serve first-generation college students who require unique support to be successful. USCB has been piloting a bridge program in cooperation with USC Salkehatchie which has led us to conclude that a targeted Summer Bridge program will facilitate the retention and ultimate success of these students. New research on advising for student success will be implemented into our advising operation and will require training and the use of technology and software to assist in tracking students to develop the necessary knowledge and to target interventions. These efforts will be modeled on strengths demonstrated in the current practices and proposed changes envisioned for the Columbia campus. The goal is improved retention and graduation. - The 50-year-old space is vacated and desparately needs to be modernized to serve the academic and research mission of the university. Research space is limited on the campus and is preventing the recruitment of faculty infrastructure, and new finished throughout.
- The project will renovate the third floor of the Jones PSC building to become a center for inter-disciplinary research. The area of renovation is 10,000 square feet and is currently configured as old chemistry teaching labs that have been replaced with a recently renovated facility. The outfit for research will be modernized to provide shared lab space and share equipment to be more economical and foster inter-disciplinary research among the sciences. The renovation will include hazardous materials abatement, new mechanical systems, new electrical infrastructure, and new finished throughout.
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Jones Research Center Renovation - \$6,000,000

- Smartstate Chair and expand primary research, including clinical trial with patients in the Rural Health Network collaboration between the University and Prism Health.
- The Brain Health Institute will leverage ongoing research in Brain Health including research of the University's numerous academic programs. To fulfill the need for more classrooms at the western district of the campus, the additional general classrooms that are well-equipped with the most modern AV/IT infrastructure will benefit University requests 50% of the cost of a new building for classrooms.

- Science and Technology Center - New building for academic and research Space - \$34,000,000
- Building in a location where new classrooms will be especially impactful to the University's mission. Generally, more classrooms are needed at the western district of the campus. Additional general classrooms that are well-equipped with the most modern AV/IT infrastructure will benefit numerous academic programs.

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that would not only teach but would also pursue federal research grants. The condition of many labs on campus is outdated and the project will present a modern model for research.

Coker College Maintenance Renovation - \$35,000,000

- The project will provide a comprehensive renovation of the 186,000 gross square foot structure that was constructed in 1975. The building houses academic and research programs within the College of Pharmacy and departments within the College of Arts and Sciences. The renovation will replace aged mechanical and electrical infrastructure that is original to the 46-year-old building. Worn interior finishes will also be replaced and certain life safety and accessibility upgrades will be implemented.
- Coker College has only had localized maintenance over the past few decades that included a recent roof replacement, envelope repairs, and mechanical and electrical upgrades. A more comprehensive renovation is needed to elevate the condition of the building to be more consistent with other academic and research facilities on the campus.

Utility Infrastructure - \$104,900,000

- Establish a new dedicated electrical substation to provide electricity to the campus. Having a significant portion of the campus served by only one substation creates a condition of vulnerability for the campus whenever the Pendleton Street campus is affected by natural or man-made events that cause a loss of service.
- Replace approximately half of the outdated 8320-volt underground electrical infrastructure and pad-mounted transformers that provide electricity to most of the campus buildings. The electrical infrastructure is among the highest priorities to replace for reasons of safety and reliability. The 8320-volt system is outdated, and it is very difficult to get 8320 transformers because they are no longer readily available.
- In 2020 and 2021, the campus commissioned an engineering firm to identify, master plan, and prioritize utility priorities. There is a list of over 100 priorities totaling \$151 million.

Student Union Renovation/Expansion - \$25,000,000

- Renovate areas within the Russell House for modernization and implement life safety improvements to conform with modern building codes. The project would address the ballroom, meeting rooms, other public areas, and staff support areas. Building mechanical HVAC systems and the roof would also be replaced to address maintenance needs. The project may also replace or expand some portions of the building.
- The Russell House is a very old building as compared to most Student Unions at comparable universities. The building requires extensive renovation to optimize its ability to serve a student body that has grown tremendously since the last expansion was constructed in the 1970s. Maintenance needs are extensive. The building is in the correct location on campus so maintaining the site for use as a student union is considered most prudent.

Pacer Student Success Center - \$2,000,000

Conversion of physical space in library to a one-stop shop of student success support services.

Renovation to Etheredge Center HVAC Upgrades - \$5,500,000

- The current HVAC system has reached the end of its serviceable life and longer provides adequate heating and cooling needed for a building of its type.

New USC Aiken Softball Facility - \$3,000,000

- Existing facility must be relocated for SC National Guard Cyber Facility

New USC Aiken Soccer/ Multi-sport Facility - \$1,500,000

- Replace existing facility which will be converted to an intramural field. Existing intramural field relocated due to AMC construction.

Deferred maintenance - \$15,000,000

- Maintenance is a required cost for ensuring appropriate learning environments and maintaining state assets. USC Upstate would use funds to address a variety of deferred or appropriate critical repair and related maintenance, and address any other critical equipment, and systems repair. Funds would be targeted for critical life and safety maintenance issues and those that ensure educational mission.

- The Facility will serve as a general-purpose conference center for community and campus group meetings not associated with a particular department. The venue will be large enough for conferences, with flexible seating arrangements, and a wall structure that can be partitioned into multiple meeting rooms as needed. It will provide adjoining break rooms, and technical installations such as smartboards, digital video projectors, Wi-Fi, and video conferencing. Sumter city and county managers have encouraged a USC Sumter Conference facility since there are few, if any, multi-purpose facilities of this type in Sumter.

Deferred maintenance - \$17,000,000

- Health Education Complex Mechanical Repairs - \$10,000,000
 - This project will replace the mechanical system including air handlers, pumps, cooling tower, and hot and cold water distribution piping. The building has approximately 150,000 square feet of gross area and is experiencing mechanical failure in various locations due to component failures.
 - The building is experiencing equipment failure and it is difficult to make effective and long-lasting repairs due to the systemic challenges of the existing conditions that compound repair difficulty. This building provides Nursing and Education Classrooms, Registrars Office, Bookstore, Recreation Centre, Food Court and Dean/Faculty Offices.

Health Education Complex Mechanical Repairs - \$10,000,000

- Construct New School of Nursing Building - \$33,000,000
 - Construct new 76,000 GSF facility to include classrooms, labs, faculty-staff offices and affiliated meeting spaces.
 - This will double the size of the existing Mary Black School of Nursing academic faculty.
 - Smith Science Building Renovation/Expansion - \$23,000,000
 - Complete the construction of a new addition adjacent to the existing science building and renovate select existing spaces to increase research/teaching lab space and class-labs.

Smith Science Building Renovation/Expansion - \$23,000,000

- New Convocation Center - \$85,000,000
 - Provide a convocation Center to support the academic function for larger assembly spaces to house convocations and other meetings affiliated with the University.
 - Provide an athletic facility for major NCAA Division I athletics.
 - And other meeting venues affiliated with the University.

New Convocation Center - \$85,000,000

- Maintainance is a required cost for ensuring appropriate learning environments and maintaining state assets. USC Beaufort would use funds to address a variety of deferred or appropriate critical repair and related maintenance, and address any other critical equipment, and systems repair. Funds would be targeted for critical life and safety and intensive issues and those that ensure educational mission.

\$10,000,000 received in Fy23)

- USC Beaufort Convocation Center - \$8,500,000**

USC Sumter Facilities Management Center - \$3,000,000

- By relocating the Facilities Management facility to the periphery of the campus, the existing space can be repurposed for much needed student union space. No other space exists to expand the Student Union Center and to relocate the Facilities Management Center.

USC Sumter WEB Administration Building - \$1,500,000

- This project will replace the current HVAC/chiller configuration with rooftop air handlers.

USC Sumter Student Union Building - \$300,000

- This project will provide mechanical upgrades, replacing current HVAC with rooftop air handler.

USC Sumter Business Administration Building Renovation - \$2,500,000

- This project will replace the HVAC system in the building. Interior work to classrooms and offices will also be done including carpet replacement, lighting fixtures, furnishings

USC Sumter Student Union renovation - \$2,500,000

- The project will renovate space vacated by the Facilities Management Center. The renovation will repurpose support space to become student space for study, technology, and recreation. Since the space to be renovated is in the Student Union building, this is the most logical location to expand Student Union Services.

USC Sumter Anderson Library renovation - \$5,500,000

- Renovate current 29,493 square foot building to make the facility more user-friendly for USC Sumter students and for other members of the greater Sumter Area community. This project would provide social spaces for interaction and knowledge exchange, provide upgraded study rooms, and learning spaces conducive for developing new skills and learning new technologies. The facility would also house a student success center.

USC Sumter Campus water drainage - \$300,000

- Replace and repair current drainage paper in joint boxes.

- USC supports continuing the state's recent historic investment in state need-based financial aid which over the last two years has allowed USC Columbia to substantially increase both the number of students receiving state need-based aid (up from just over 2,000 students in 2020 to over 3,600 today) and average award (up from \$2,500 in 2020 to \$3000 today – an amount just short of the state's maximum award of \$3,500). As such, for a modest increased investment by the state of just \$1.6M at USC Columbia, further enhancing access and affordability for many of our lower and middle-income students. Note: Over the last two years, USC Columbia students from ALL 46 counties benefited from the state's renewed investment in need-based aid.
- USC appreicates the recent EIA investment by the state in the USC College's impactful teacher recruitment and retention programs; specifically, \$2 million for SC-TEACHER and an additional \$450,000 for Carolina Collaborative for Alternative Preparation (CarolinaCAP). USC respectfully requests that funding continue in FY22-23 (from recurring rather than one-time EIA dollars, if possible). SC-TEACHER, led by the College of Education, is a statewide collaborative of multiple institutions and partners whose purpose is to positively impact, through comprehensive research, teacher recruitment, preparation, and retention policies on teacher effectiveness in South Carolina. CarolinaCAP is equally impactful, having already partnered with several dozen schools districts to increase the teacher workforce, especially in rural areas. In addition to continuing funding for SC-TEACHER and CarolinaCAP, we are seeking a modest additional investment in the College of Education – \$750,000 – for the Carolina Teacher Induction Program (CarolinaTIP) which has successfully demonstrated service to more than 300 1st through 3rd year teachers with an almost 98% retention rate.

Continue Addressing the Nursing Shortage – The Statewide Nursing Faculty and Instructor Initiative

- Last year, the USC College of Nursing, in coordination with the USC system's other nursing programs (and other programs statewide), collaborated with the Governor and legislature on funding the first half (\$10M) of a \$20 million statewide lottery initiative to address a very real impediment to South Carolina's critical nursing shortage – faculty pay while the other half is dedicated to improving the faculty pipeline through tuition reimbursement or scholarships for students enrolled in graduate-level nurse educator programs. At USC Columbia alone, this innovative initial investment by the college hire nine new faculty this Fall. As such, the USC nursing grants for faculty and instructor pipeline. Half of the funds are used by nursing programs to improve the nursing faculty and instructor pipeline. Half of the faculty pipeline through tuition reimbursement – the nursing faculty and instructor pipeline to address a very real impediment to South Carolina's critical nursing shortage statewide.
- The USC System supports a modest increase to current exemption level for non-research grants from \$200,000 to the first \$500,000 provided that the grant is used in support of the mission of another state agency of unit of government. The last increase was instituted in 1999. Currently, the state collects IDC earned on teaching and research grants awarded to colleges and universities (a requirement that is largely unique to S.C.).

IDC Threshold Increase for Teaching and Training Grants

- The USC System supports a modest increase to current exemption level for non-research grants from \$200,000 to the first \$500,000 provided that the grant is used in support of the mission of another state agency of unit of government. The last increase was instituted in 1999. Currently, the state collects IDC earned on teaching and research grants awarded to colleges and universities (a requirement that is largely unique to S.C.).

Athletic Event Admissions Tax Exemption

- For the current fiscal year, revenue derived from the provisions of section 12-21-2420 from admissions to an athletic event of an accredited college or university shall be retained by the college or university if use of the revenue is limited exclusively to supporting the college or university's student-athletes through the provision of student aid, scholarship and/or related financial support.











If necessary, the institutions could reduce costs in following ways for these major areas:

Academic Units

- Faculty and/or staff positions would go unfilled, adjuncts would be utilized less. Course offerings would be reduced, class sizes would increase.
- Academic programs would be reduced.

Service Units

- Staff positions would go unfilled in facilities, student affairs/success, and other support areas. Programs for student enrichment outside classroom would decrease.

Facilities, capital projects and maintenance

- Projects will be delayed, reduced in scope, or postponed.

REDUCING COST AND BURDEN TO BUSINESS AND CITIZENS

University of South Carolina System

- The University does not have regulations that pertain to business operations. Nor does the University have regulations that pertain to citizens in general. The University has taken steps over the last several years to assist students in obtaining a degree in a timely manner and to minimize the overall cost of obtaining a quality education.
- Providing a quality workforce to the businesses within the State is a vital aspect of continuous economic development. The savings to citizens and business of the state are incalculable.
- Highlights of a recent study found that USC has a total economic impact (all 8 campuses statewide) of approximately \$5.5 billion when measured in terms of annual state output. The system supports over 60,000 jobs statewide and returns \$219 million annually to the state in tax revenue.
- Palmetto College Online was designed to make Bachelors completion degrees more accessible and affordable for in-state place bound residents. The number of programs continues to grow each year thereby reducing the need for residents to choose the more expensive "for-profit" online college. Centralizing distance learning efforts for the USC System helps contain costs associated with program startup, marketing and admissions.
- The "On Your Time" Initiative was designed to give students a greater opportunity to complete their degrees in less time and reduce overall tuition costs and loan debt. Research shows that the key driver of student debt is taking longer than 8 semesters to graduate. Since the creation of the "On Your Time" initiative, the four-year graduation rate has increased by 7 percentage points.
- System improvements include recent implementation of Banner which is an enterprise student information system. Key features include integrated admissions, financial aid, registration, and student account system processes. Banner implementation is a major customer service upgrade.

SYSTEM PROVISO REQUESTS

State's Lottery Investment in Access and Affordability

- USC supports continuing the state's recent historic investment in state need-based financial aid which has allowed USC Columbia to increase both the number of students receiving state need-based aid (up from just over 2,000 students in 2020 to over 3,600 today) and average award (up from \$2,500 in 2020 to \$3000 today). For a modest increased investment by the state of just \$1.6M at USC Columbia we would be able to increase the average need-based aid award to the state maximum of \$3,500, enhancing access and affordability for many lower and middle-income students. Note: USC Columbia students from ALL 46 counties benefit from the state's investment in need-based aid.

Recruiting & Retaining Educators in High-Need Communities (SC-TEACHER, CarolinaTIP, CarolinaCAP)

- USC appreciates the recent EIA investment in the USC College of Education's teacher recruitment and retention programs; specifically, \$2 million for SC-TEACHER and an additional \$450,000 for CarolinaCAP. USC respectfully requests that funding continue in FY23-24. SC-TEACHER, led by the College of Education, is a statewide collaborative of multiple institutions and partners. CarolinaCAP is equally impactful, having already partnered with several dozen school districts to increase the teacher workforce, especially in rural areas. We are also seeking a modest additional investment for CarolinaTIP - \$750,000 which has served more than 300 teachers with an almost 98% retention rate.

SYSTEM PROVISO REQUESTS

The Statewide Nursing Faculty and Instructor Initiative - Continue Addressing the Nursing Shortage

- Last year, the USC College of Nursing, in coordination with the USC system's other nursing programs (and other programs statewide), collaborated with the Governor and legislature on funding the first half (\$10 million) of a \$20 million statewide lottery initiative to address a very real impediment to South Carolina's critical nursing shortage – the nursing faculty and instructor pipeline. At USC Columbia alone, this innovative initial investment by the state helped the college hire nine new faculty this Fall. The USC System respectfully requests the Governor and legislature continue this investment in FY2024 and to the extent possible, increase funding to the full \$20 million as originally proposed to have the maximum positive impact on the statewide nursing shortage.

IDC Threshold Increase for Teaching and Training Grants

- The USC System supports a modest increase to current exemption level for non-research grants from \$200,000 to the first \$500,000 provided that the grant is used in support of the mission of another state agency or unit of government. The last increase was instituted in 1999. Currently, the state collects IDC earned on teaching and training grants awarded to colleges and universities (a requirement largely unique to South Carolina).

Athletic Event Admissions Tax Exemption

- For the current fiscal year, revenue derived from the provisions of section 12-21-2420 from admissions to an athletic event of an accredited college or university shall be retained by the college or university if use of the revenue is limited exclusively to supporting the college or university's student-athletes through the provision of student aid, scholarship and/or related financial support.











- **Access & Affordability for In-State Students: Tuition Mitigation Funding - Recurring \$29,500,000**
These funds would enable the System 1) to offset the tremendous rise in current inflationary costs expected to remain higher than historic norms for the foreseeable future, 2) to cover the customarily unfunded portion of state funding requirements for pension, health insurance, and cost of living adjustments, and 3) to continue to make strategic investments improving access to higher education for students across South Carolina.

Rural Brain Health Network - Recurring \$10,000,000

- The Rural Brain Health Network is a collaboration between the University and Prisma Health to improve the appropriate diagnoses and care for rural South Carolinians with Alzheimer and other dementia-related conditions.

- **South Carolina Student Scholarship Program** (\$3,000,000): Within authorized state guidelines, scholarships for South Carolina students will enhance recruitment of South Carolina students and alleviate the out-migration of high-achieving South Carolina students to out-of-state law schools.
- **South Carolina Resident Graduate Assistantship Program** (\$1,250,000): Exclusively for South Carolina residents, the graduate assistantship program will develop skills in South Carolina law students in legal research and writing to enhance their success in the profession and strengthen their relationship with South Carolina practicing attorneys.
- **Advanced Legal Writing and Academic Success Bar Preparation Programs** (\$450,000): In anticipation of significant revisions in the Bar exam in 2026, the School of Law must offer more robust advanced legal writing, analysis of complex fact patterns, and skills classes.

- The Brain Health Institute will leverage ongoing research in Brain Health including research of the University's Smartstate Chair and expand primary research, including clinical trial with patients in the Rural Health Network collaboration between the University and Prisma Health.

Jones Research Center Renovation - \$6,000,000

- Establish a new dedicated electrical substation and replace approximately half of the outdated 8320-volt underground electrical infrastructure and pad-mounted transformers that provide electricity to most of the campus buildings.
- In 2020 and 2021, the campus commissioned an engineering firm to identify, master plan, and prioritize utility priorities. There is a list of over 100 priorities totaling \$151 million.

BEAUFORT STATE BUDGET HISTORY








BEAUFORT TOTAL CURRENT FUNDS








UPSTATE ESTIMATED FY2024 REVENUES



ESTIMATED FY2024 REVENUES





Facility Deferred Maintenance, Renovations and Upgrades - \$18,250,000

- Lancaster \$6,500,000; Salkkehatchie \$6,500,000; Union \$5,250,000.

USC Sumter Multipurpose Conference Facility - \$12,600,000

- The Facility will serve as a general-purpose conference center for community and campus group meetings. The venue will be large enough for conferences and will provide adjoining break rooms, and technical installations such as smartboards, digital video projectors, Wi-Fi, and video conferencing. Sumter city and county managers have encouraged a USC Sumter Conference facility since there are few, if any, multi-purpose facilities of this type in Sumter.

USC Sumter Facilities Management Center - \$3,000,000

- By relocating the Facilities Management facility to the periphery of the campus, the existing space can be repurposed for much needed student union space.

USC Sumter WEB Administration Building - \$1,500,000

- This project will replace the current HVAC/chiller configuration with rooftop air handlers.



- Replace and repair current drainage paper in joint boxes.



SYSTEM 4% FEE WAIVER

I. Governing Legislation/USC System Policy

South Carolina Code of Laws: Section 59-101-620

USC System Policy: FINA 4.04

II. Summary

Legislation/policy allows institutions of higher education to offer educational fee waivers of up to 4% of the undergraduate students or in an amount based on 4% of the prior year's tuition revenue.

III. Purpose

The use of tuition awards is for the following purposes: to enable the campus to have a more direct influence of the diversity of the student body profile; to enroll academically talented students and students with special talents; and/or to meet student's financial need or to recognize student's contributions to the University.

IV. Special Treatment for USC System Comprehensive and Regional Colleges

Recipients of the 4% fee waiver at Comprehensive Institutions may include non-resident students and high school concurrent students. The combination of tuition award plus waived fees may not be greater than the differential between tuition rates for residents and non-residents. No more than one-half of the 4% calculation may be awarded to non-resident students.

V. Threshold Calculation (Equivalent Method - Per Policy FINA 4.04)

SYSTEM ABATEMENTS

Abatements provide an avenue, through strategic leveraging of discount rates, to recruit and retain high caliber non-resident undergraduate students to the University of South Carolina.

The State of South Carolina requires or allows several abatements through state law.
This includes

- Active Duty Military
- Certain Military Dependents
- Academic Common Market
- Sister-State
- International Agreements
- American Legion Scholars
- Reciprocal Exchanges

Students who receive institutional abatements possess academic, athletic, or musical talents to enhance the campus and community.

USC Columbia uses a tiered tuition structure for non-resident scholarship students with different discount rates. This has been intentionally developed over time to compete for high caliber students while maximizing net tuition revenue.

At USC Columbia, the non-resident student population subsidizes the cost of education for South Carolina residents.

PALMETTO COLLEGE HEADCOUNT ENROLLMENT


